3. PRUDENCE (NOUN): सावधानी

Pronunciation: proo·dns

Meaning: behavior that is careful and avoids risks.

Synonyms: caution, circumspection, care

Antonyms: recklessness, brashness, carelessness

Sentence: The captain said we ought to shorten sail anyway, out of common <u>prudence</u>.

4. GYRATIONS (NOUN): चक्कर

Pronunciation: jai·ray·shnz

Meaning: the act of turning around and around on a fixed point.

Synonyms: revolution, rotations, spin **Antonyms:** unbolt, calm, inaction

Sentence: The dancer's graceful gyrations on stage captivated the audience.

5. RHETORIC (NOUN): वाग्मिता

Pronunciation: ruh·taw·rik





Meaning: the art of effective or persuasive speaking or writing, especially the use of

figures of speech and other compositional techniques.

Synonyms: oratory, eloquence, persuasion

Antonyms: silence, inarticulateness, conciseness

Sentence: He employed persuasive rhetoric to convince the audience of her point of view.

6. DEVOUT (ADJECTIVE): धार्मिक

Pronunciation: duh·vawt

Meaning: having or showing deep religious feeling or commitment.

Synonyms: religious, reverent, holy **Antonyms:** faithless, godless, impious

Sentence: Louis became an extremely devout and ascetic man.

7. MACABRE (ADJECTIVE): भयंकर

Pronunciation: muh·kaa·bruh

Meaning: unpleasant and frightening because it is connected with death.

Synonyms: gruesome, grisly, ghastly **Antonyms:** delightful, pleasant, appealing

Sentence: Even the police were horrified at the macabre nature of the killings.

8. OBLIVION (NOUN): विस्मरण

Pronunciation: uh·bli·vee·uhn

Meaning: the state of being unaware or unconscious of what is happening.

Synonyms: unconsciousness, insensibility, stupor **Antonyms:** consciousness, recollection, awareness

Sentence: The old photographs brought back memories that had long been buried in the

depths of oblivion.

9. PROLIX (ADJECTIVE): अति विस्तृत

Pronunciation: proh·luhks

Meaning: (of speech or writing) using or containing too many words; tediously lengthy.

Synonyms: lengthy, long-winded, verbose

Antonyms: concise, compact, brief

Sentence: The author's <u>prolix</u> style has done nothing to encourage sales of the book.

10. CONSTERNATION (NOUN): आतंक

Pronunciation: kawn·stuh·nay·shn Meaning: a feeling of shock or worry. Synonyms: dismay, perturbation, anxiety





Antonyms: comfort, consolation, relief

Sentence: The government's plans have caused considerable consternation among many

Americans.

11. IMPLICATE (NOUN): दोषी ठहराना

Pronunciation: im-pluh.kayt.uhd

Meaning: to show that somebody is involved in something unpleasant, especially a crime.

Synonyms: compromise, involve, connect **Antonyms:** absolve, unwound, uncoiled

Sentence: He was <u>implicated</u> in a price-fixing scandal.

12. ABROGATE (VERB): अभिनिषेध करना

Pronunciation: a·bruh·gayt

Meaning: repeal or do away with (a law, right, or formal agreement).

Synonyms: revoke, repeal, overrule **Antonyms:** institute, enact, founds

entence: The ministry proposed to abrogate the dated electoral law.

13. EMPATHY (NOUN) :समानुभूति

Pronunciation: em·puh·thee

Meaning: the ability to understand and share the feelings of another

Synonyms: sympathy, pity, compassion

Antonyms: ruthlessness, mercilessness, apathy

Sentence: Doctors should develop <u>empathy</u> between themselves and patients.

14. RELINQUISH (VERB) :त्यागना

Pronunciation: ruh·ling·kvuhsh

Meaning: voluntarily cease to keep or claim; give up

Synonyms: surrender, render, abandon **Antonyms:** retain, keep, withhold

Sentence: When you <u>relinquish</u> the desire to control your future, you can have more

happiness.

15. UNANIMOUS (ADJECTIVE) : एकमत

Pronunciation: yoo·na·nuh·muhs

Meaning: (used about a group of people) all agreeing about something.

Synonyms: like-minded, at one, united **Antonyms:** divided, discordant, opposite

Sentence: The doctors were <u>unanimous</u> in their diagnoses.



16. CATASTROPHIC (ADJECTIVE) :आपत्तिजनक

Pronunciation: ka·tuh·straw·fuhk

Meaning: causing sudden and very great harm or destruction.

Synonyms: Calamitous, Cataclysmic, fateful

Antonyms: Fortunate, Blessed, lucky

Sentence: His mother's untimely death had a catastrophic effect on him.

17. DETERIORATING(VERB) :ख़राब होना

Pronunciation: duh·teeuh·ree·uh·rayt·uhng

Meaning: To become worse.

Synonyms: Collapse, Degenerate, unkept **Antonyms:** Improvement, Heighten, New

Sentence: The weather conditions are <u>deteriorating</u>.

18. ANNEXATION(NOUN) : राज्य-हरण

Pronunciation: a · neks · ay · shn

Meaning: possession taken of a piece of land or a country.

Synonyms: Seizure, Invasion, takeover

Antonyms: Detachment, Loss

Sentence: Annexations of suburban territory in 1888 and 1890 greatly increased the area

of the city.

19. HANKER (VERB): लालायित होना

Pronunciation: hang·kuh

Meaning: to have a strong desire or longing for something.

Synonyms: Crave, Yearn, Long

Antonyms: Dislike, Abhor

Sentence: I have always hankered for adventure and travel, so I decided to take a year off

and backpack across Europe.

20. DEPRAVED (ADJECTIVE): भ्रष्ट

Meaning: morally corrupt, wicked.

Meaning: dishonest, or not speaking the complete truth.

Synonyms: dishonest, deceitful, underhand

Antonyms: honest, sincere, genuine

Sentence: he was being somewhat <u>disingenuous</u> as well as cynical.

22. EXPUNGE (VERB): मिटाना

Pronunciation: uhk·spuhnj

Meaning: to rub off or remove information from a piece of writing.

Synonyms: erase, delete, abolish **Antonyms:** add, construct, insert

Sentence: His name has been expunged from the list of members.

23. OBFUSCATE (VERB): अस्पष्ट बनाना

Pronunciation: awb·fuh·skayt

Meaning: to make something unclear, confusing, or difficult to understand.

Synonyms: confuse, complicate, blur **Antonyms:** clarify, simplify, illuminate

Sentence: The loan contract was filled with legal words meant to <u>obfuscate</u> trusting

borrowers.

24. UNREMITTING (ADJECTIVE): निरंतर

Pronunciation: uhn·ruh·mit·uhng

Meaning: going on and on without any interruptions.

Synonyms: continuous, relentless, incessant

Antonyms: recurrent, intermittent, discontinuous

Sentence: As long as continuous efforts, and unremitting struggle, there are no things that

cannot be conquered.

25. CORROBORATE (VERB): पुष्टि करना

Pronunciation: kuh·raw·buh·rayt

Meaning: confirm or give support to (a statement, theory, or finding).

Synonyms: confirm, verify, endorse **Antonyms:** refute, disprove, rebut

Sentence: Recent research seems to <u>corroborate</u> his theory.

26. UNFURL (VERB): खोलना

Pronunciation: uhn·fuhl

Meaning: make or become spread out from a rolled or folded state, especially in order to be open to the wind.





Synonyms: unfold, expand, extend **Antonyms:** fold, close, reduce

Sentence: During the spring, the sprouting leaves begin to unfurl, and each petal that

opens will sprout a colorful bloom.

27. INVERSION (NOUN): विपरीतता

Pronunciation: uhn·vuh·zhn

Meaning: a situation in which something is changed so that it is the opposite of what

it was before, or in which something is turned upside down.

Synonyms: reversal, reverse, contrary **Antonyms:** verticality, erectness, stability

Sentence: Her account of the case was an inversion of the facts (it said the opposite

of what really happened).

28. COGNOSCENTE (NOUN): विशेषज्ञ

Pronunciation: co·gno·scen·te

Meaning: a connoisseur; a discerning expert (a person who has expert knowledge in a

subject).

Synonyms: expert, authority, specialist **Antonyms:** novice, amateur, neophyte

Sentence: Michael Meredith, a French cognoscente and librarian at Eton College in

England, is less supportive.

29. INGENIOUS (ADJECTIVE): रचनात्मक

Pronunciation: in jee nee uhs

Meaning: having the skill and imagination to create new things.

Synonyms: inventive, innovative, creative **Antonyms:** imitative, uninventive, unskillful

Sentence: With how skilled my chess opponent was, it would take an <u>ingenious</u> strategy

to defeat him, and a fair amount of luck.

30. SQUANDERED (VERB): गंवाना

Pronunciation: skvawn·duhd

Meaning: waste (something, especially money or time) in a reckless and foolish manner.

Synonyms: waste, misspend, misuse

Antonyms: conserved, preserved, preserve

Sentence: Eddie has a tendency to <u>squander</u> his entire allowance on comic books and

movies.



31. SUBJUGATE (VERB): अधीन करना

Pronunciation: suhb-ju-gayt

Meaning: bring under domination or control, especially by conquest.

Synonyms: subdue, conquer, dominate

Antonyms: liberate, emancipate, enfranchise

Sentence: The manager tried to subjugate the employees into working late by threatening

to fire them.

32. DISINCENTIVE (NOUN): निस्त्साहित

Pronunciation: dis·uhn·sen·tuhv

Meaning: a factor, especially a financial disadvantage, that discourages a particular

action.

Synonyms: deterrent, discouragement, impediment

Antonyms: incentive, motivation, impetus

Sentence: Punishments serve as a <u>disincentive</u>, attempting to deter people from doing

things they shouldn't.

33. APPREHENSION (NOUN): आशंका

Pronunciation: a · pruh · hen · shn

Meaning: anxiety or fear that something bad or unpleasant will happen.

Synonyms: dread, anxiety, worry

Antonyms: confidence, calmness, certainty

Sentence: I am feeling a great deal of apprehension after learning that we have a test

tomorrow in my worst subject.

34. STIGMA (NOUN): कलंक

Pronunciation: stig·muh

Meaning: a mark of disgrace associated with a particular circumstance, quality, or person.

Synonyms: shame, disgrace, dishonour

Antonyms: honour, credit, award

Sentence: Often people are afraid to admit they have a mental illness because of the stigma

attached to psychiatric disorders.

35. DECRY (VERB): निंदा करना

Pronunciation: duh·krai

Meaning: publicly denounce; to criticize something as bad, without value, or

unnecessary.

Synonyms: criticize, denigrate, denounce, condemn

Antonyms: applaud, laud, praise, extol





Sentence: Several religious organizations have chosen to <u>decry</u> the obscene cartoon about Jesus.

36. SALIENT (ADJECTIVE): महत्त्वपूर्ण

Pronunciation: say·lee·uhnt
Meaning: noticeable or important.

Synonyms: remarkable, prominent, striking **Antonyms:** subtle, unremarkable, obscure

Sentence: She began to summarize the salient features/points of the proposal.

37. SEAMLESS (ADJECTIVE): निरंतरतायुक्त

Pronunciation: seem·luhs

Meaning: smooth and continuous, with no apparent gaps or spaces between one part and

the next.

Synonyms: perfect, flawless, impeccable **Antonyms:** imperfect, bad, defective

Sentence: Although there were some hiccups along the way, the project seemed seamless

on the outside.

38. CALLOUS (ADJECTIVE): कठोर

Pronunciation: ka·luhs

Meaning: not caring about the feelings or suffering of other people.

Synonyms: ruthless, merciless, heartless

Antonyms: sympathetic, compassionate, merciful

Sentence: The professor was <u>callous</u> and cold, and no one wanted to remain in the class

39. STARTLE (VERB): चौंकाना

Pronunciation: staa·tl

Meaning: cause to feel sudden shock or alarm.

Synonyms: shock, stun, astonish **Antonyms:** assure, soothe, comfort

Sentence: If the music is too loud, it will <u>startle</u> the sleeping baby.

40. APLOMB (NOUN): अभिमान

Pronunciation: uh.plawm

Meaning: self-confidence or assurance, especially when in a demanding situation.

Synonyms: poise, composure, coolness **Antonyms:** agitation, concern, care

Sentence : Despite the heartache James must be feeling, he's still dancing with <u>aplomb</u>.



41. EMBOLDEN (VERB): साहसी बनाना

Pronunciation: uhm.boled.uhn

Meaning: give (someone) the courage or confidence to do something.

Synonyms: encourage, hearten, rouse **Antonyms:** discourage, daunt, weaken

Sentence: The party has been <u>emboldened</u> by recent local election successes.

42. BREAKTHROUGH (NOUN): उन्नत

Pronunciation: brayk.throo

Meaning: an important discovery or development.

Synonyms: advance, step forward, find

Antonyms: set back

Sentence: Detectives think they have made a breakthrough in their search.

43. ABATEMENT (NOUN): कमी

Pronunciation: uh.bayt,muhnt

Meaning: the action of abating or being abated; ending or subsiding.

Synonyms: subsiding, fade, decrease **Antonyms:** addition, increase, rise

Sentence: Colchester Council slapped a noise abatement notice on the site.

44. AMELIORATE (VERB): सुधारना

Pronunciation: uh.mee.lee.uh.rayt Meaning: to make something better. Synonyms: improve, better, enhance Antonyms: worsen, impair, harm

Sentence: She wanted to ameliorate the situation.

45. BLEAK (ADJECTIVE): सर्द

Pronunciation: bleek

Meaning: (used about a place) cold, empty and grey.

Synonyms: keen, raw Antonyms: warm

Sentence: the forecast looks <u>bleak</u> for the next week.

46. EXQUISITE (ADJECTIVE): अति स्ंदर

Pronunciation: ek.skvuh.zuht

Meaning: extremely beautiful and pleasing.





Synonyms: lovely, elegant, superb

Antonyms: soft, light, weak

Sentence: the gallery houses some exquisite works of art.

47. TANGLE (NOUN): उलझन

Pronunciation: tang.gl

Meaning: a confused mass, especially of threads, hair, branches, etc. that cannot easily be

separated from each other.

Synonyms: entangle, catch, twist

Antonyms: conviction, certainty, sureness

Sentence: She fought through the tangle of brushwood trying to catch up with her fleeing

friend.

48. ASSERTIVE (ADJECTIVE): निश्चयात्मक

Pronunciation: uh.suh.tiv

Meaning: expressing your opinion clearly and firmly so that people listen to you or do

what you want.

Synonyms: confident, positive, bold

Antonyms: unassertive, submissive, docile

Sentence: The country is playing a more <u>assertive</u> role on the world stage.

49. INFIRM (ADJECTIVE): कमजोर

Pronunciation: uhn.fuhm

Meaning: not physically or mentally strong, especially through age or illness.

Synonyms: frail, weak, weakly **Antonyms:** powerful, stout, strong **Sentence:** Care for the infirm.

50. UNLEASH (VERB) : खोलना

Pronunciation: uhn.leesh

Meaning: to suddenly let a strong force, emotion, etc. be felt or have an effect.

Synonyms: release, free, untie

Antonyms: contain, restrain, control

Sentence: The editorial unleashed a torrent of angry responses.

51. AUGMENT (VERB):बढ़ती करना

Pronunciation: augh-ment

Meaning: to increase the amount, value, size, etc. of something.

Synonyms: add to, supplement, increase





Antonyms: decrease, reduce, lessen

Sentence: He <u>augmented</u> his summer income by painting houses.

52. AMIABLE (ADJECTIVE):मित्रतापूर्ण

Pronunciation: ay·mee·uh·bl
Meaning: friendly and pleasant.
Synonyms: affable, amicable, warm
Antonyms: unfriendly, unpleasant, rude

Sentence: The amiable young man greeted me enthusiastically.

53. RECKLESS (ADJECTIVE) :लापरवाह

Pronunciation: rek·luhs

Meaning: not thinking about possible bad or dangerous results that could come from your

actions.

Synonyms: Rash, Heedless, careless

Antonyms: Cautious, Careful, responsible

Sentence: He showed a reckless disregard for the safety of others.

54. SPREE (NOUN): आनंद का उत्सव

Pronunciation: spree

Meaning: A short period of doing a particular, usually enjoyable, activity much more than

is usual.

Synonyms: Binge, Orgy, splurge **Antonyms:** temperance, restraint

Sentence: I went on a shopping/spending <u>spree</u> on Saturday.

55. FLIMSY (ADJECTIVE): कमजोर

Pronunciation: flim·zee

Meaning: comparatively light and insubstantial; easily damaged.

Synonyms: fragile, insubstantial, feeble **Antonyms:** sturdy, substantial, strong

Sentence: The storm flattened the <u>flimsy</u> wooden huts that the villagers lived in.

56. PENITENT (ADJECTIVE): अन्तापी

Pronunciation: peh·nuh·tnt

Meaning: feeling or showing sorrow and regret for having done wrong; repentant.

Synonyms: repentant, remorseful, ashamed

Antonyms: impenitent, unrepentant, unapologetic **Sentence**: "I'm sorry," she said with <u>penitent</u> smile.



57. APARTHEID (NOUN): रंगभेद

Pronunciation: uh·paat·ide

Meaning: the former official government policy in South Africa of separating people of

different races and making them live apart.

Synonyms: segregation, discrimination, racism,

Antonyms: integration, union, impartial

Sentence: Nelson Mandela helped to end Apartheid, which was racial discrimination in

South Africa.

58. PERSPICACIOUS (ADJECTIVE):कुशाग्र बुद्धि

Pronunciation: puh·spuh·kay·shuhs

Meaning: having a ready insight into and understanding of things.

Synonyms: discerning, shrewd, perceptive

Antonyms: foolish, idiotic, moronic

Sentence: He was perspicacious enough to realize that things were soon going to change.

59. BLANDSMITH (NOUN) : चिकनी चुपड़ी बातें

Pronunciation: blan.duhsh.muhnt

Meaning: a flattering or pleasing statement or action used as a means of gently persuading

someone to do something.

Synonyms: flattery, coaxing, cajolery **Antonyms: dis**paragement, put-down

Sentence: He remained impervious to all Nell's sulks and <u>blandishments</u>.

60. NEBULOUS (ADJECTIVE) : अस्पष्ट

Pronunciation: neh.byoo.luhs

Meaning: (used about a shape, idea, etc.) not clear or exact; without any definite edges.

Synonyms: cryptic, dark, murky **Antonyms:** clear, plain, obvious

Sentence: Smudges like this are called nebulae, because they look nebulous - like hazy

clouds.
