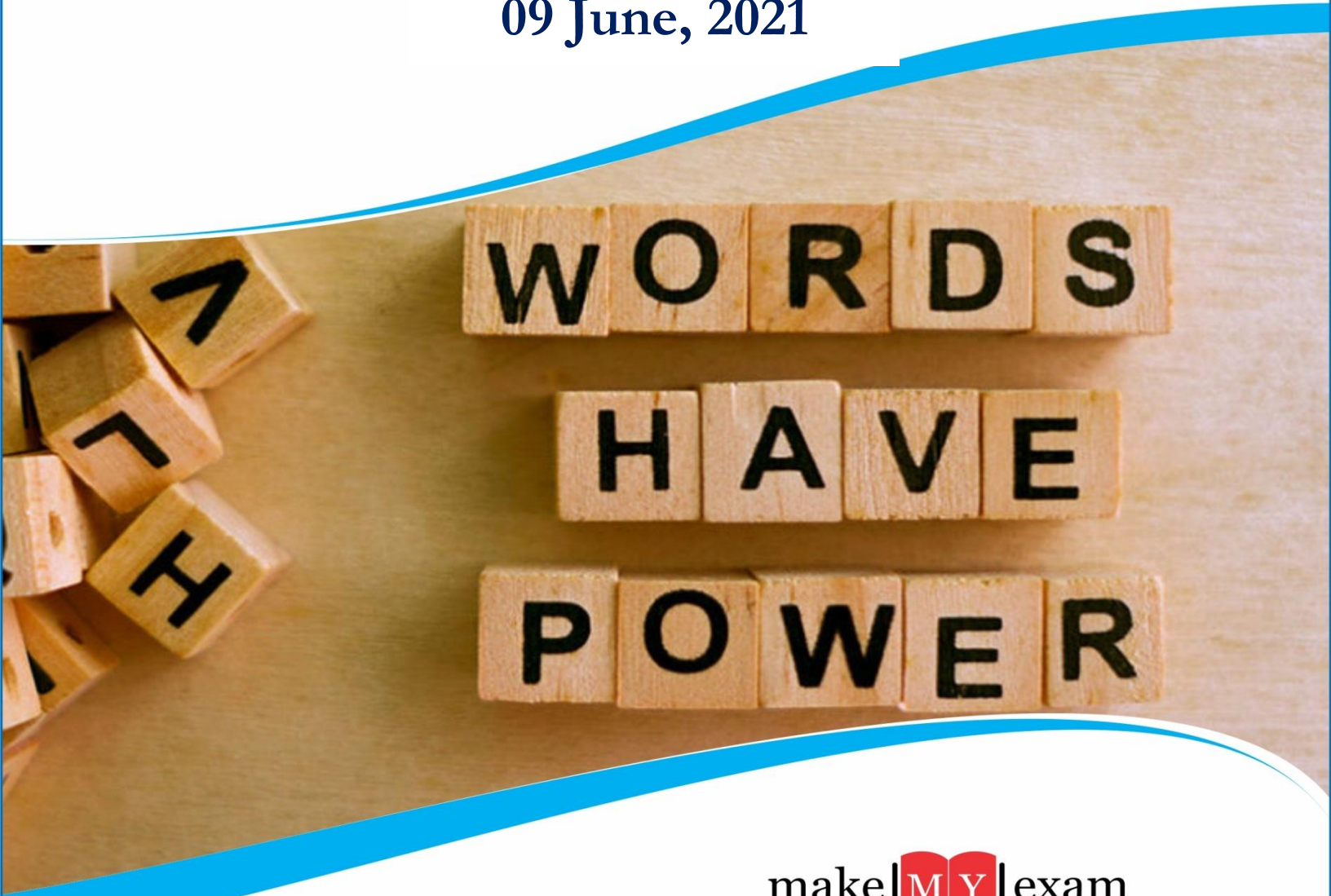

1.Ingrained (adj) - स्थायी

Pronunciation: in·greind

Meaning: firmly fixed or established

Synonyms: entrenched, established, fixed, inbred, implanted

Antonyms: transient, superficial

Usage: The idea of doing our duty is deeply ingrained in most people.

2.Prerequisite (noun) - शर्त, आधार

Pronunciation: pri·rik·wizit

Meaning: a thing that is required as a prior condition for something else to happen or exist

Synonyms: precondition, essential, requirement, qualification, requisite

Antonyms: nonessential, unnecessary, extra

Usage: Having good communication skill is a prerequisite for qualifying the interview.

3.Absolution (noun) - मुक्ति

Pronunciation: ab·suh·loo·shn

Meaning: formal release from guilt, obligation, punishment

Synonyms: forgiveness, exoneration, remission, dispensation, pardoning

Antonym: punishment

Usage: The priest heard her confession and granted absolution.

4.Tussle (noun) - संघर्ष

Pronunciation: tuh·sl

Meaning: fight or struggle

Synonyms: scuffle, fight, struggle, skirmish, brawl, scrimmage

Antonyms: harmony, peace, accord

Usage: Because they like to tussle, the lion cubs spend a good part of their day wrestling each other.

5.Ulterior (adj) - गुप्त

Pronunciation: uhl·teeuh·ree·uh

Meaning: existing beyond what is obvious or admitted

Synonyms: underlying, undisclosed, unexpressed, unapparent, unrevealed, secret

Antonyms: visible, noticeable, known

Usage: The accountant's ulterior motives led her to stealing bank funds under the company radar.

6.Cumulative (adj) - संचित

Pronunciation: kyoo·myu·lutiv

Meaning: increasing or increased in quantity, degree, or force by successive additions

Synonyms: increasing, accumulative, accumulating, growing, progressive

Antonyms: decreasing, dwindling, reducing

Usage: The cumulative effect of the rain and the freezing weather will produce dangerous driving conditions.

7.Indivisible (adj) - अविभाज्य

Pronunciation: in·duh·vi·zuh·bl

Meaning: impossible of undergoing division

Synonyms: inseparable, unbreakable, unified, impenetrable, joined, indissoluble, permanent

Antonyms: dividable, separable

Usage: For many years the atom was believed to be indivisible.

8.Retract (verb) - वापिस लेना

Pronunciation: ri·trakt

Meaning: to pull back in

Synonyms: sheathe, withdraw, unsay, recant, disown, disclaim

Antonyms: extend, assert, confirm

Usage: After being sued, the magazine was forced to retract the fictitious article.

9.Envoy (noun) - दूत, प्रतिनिधि

Pronunciation: en·voi

Meaning: a messenger or representative

Synonyms: delegate, diplomat, representative, agent, ambassador, messenger

Antonym: receiver

Usage: The king sent his envoy to discuss his daughter's marriage to his rival's son.

10.Liken (verb) - मिलाना, तुलना करना

Pronunciation: lai·kun

Meaning: point out the resemblance of someone or something to

Synonyms: compare, relate, resemble, equate, analogize

Antonyms: contrast, differ, disconnect

Usage: A reporter can only write one story at a time, which I liken to preparing just one dish at a time.



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
