1. NITPICKING (noun) – सूक्ष्मावधानी

Pronunciation: nit-piking
Meaning: giving too much attention to details that are not important, especially as a way of criticizing
Synonyms: pedantic, overscrupulous, scrupulous
Antonyms: flatter, miss, blandish
Sentence: If you spend less time <u>nitpicking</u>, you will get more work done.

2. JAMMY (adj) – सौभाग्यशाली, भाग्यवान

Pronunciation: jamiMeaning: covered with, filled with, or resembling jam; luckySynonyms: fortunate, blessedAntonyms: unlucky, unfortunateSentence: Don't wipe your jammy fingers on the table-cloth.

3. CHUMMY (adj) – मित्रवत, स्नेहशील

Pronunciation: chumi **Meaning:** on friendly terms **Synonyms:** friendly, close, familiar, affectionate **Antonyms:** unfriendly, hostile, prejudiced **Sentence:** They're very <u>chummy</u> with their neighbours.

4. HETERODOX (adj) - धर्म विरुद्ध, भिन्नमत

Pronunciation: hetro-doks
Meaning: not conforming with traditional standards or beliefs
Synonyms: unorthodox, heretical, dissenting, dissident, blasphemous
Antonym: orthodox
Sentence: His opinions have always been distinctly <u>heterodox</u>.

5. ODORIFEROUS (adj) – महकवाला

Pronunciation: oduh-rifur(u)s
Meaning: having an unpleasant smell
Synonyms: foul-smelling, evil-smelling, stinking, reeking, fetid



Antonyms: sweet-smelling, aromatic

Sentence: The woman started feeling like vomiting when she smelled the scent from the <u>odoriferous</u> fish market.

6. PREPOSTEROUS (adj) - बेहूदा, ऊटपटांग

Pronunciation: pri-post(u)rus
Meaning: contrary to reason or common sense
Synonyms: absurd, ridiculous, foolish, stupid, ludicrous, farcical
Antonyms: reasonable, sensible
Sentence: It's preposterous to suggest that everything was her fault!

7. INVEIGH (verb) - फटकारना

Pronunciation: in-vei
Meaning: speak or write about (something) with great bitterness or opposition
Synonyms: fulminate, declaim, protest, rail, rage, remonstrate
Antonym: support
Sentence: No matter how angry I get, I will not <u>inveigh</u> my feelings using social media.

8. MUDSLINGING (noun) - बदनाम करना

Pronunciation: mud-sling-ing
Meaning: the use of insults and accusations, especially unjust ones, with the aim of damaging the reputation of an opponent
Synonyms: traduce, defame, slander
Antonyms: brief friendly chat, acclaim, commendation
Sentence: There has been a lot of political <u>mudslinging</u> in the battle for votes.

9. GRUDGING (adj) – अनिच्छुक

Pronunciation: gruj-ing
Meaning: displaying unwillingness
Synonyms: reluctant, unwilling, disinclined, forced, half-hearted, unenthusiastic, hesitant, begrudging
Antonym: eager
Sentence: Oliver was grudging about accepting Wickham's innocence.

10. MUG (verb) - वार करना

Pronunciation: mug **Meaning:** attack and rob someone in a public place **Synonyms:** assault, attack, set upon, beat up, knock down, rob **Antonyms:** cheat, fraud, cheater, con



Sentence: He was <u>mugged</u> by three men.
