

#### 1. MITIGATE (verb) : कम करना

Pronunciation: mi·tuh·gayt

**Meaning:** make it less severe, serious, or painful.

**Synonyms:** alleviate, reduce, diminish **Antonyms:** aggravate, exacerbate

**Sentence:** He wanted to mitigate misery in the world.

## 2. FISSIPAROUS (adj.) : विभाजित

**Pronunciation:** fis·sip·a·rous

**Meaning:** inclined to cause or undergo division into separate parts or groups.

**Synonyms:** division, partition, separation **Antonyms:** assemblage, association

**Sentence:** High-quality, fissiparous yeast can resist high temperature, it is available for

summer production, and has a low-down energy cost.

## 3. MEDIOCRITY (noun): सामान्यता

Pronunciation: mee·dee·aw·kruh·tee

**Meaning:** the quality or state of being mediocre.

Synonyms: ordinariness, commonplaceness, averageness

**Antonyms:** distinction, excellence, excellency

**Sentence:** She's a perfectionist who refuses to settle for <u>mediocrity</u>.

## 4. AMASSED (verb) : जमा कर रखे

Pronunciation: uh-mast

Meaning: gather together or accumulate (a large amount or number of valuable material or

things) over a period of time.

Synonyms: gather, collect, assemble

Antonyms: dispelled, dispersed, dissipated

**Sentence:** They <u>amassed</u> huge wealth by plundering the colonies.

## 5. PAUPER (noun) : कंगाल

**Pronunciation:** paw·puh **Meaning:** a very poor person.

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**Synonyms:** poor person, indigent, bankrupt **Antonyms:** affluent, billionaire, tycoon

**Sentence:** He died a <u>pauper</u> and is buried in an unmarked grave.

#### 6. QUIETUS (noun) : मरण

Pronunciation: kvai·ee·tuhs

Meaning: death or something that causes death, regarded as a release from life.

**Synonyms:** death, decease, demise **Antonyms:** birth, nativity, Existence

Sentence: After weeks of suffering, the cancer-stricken cat received a quietus of the pain

by taking her final nap.

## 7. PRETENSE (noun) : दिखावा

Pronunciation: pruh-tens

Meaning: an attempt to make something, not the case appear true.

**Synonyms:** make-believe, act, faking **Antonyms:** demureness, sincerity

**Sentence:** I'm just astounded by you and your <u>pretense</u>.

## 8. INOPPORTUNE (adj.) : बेवक्त

**Pronunciation:** i · naw · puh · choon

Meaning: occurring at an inconvenient or inappropriate time.

Synonyms: untimely, ill-timed, badly timed

Antonyms: timely, expected

**Sentence:** They arrived at an <u>inopportune</u> moment.

## 9. PENCHANT (noun): लगन

**Pronunciation:** pawn·shawn

**Meaning:** a strong or habitual liking for something or tendency to do something.

**Synonyms:** liking, fondness, preference **Antonyms:** apathy, dislike, distaste

**Sentence:** She has a <u>penchant</u> for Indian food.

## 10. RAUCOUS (adj.) : कर्कश

**Pronunciation:** raw·kuhs

**Meaning:** making or constituting a disturbingly harsh and loud noise.


Synonyms: harsh, strident, screeching

Antonyms: sedate, sober, quiet

**Sentence:** I heard the <u>raucous</u> call of the crows.

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
