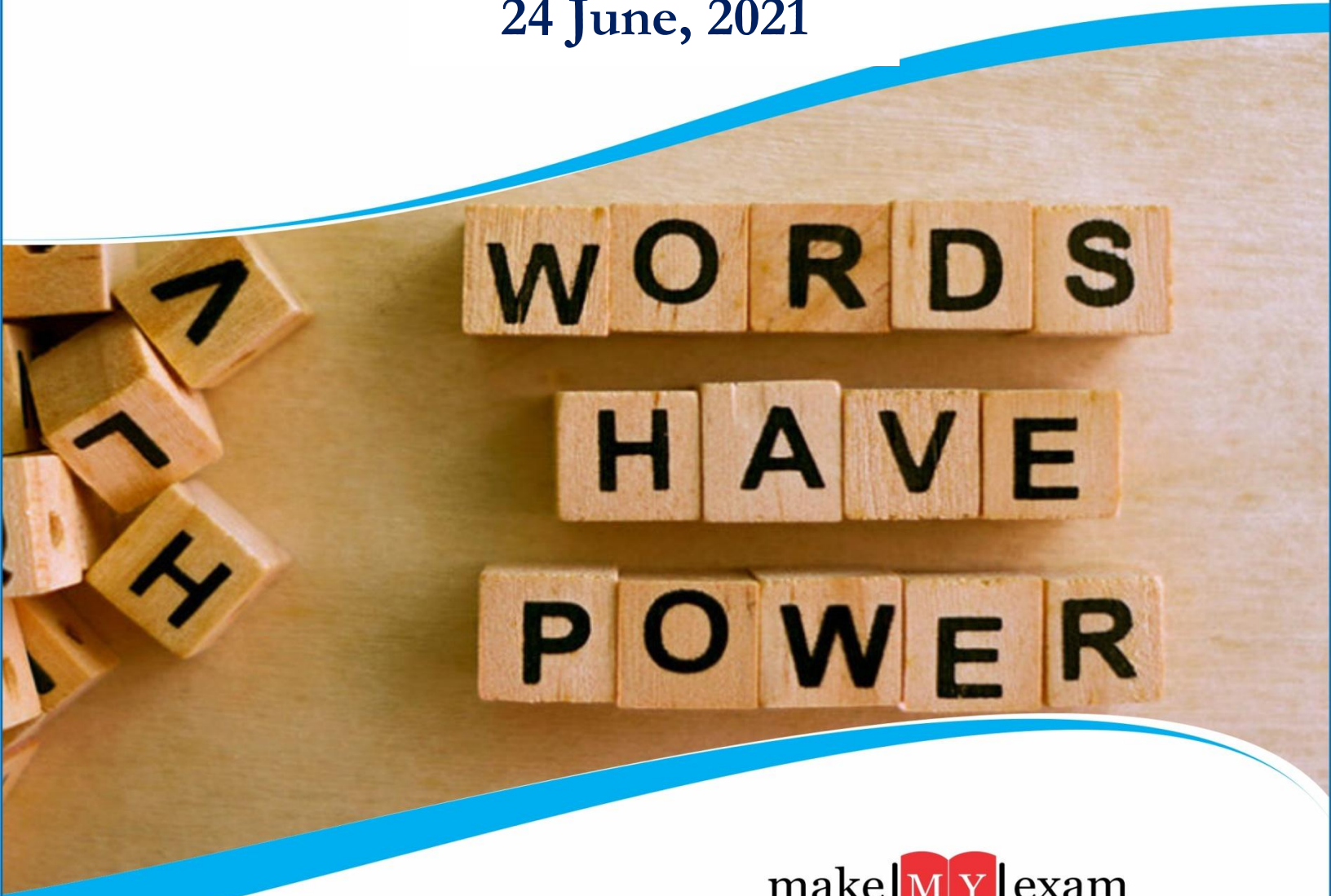

### **1. IMPERIOUS (adjective) – आज्ञात्मक**

**Pronunciation:** im·peeuh·ree·uhs

**Meaning:** arrogant and domineering

**Synonyms:** peremptory, commanding, imperial, overbearing, overweening, domineering, authoritarian

**Antonym:** meek

**Usage:** In an imperious tone, the police officer ordered the driver to step out of the car.

### **2. EXTROVERT (noun) – बहिर्मुखी**

**Pronunciation:** ek·struh·vuht

**Meaning:** an outgoing, socially confident person

**Synonyms:** outgoing, socializer, mixer, socialite, sociable

**Antonym:** introvert

**Usage:** Cory is an extrovert who parties with his friends every weekend.

### **3. IMMORTAL (adjective) – अमर**

**Pronunciation:** uh·maw·tl

**Meaning:** never dying or decaying

**Synonyms:** undying, deathless, eternal, everlasting, endless, perpetual, lasting

**Antonyms:** mortal, terminable, ending

**Usage:** Because our souls are immortal, they will live on for eternity.

### **4. ECSTATIC (adjective) – उन्मादपूर्ण, अति आनंदित**

**Pronunciation:** uhk·sta·tuhk

**Meaning:** feeling or expressing overwhelming happiness or joyful excitement

**Synonyms:** enraptured, elated, transported, euphoric, rapturous, joyful, blissful

**Antonyms:** miserable, sad, sorrowful

**Usage:** Ellen was ecstatic when she won the free trip to Hawaii.

### **5. INCEPTION (noun) – आरंभ**

**Pronunciation:** uhn·sep·shn

**Meaning:** the establishment or starting point of an institution or activity

**Synonyms:** initiation, establishment, institution, foundation, founding, formation, origination

**Antonyms:** conclusion, end, completion

**Usage:** Unfortunately, the inception of the Internet has made it easier for bullies to torment their victims.

## **6. STIMULATE (verb) – प्रोत्साहित करना**

**Pronunciation:** sti·myoo·leit

**Meaning:** encourage or arouse interest or enthusiasm in

**Synonyms:** encourage, prompt, prod, move, motivate, trigger, spark

**Antonym:** discourage

**Usage:** The goal of any great teacher is to craft exciting lessons that will stimulate their students to want to learn.

## **7. ADAMANT (adjective) – अटल**

**Pronunciation:** a·duh·muhnt

**Meaning:** refusing to be persuaded or to change one's mind

**Synonyms:** unshakeable, immovable, inflexible, unwavering, uncompromising, resolute, resolved

**Antonyms:** unsure, unassertive, flexible

**Usage:** He is so adamant in his beliefs that no one can change his mind.

## **8. SUBSEQUENT (adjective) – आगामी**

**Pronunciation:** suhb·suh·kwnt

**Meaning:** coming after something in time

**Synonyms:** following, upcoming, ensuing, succeeding, successive, later, future

**Antonyms:** previous, prior, former

**Usage:** Subsequent editions of the book will be based on the early lives of the characters.

## **9. SUMPTUOUS (adjective) – वैभवशाली**

**Pronunciation:** suhmp·tyoo·uhs

**Meaning:** splendid and expensive-looking

**Synonyms:** lavish, luxurious, splendid, deluxe, opulent, magnificent, resplendent

**Antonyms:** humble, plain, cheap

**Usage:** The restaurant's sumptuous buffet had some of the finest foods from all over the world.

## **10. ILLUSTRIOUS (adjective) – प्रसिद्ध**

**Pronunciation:** uh·luh·stree·uhs

**Meaning:** well known, respected, and admired for past achievements

**Synonyms:** eminent, distinguished, acclaimed, noted, notable, prominent

**Antonyms:** unknown, obscure

**Usage:** He enjoyed a long and illustrious career as a radio producer.

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
