




DAILY VOCAB DOSE

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Exceptional words of English vocabulary from the newspaper '**The Hindu**' are listed here. 1.CASTIGATE(VERB): तिरस्कार करना

Pronunciation: ka • stuh • gayt

Meaning: to criticize, strongly oppose or punish somebody/something severely

Synonyms: rebuke, admonish, reprove

Antonyms: praise, extol, praise

Sentence: She was <u>castigated</u> for not setting a good example.

2.FLURRY(NOUN): घबराहट

Pronunciation: fluh • ree

Meaning: a short time in which there is suddenly a lot of activity.

Synonyms:burst, surge, spurt **Antonyms:**slump, calm, doldrums

Sentence: A <u>flurry</u> of editorials that were hostile to the government were published.

3.PROVOCATIVE(ADJECTIVE): उत्तेजक

Pronunciation:pruh • vawk • uh • tuhv

Meaning: intended to make somebody angry or upset or to cause an argument.

Synonyms: irritating, exasperating, vexing

Antonyms: soothing, noninflammatory, subduing **Sentence:**He got offended by a <u>provocative</u> article.

4.IMPAIR(VERB): बिगड़ा

Pronunciation:uhm•peuhd

Meaning: to damage something or make it weaker.

Synonyms: harm, diminish, blunt Antonyms: abstinent, teetotal, cool

Sentence: A noisy job could permanently <u>impair</u> their hearing.

5.FORMIDABLE(ADJECTIVE): दुर्जेय

Pronunciation: fuh • mi • duh • bl

Meaning: difficult to deal with; needing a lot of effort.

Synonyms: forbidding, redoubtable, daunting

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Antonyms: comforting, inviting, calming

Sentence: In debate he was a formidable opponent.

6. EXPLICABLE (ADJECTIVE): समझाने के योग्य

Pronunciation: uhk•spli•kuh•bl **Meaning:** that can be explained.

Synonyms: explainable, feasible, soluble **Antonyms:** inexplicable, difficult, hopeless

Sentence: Differences in schools were not <u>explicable</u> in terms of differences in intake.

7.DREADFUL(ADJECTIVE): भयानक

Pronunciation: dred•ful

Meaning: very bad or unpleasant.
Synonyms: frightful, horrible, grim
Antonyms: mild, relaxing, consoling
Sentence:He survived a dreadful accident.

8.EUPHORIA (NOUN): उत्साह

Pronunciation: yoo•faw•ree•aa

Meaning: an extremely strong feeling of happiness.

Synonyms: happiness, joy, glee **Antonyms:** misery, sadness, woe

Sentence:In his euphoria, he had become convinced he could defeat them.

9.RIFE (ADJECTIVE): व्याप्त

Pronunciation: rife

Meaning: (used especially about bad things) very common.

Synonyms: general, common, widespread **Antonyms:** scarce, unknown, vacant

Sentence: Male chauvinism was <u>rife</u> in medicine.

10.EXACERBATE (VERB): ख़राब करना

Pronunciation: uhg•za•suh•bayt

Meaning: to make something worse, especially a disease or problem.


Synonyms: worsen, inflame, compound

Antonyms: calm, help, ease

Sentence: Their silly attempts to resolve their misunderstandings <u>exacerbated</u> matters.

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
