

# VOCABULARY

## 1. EVERMORE (ADVERB):हमेशा के लिये

**Pronunciation:** eh•vuh•maw

**Meaning:** (chiefly used for rhetorical effect or in ecclesiastical contexts) always.

**Synonyms:** always, forever, eternally

**Antonyms:** never, nevermore

**Sentence:** The editor's decision is final and shall evermore remain so.

## 2. HEADLONG (ADVERB):हड़बड़ी

**Pronunciation:** hed•lawng

**Meaning:** in a rush; with reckless haste.

**Synonyms:** hurried, rushed, sudden

**Antonyms:** deliberate, unhurried, calculated

**Sentence:** Those who rush headlong to join in the latest craze often regret it.

## 3. OB DURACY (NOUN):हठ

**Pronunciation:** awb•joo•ruh•see

**Meaning:** a steadfast adherence to an opinion, purpose, or course of action in spite of reason, arguments, or persuasion.

**Synonyms:** obduracy, obstinacy, stubbornness

**Antonyms:** broad-mindedness, open-mindedness, reasonability

**Sentence:** His error was sheer obduracy in refusing to admit a mistake.

## 4. ENCRUST (VERB):जमना

**Pronunciation:** uhn•kruhst

**Meaning:** cover (something) with a hard surface layer.

**Synonyms:** coagulate, congeal, cover

**Antonyms:** reveal, uncover, excavate

**Sentence:** She arrived home with her knees encrusted with mud.

## 5. GULLIBLE (ADJECTIVE):भोला

**Pronunciation:** guh•luh•bl

**Meaning:** easily persuaded to believe something; credulous.

**Synonyms:** credulous, over-trusting, easily deceived

**Antonyms:** cynical, mistrustful, sophisticated

**Sentence:** He's so gullible he'll believe anything.

## 6. SOLACE (VERB):दिलासा

**Pronunciation:** saw•luhs

**Meaning:** give comfort or consolation to.

**Synonyms:** comfort, console, cheer

**Antonyms:** anguish, distress

**Sentence:** She smiled, as though solaced by the memory.

## 7. PUERILE (ADJECTIVE):बचकाना

**Pronunciation:** pyu•rile

**Meaning:** having or showing the annoying qualities (as silliness) associated with children.

**Synonyms:** childish, immature, infantile

**Antonyms:** adult, experienced, mature

**Sentence:** I find his sense of humor rather puerile.

## 8. DEPORTATION (NOUN):निर्वासन

**Pronunciation:** dee•pawt•ay•shn

**Meaning:** the action of deporting a foreigner from a country.

**Synonyms:** expulsion, expelling, banishment

**Antonyms:** repatriation, return, immigration

**Sentence:** Several of the asylum seekers now face deportation.

## 9. DISTRAUGHT (ADJECTIVE):व्याकुल

**Pronunciation:** duh•strawt

**Meaning:** deeply upset and agitated.

**Synonyms:** worried, upset, distressed

**Antonyms:** calm, peaceful, placid

**Sentence:** Her distraught mother had spent all night waiting by the phone.

## 10. RECALCITRANT (ADJECTIVE):आज्ञा न मानने वाला

**Pronunciation:** ruh•kal•suh•truhnt

**Meaning:** having an obstinately uncooperative attitude toward authority or discipline.

**Synonyms:** uncooperative, obstinately disobedient, intractable

**Antonyms:** amenable, biddable, compliant

**Sentence:** The University suspended the most recalcitrant students.
