China rocket debris falls in Indian Ocean near Maldives

1. China rocket debris falls in Indian Ocean near Maldives

• Debris from the last stage of China's Long March rocket that had last month carried a key component of its under-construction space station fell into the waters of the Indian Ocean west of the Maldives on 9th May, 2021.



• The re-entry of the rocket, described by astrophysicists as the fourth-largest uncontrolled re-entry in history, had evoked concerns in recent days about possible damage should it have fallen on land, and had been criticised by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) in the U.S. for "failing to meet responsible standards". China had rejected those concerns, saying most of the debris had been burned during re-entry and that a fall into international waters was most likely.

2. Nepal's Kami Rita scales Everest for record 25th time





• Nepalese climber scaled Mount Everest for the 25th time on 7th May, 2021, breaking his own record for the most ascents of the world's highest peak. Kami Rita and 11 other Sherpa guides reached the summit at about 6pm, tourism department official Mira Acharya



- said. They are the first climbers to reach the summit this year and were fixing the ropes on the icy route so that hundreds of other climbers can scale the peak later this month.
- Everest was closed to climbing last year on its southern side, which is in Nepal, because of the coronavirus pandemic. Climbing permits were issued this year to 408 foreign climbers.
- Rita, 51, first scaled Everest in 1994 and has been making the trip nearly every year since then. He is one of many Sherpa guides whose expertise and skills are vital to the safety and success of the hundreds of climbers who head to Nepal each year seeking to stand on top of the 8,848.86m mountain.
- In addition to the 25 times he's reached the top of Everest, Rita has scaled several other peaks that are among the world's highest, including K2, Cho-Oyu, Manaslu and Lhotse.

5.US calls upon WHO to invite Taiwan for World Health Assembly as observer

• The United States has called upon the World Health Organisation Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus to invite Taiwan to participate as an observer at the upcoming annual meeting of the World Health Assembly (WHA), saying there is no reasonable justification for Taipei's continued exclusion from the forum.



• Asserting that Global health and global health security challenges do not respect borders nor recognize political disputes, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said that Taiwan offers valuable contributions and lessons learned from its approach to these issues and WHO leadership and all responsible nations should recognize that excluding the interests of 24 million people at the WHA serves only to imperil, not advance, our shared global health objectives. The WHA is set to hold its 74th annual meeting virtually from Geneva, Switzerland, from May 24 to June 1.



6.IBM Unveils World's First 2 Nanometer Chip Technology

• On May 06, 2021, IBM unveiled a breakthrough in semiconductor design and process with the development of the world's first chip announced with 2 nanometer (nm) nanosheet technology.



- Semiconductors play critical roles in everything from computing, to appliances, to communication devices, transportation systems, and critical infrastructure.
- IBM's new 2 nm chip technology helps advance the state-of-the-art in the semiconductor industry, addressing this growing demand.
- It is projected to achieve 45 percent higher performance, or 75 percent lower energy use, than today's most advanced 7 nm node chips.



9.Lewis Hamilton won fifth consecutive Spanish Grand Prix

- Mercedes's racer Lewis Hamilton (Great Britain) has won 2021 Spanish Grand Prix.
- This victory is the fifth successive Spanish Grand Prix title of Lewis Hamilton and 3rd win of this season.



- This was also 98th victory of his career.
- Max Verstappen (Red Bull Racing-Netherlands) came 2nd followed by Valtteri Bottas (Mercedes-Finland).
- The race was the fourth round of 2021 Formula One World Championship.
- Next stop is the traditional Monaco Grand Prix in Monte Carlo on May 23.

10.Renowned Sculptor, Rajya Sabha MP Raghunath Mohapatra dies of Covid-19

 Rajya Sabha MP and renowned Sculptor Padma Vibhushan Raghunath Mohapatra died this afternoon while undergoing treatment at AIIMS, Bhubaneswar. He was 78-years-old.
