### 1. REMORSEFUL(ADJECTIVE): पश्चातापी

### **Pronunciation:** ruh·maws·ful

Meaning: feeling or expressing sincere regret or remorse.

Synonyms: repentant, contrite, apologetic

Antonyms: unrepentant, impenitent, shameless

**Sentence:** After realizing the harm he had caused, he was <u>remorseful</u> and apologized to those he had hurt.

## 2. TRAVAIL (NOUN): कड़ा परिश्रम

Pronunciation: tra·vayl
Meaning: painful or laborious effort, a physical or mental exertion.
Synonyms: toil, labor, effort
Antonyms: ease, rest, leisure
Sentence: She went through much travail to become a doctor.

## 3. DESICCATED (ADJECTIVE): सुखाया हुआ

Pronunciation: deh·suh·kayt·uhd

Meaning: used about food dried in order to keep it for a long time. Synonyms: dried up, dehydrated, lifeless Antonyms: hydrated. Juicy, braced Sentence: After sitting in the hot sun all day, the once lush green grass had become <u>desiccated</u> and brown.

# 4. RANCOUR (NOUN): विद्वेष

### **Pronunciation: ran-kuh**

Meaning: bitterness or resentment, especially long-lasting and deep-seated.

Synonyms: Animosity, enmity, resentment

Antonyms: Friendliness, goodwill, harmony

**Sentence:** Despite their past disagreements, they managed to let go of their <u>rancour</u> and work together for a common cause.

# 5. LITIGATE (VERB): मुक़दमा



### Pronunciation: li·tuh·gayt

**Meaning:** to engage in a legal proceeding to resolve a dispute.

Synonyms: Sue, prosecute, bring to court

Antonyms: Settle, resolve, arbitrate

**Sentence:** The two parties decided to <u>litigate</u> their dispute in court instead of attempting to settle it out of court.

## 6. ANTHROPOGENIC (ADJECTIVE): मानवजनित

### Pronunciation: an·thruh·puh·jeh·nuhk

**Meaning:** relating to or resulting from the influence of human beings on nature or the environment.

Synonyms: Human-caused, human-made, manmade

Antonyms: Natural, organic, non-anthropogenic

**Sentence:** Climate change is largely caused by <u>anthropogenic</u> factors such as burning fossil fuels and deforestation.

## 7. WANTON (ADJECTIVE): अकारण

**Pronunciation: vawn.tn Meaning:** showing no care or conce

Meaning: showing no care or concern for others; reckless. Synonyms: obscene, vulgar, foul Antonyms: Careful, responsible, conscientious, Sentence: The wanton destruction of the property angered the community.

# 8. DISMANTLE (VERB): লष্ट

### Pronunciation: duhs·man·tl

**Meaning:** to take apart or pull down; to strip furniture, equipment, or fittings; to disassemble.

Synonyms: Deconstruct, demolish, take apart

Antonyms: Assemble, construct, build

**Sentence:** The workers were instructed to <u>dismantle</u> the old machinery before installing the new one.

# 9. DELETERIOUS (ADJECTIVE): हानिकारक

### Pronunciation: deh·luh·teeuh·ree·uhs

**Meaning:** harmful or injurious to health, wellbeing, or morals; causing damage or harm. **Synonyms:** injurious, pernicious, detrimental

Antonyms: Beneficial, advantageous, helpful

**Sentence:** Smoking is a <u>deleterious</u> habit that can lead to various health problems, including lung cancer and heart disease.



#### 10. ENVISAGE (VERB): कल्पना करना

#### Pronunciation: en·vi·suhj

**Meaning:** to imagine or visualize; contemplate or visualize a future event or possibility. **Synonyms:** Imagine, visualize, conceive

Antonyms: Disregard, overlook, ign ore

**Sentence:** She could <u>envisage</u> a bright future for her business with the new marketing strategy.
