1.FRAY (NOUN): (दंगा)

Pronunciation: frey

Meaning: a fight, battle, or skirmish.

Synonyms: war, strife, encounter, clash, contest, conflict, combat

Antonyms: peace, unanimity, understanding, calm

Sentence: Rahul Gandhi has entered the electoral fray in the Hindi heartland.

2. REEKS (VERB): (दुर्गंध)

Pronunciation: reek

Meaning: smell strongly and unpleasantly; stink

Synonyms: stink, smell

Antonyms: aroma, fragrance, perfume, sweetness.

Sentence: I think this whole thing just reeks of a pathetic lack of willpower.

3.OVERLOOKED (VERB): (अनदेखा करना)

Pronunciation: o·ver·look

Meaning: fail to notice (something)

Synonyms: miss, fail to notice, fail to observe

Antonyms: regarded, attended (to), valued, tended (to)

Sentence: He seems to have overlooked one important fact.

4. VACILLATING (VERB): (हिचकिचानेवाला)

Pronunciation: 'vasə, lāt

Meaning: alternate or waver between different opinions or actions

Synonyms: temporize, hesitate, oscillate, fluctuate

Antonyms: determined, purposeful, purposive, resolved

Sentence: I had for a time vacillated between teaching and journalism.

5.BIFURCATED (VERB): (बंटवारा)

Pronunciation: bi·fur·cate

Meaning: divide into two branches or forks

Synonyms: divided, subdivided, split

Antonyms: agree, combine, converge, join

Sentence: Jammu and ladakh are bifurcated from POK after the abrogation of Article 370.

6.DISILLUSIONMENT (NOUN): (मोहभंग)

Pronunciation: dis·il·lu·sion·ment

Meaning: a feeling of disappointment resulting from the discovery that something is not as good

as one believed it to be

Synonyms: disenchantment, disappointment, rude awakening

Antonyms: satisfaction, happiness, joy

Sentence: She expressed the disillusionment felt by many people.

7.REJIG (VERB): (बदलाव करना)

Pronunciation: rē'jig

Meaning: organize (something) differently; rejigger

Synonyms: rearrange, alter, juggle

Antonyms: break, crush, damage

Sentence: The organizers scrambled frantically to rejig schedules.

8.OSTENSIBLY (ADVERB): (जाहिर तौर पर)

Pronunciation: os·ten·si·bly

Meaning: apparently or purportedly, but perhaps not actually.

Synonyms: outwardly, superficially, allegedly

Antonyms: genuinely, really, truly

Sentence: Portrayed as a blue-collar type, ostensibly a carpenter.

9.MANIFESTOS (NOUN): (घोषणापत्र)

Pronunciation: man·i·fes·to

Meaning: a public declaration of policy and aims, especially one issued before an election by a

political party or candidate

Synonyms: policy statement, platform, program, declaration, proclamation

Antonyms: condemnation, refusal, denial

Sentence: Both parties made it clear in their manifestos.

10.ENUMERATE (VERB): (एक एक करके बताना)

Pronunciation: e·nu·mer·ate

Meaning: mention (a number of things) one by one.

Synonyms: list, itemize, catalog, set out, set forth

Antonyms: conceal, estimate, neglect

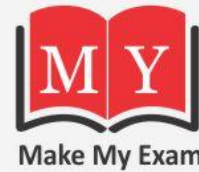
Sentence: There is no space to enumerate all his works.
