

# 1. ITINERANT (adjective) – भ्रमणकारी

Pronunciation: uh·ti·nuh·ruhnt
Meaning: moving around from location to location
Synonyms: travelling, peripatetic, wandering, wayfaring, roving, roaming, rambling
Antonyms: sedentary, settled
Usage: Jane is an <u>itinerant</u> teacher who travels between schools teaching special education

students.

#### 2. CONCUR (verb) – सहमत होना

Pronunciation: kuhng⋅kuh
Meaning: to agree with something
Synonyms: acquiesce, coincide, jibe, accede, accord, assent
Antonyms: clash, disagree, separate
Usage: I fully <u>concur</u> with him in this matter.

#### 3. RECANT (verb) – खण्डन करना

Pronunciation: ruh·kant
Meaning: to retract a public statement
Synonyms: renounce, forswear, disavow, deny, repudiate, abjure, relinquish
Antonyms: reaffirm, admit, affirm
Usage: The judge ordered the magazine to recant the false statements it made about the actress.

# 4. BOLSTER (verb) – सँभालना, सहारा देना

**Pronunciation**: bowl·stuh

Meaning: support or strengthen

Synonyms: strengthen, support, reinforce, boost, fortify, uphold, aid, assist



Antonyms: undermine, weaken, obstruct

Usage: Free tickets were given away to bolster attendance at the game.

## 5. MORTIFY (verb) – अपमानित करना

Pronunciation: maw.tuh.fai

Meaning: cause someone to feel very embarrassed or ashamed

Synonyms: embarrass, humiliate, chagrin, shame, discomfit, abash

Antonyms: delight, please, soothe

**Usage**: I am certain my sister meant to <u>mortify</u> me when she showed my date my baby pictures.



#### 6. LUNACY (noun) – बावलापन

#### **Pronunciation**: loo·nuh·see

Meaning: foolish or senseless behavior

**Synonyms**: absurdity, folly, foolishness, idiocy, insanity, mania, stupidity

Antonyms: intelligence, judgment, sanity

Usage: It would be <u>lunacy</u> to try to climb the mountain in this weather.

## 7. CHEEKY (adjective) - मुखर

#### **Pronunciation**: chee · kee

**Meaning**: impudent or unapologetic but in a generally charming way **Synonyms**: impudent, impertinent, insolent, presumptuous, forward, pert, bold **Antonyms**: respectful, polite



**Usage**: My son can be a little <u>cheeky</u> at times, but I don't get too mad unless he flat out disobeys me on something important.

#### 8. CRAVEN (adjective) - डरपोक

Pronunciation: krei·vn
Meaning: lacking in courage
Synonyms: cowardly, faint-hearted, spiritless, spineless, timid, fearful, trembling
Antonyms: brave
Usage: A hero risks his life to help others whereas a <u>craven</u> runs from the scene.

#### 9. CODDLE (verb) – लाड़ प्यार करना

Pronunciation: ko·dl
Meaning: to treat gently or with great care
Synonyms: pamper, cosset, caress, indulge, mollycoddle
Antonyms: ignore, neglect
Usage: Many people coddle their children too much.

# 10. SUPERFLUOUS (adjective) - अतिरिक्त

Pronunciation: soo·puh·floo·uhs
Meaning: more than what is needed
Synonyms: excessive, expendable, gratuitous, redundant, unneeded, useless, abounding
Antonyms: important, necessary, needed
Usage: The recipe is annoying me with <u>superfluous</u> details.



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
