



1. Deepak Bagla appointed as Mission Director of Atal Innovation Mission

- Appointment: Dr. Deepak Bagla, former Managing Director of Invest India, has been appointed as the Mission Director of Atal Innovation Mission (AIM) under NITI Aayog.
- Contract Basis: The appointment is on a contract basis for a period of two years, effective from the date of assuming charge or until further orders, whichever is earlier.



- **Background**: Dr. Bagla has a strong background in fostering innovation and investment promotion in India, having led Invest India in executing key government initiatives like Startup India and the Prime Minister's Science and Technology initiative.
- AIM's Objectives: As Mission Director, Dr. Bagla is expected to promote innovation and entrepreneurship across the country, aligning with AIM's objectives to encourage creativity, facilitate collaboration, and oversee the nation's technological infrastructure.

2. Arjun & Ishaan Dominate MRF F2000 as MRF 2025 Kicks Off at Kari Motor Speedway

• **Arjun Chheda's Win**: 16-year-old Arjun Chheda from Pune dominated the MRF F2000 category, winning the race







with a significant lead. He finished the 12-lap race in 13 minutes and 28.502 seconds.

- **Strong Competition**: The MRF F2000 grid featured talented drivers, including veteran Chetan Korada and young guns like Ishaan Madesh, promising an exciting season.

3. FIDE World Cup 2025 to Be Hosted in India

- **Qualification Spots**: The FIDE World Cup 2025 will provide three qualifying spots for players who finish 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in the tournament, securing their places in the 2026 FIDE Candidates Tournament.
- **Number of Players**: The World Cup will feature 206 players, with a system of byes used in the first round, followed by a knockout stage from the second round onwards.



• Continental Spots: The allocation of spots has been adjusted based on 2024 ratings, with Asia getting 35 spots in the Open section and 20 spots in the Women's section. Women's World Cup Progress: The 2025 FIDE Women's World Cup has already seen some exciting matches, with Indian GM Vaishali Rameshbabu knocking out IM Carissa Yip in the third round.

4. Shi Yuqi Wins Men's Singles Title at Japan Open 2025

- **Shi Yuqi's Victory**: Shi Yuqi defeated France's Alex Lanier in straight sets, 21-17, 21-15, to claim the men's singles title at the Japan Open 2025, ending a 10-year drought for Chinese men's singles in the tournament.
- **Dominant Performance**: Shi Yuqi played with composure and control, taking the first game with a 4-point streak and maintaining pressure throughout the second game.



• Third Title of 2025: This win marks Shi Yuqi's third title of the 2025 season, following triumphs at the Malaysia Open and All England Open, and is a major milestone in his comeback journey after injuries plagued his career.

5. Sanjay Kaul (IAS) appointed as MD & Group CEO of GIFT City



7. LIC Signs MoU with Rural Development Ministry to Promote Bima Sakhi Yojana



9. Pi Approximation Day observed on 22nd July

• **Date Significance**: Pi Approximation Day is celebrated on July 22nd because the date 22/7 represents the approximate value of Pi, which is a mathematical constant denoting the ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter.



- **Pi Value**: The fraction 22/7 is an approximation of Pi, accurate to two decimal places, and is commonly used in mathematical calculations, particularly in geometry and engineering.

10. Oscar-Winning Songwriter Alan Bergman passed away

- The Bergmans are known for iconic songs like "The Way We Were," "How Do You Keep the Music Playing?," "It Might Be You," and "You Don't Bring Me Flowers."
- Their music was performed by legendary artists such as Frank Sinatra, Tony Bennett, Michael Jackson, and Barbra Streisand.



- The Bergmans won three Academy Awards, two Grammys, and four Emmys. They received 16 Oscar nominations and were inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame in 1980.
- The couple worked with famous composers like Marvin Hamlisch, Quincy Jones, Michel Legrand, and Cy Coleman.
