2. QUEER(ADJECTIVE): अजीब या असामान्य

Sentence: The film explores queer themes and challenges societal norms.

3. GOTHIC (ADJECTIVE): गोथिक

Pronunciation: gaw·thik

Meaning: something that is characterized by mystery, horror, and gloom.

Synonyms: Dark, Mysterious **Antonyms:** Bright, Cheerful

Sentence: The gothic novel was filled with suspense, horror, and supernatural elements.

Antonyms: Warm, Cordial

Sentence: The ground was covered in a frosty layer of ice on the winter morning.

5. VENGEANCE (NOUN): प्रतिशोध

Pronunciation: ven·jns

Meaning: the act of seeking revenge or inflicting punishment on someone.

Synonyms: Payback, Retaliation



Antonyms: Mercy, Pardon

Sentence: After years of mistreatment, he finally sought vengeance against his oppressors.

6. NUMB (ADJECTIVE): सून्न (अंग)

Pronunciation: nuhm

Meaning: a lack of sensation or feeling

Synonyms: Frozen, Insensitive **Antonyms:** Alert, Responsive

Sentence: After sitting in the cold for hours, her fingers became numb and she couldn't

feel them.

7. PELTED (VERB): पत्थर मारना

Pronunciation: pelt-uhd

Meaning: the action of repeatedly striking or hitting someone or something with

great force.

Synonyms: Barraged, Hailed Antonyms: Evaded, Missed

Sentence: Protesters pelted the police with rocks and bottles.

8. INCESSANT(ADJECTIVE): निरंतर

Pronunciation: uhn·seh·snt

Meaning: something that continues without interruption or pause.

Synonyms: Continuous, Perpetual **Antonyms:** Intermittent, Occasional

Sentence: The baby's incessant crying kept the parents awake all night.

9. VILE (ADJECTIVE): बह्त ख़राब या अप्रिय

Pronunciation: vile

Meaning: something extremely unpleasant, morally repulsive.

Synonyms: Loathsome, Repugnant **Antonyms:** Virtuous, Admirable

Sentence: The vile smell coming from the garbage bin made everyone hold their noses.

10. OPACITY (NOUN): अस्पष्टता

Pronunciation: oh·pa·suh·tee

Meaning: something is not transparent or does not allow light to pass through.

Synonyms: Murkiness, Cloudiness **Antonyms:** Clarity, Transparency





Sentence: The frosted glass window had a high level of opacity, preventing anyone from seeing inside the room.

11. PRUDENT (ADJECTIVE): सावधान/विवेकी

Pronunciation: pru·dent

Meaning: acting with or showing care and thought for the future.

Synonyms: wise, judicious **Antonyms:** imprudent, careless

Sentence: It is always prudent to save money for emergencies.

12. BOLSTER (VERB): मजबूत करना

Pronunciation: bol·ster

Meaning: a long, thick pillow that is placed under other pillows for support.

Synonyms: strengthen, reinforce **Antonyms:** weaken, undermine

Sentence: The new evidence will bolster her case.

13. CLANDESTINE (ADJECTIVE): गुप्त

Pronunciation: clan-des-tine

Meaning: kept secret or done secretively, especially because illicit

Synonyms: covert, concealed **Antonyms:** open, public

Sentence: They held a clandestine meeting to discuss the strategy.

14. MITIGATE (VERB): कम करना

Pronunciation: mit·i·gate

Meaning: make (something bad) less severe, serious, or painful

Synonyms: alleviate, lessen **Antonyms:** aggravate, worsen

Sentence: Proper planning can mitigate the risks of failure.

15. ERRATIC (ADJECTIVE): अनियमित

Pronunciation: er·rat·ic Meaning: unpredictable

Synonyms: inconsistent, irregular **Antonyms:** stable, consistent

Sentence: His erratic behavior worried his parents.

16. VIGILANT (ADJECTIVE): सतर्क



Pronunciation: vig·i·lant

Meaning: keeping careful watch for possible danger or difficulties

20. APPREHENSIVE (ADJECTIVE): चिंतित/भयभीत

Pronunciation: a · pruh · hens · uhv

Meaning: relating to perception or understanding

Synonyms: fearful, uneasy **Antonyms:** confident, assured

Sentence: She felt apprehensive before the interview.

21. COMMENDABLE (ADJECTIVE): सराहनीय

Pronunciation: kuh-MEN-duh-buhl

Meaning: deserving praise

Synonyms: admirable, creditable **Antonyms:** blameworthy, shameful





Example: Her efforts to help the poor are truly commendable.

22. PETULANT (ADJECTIVE): ਫੀਠ

Pronunciation: peh·tyu·luhnt

Meaning: childishly sulky or bad-tempered.

Synonyms: irritable, peevish **Antonyms:** genial, extraverted

Example: I didn't appreciate being accused of acting like a petulant toddler.

23. OMINOUS (ADJECTIVE): अश्म

Pronunciation: aw·muh·nuhs

Meaning: giving the worrying impression that something bad is going to happen.

Synonyms: menacing, sinister **Antonyms:** promising, auspicious

Example: There were ominous signs of an approaching storm.

24. CURTAIL (VERB): कम करना

Pronunciation: kuh·tayl

Meaning: impose a restriction on.

Synonyms: shorten, limit **Antonyms:** expand, prolong

Example: The government curtailed the budget for defense.

25. DISCREET (ADJECTIVE): विवेकपूर्ण

Pronunciation: duh·skreet

Meaning: careful and prudent in one's speech or actions, especially in order to keep

something confidential

Synonyms: prudent, tactful

Antonyms: careless, reckless

Example: She was always discreet about her personal matters.

26. PERSIST (VERB): डटे रहना

Pronunciation: puh·sist

Meaning: continue in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition.

Synonyms: endure, persevere **Antonyms:** quit, give up

Example: Despite the difficulties, he persisted with his studies.

27. ABUNDANT (ADJECTIVE): प्रचुर



Pronunciation: uh.buhn.dnt

Meaning: existing or available in large quantities

Synonyms: ample, bountiful **Antonyms:** scarce, insufficient

Example: This region has abundant natural resources.

28. COHERENT (ADJECTIVE): सुसंगत

Pronunciation: koh-heeuh-ruhnt Meaning: logical and consistent Synonyms: consistent, rational Antonyms: illogical, confusing

Example: She presented a coherent argument in court.

29. VINDICATE (VERB): साबित करना

Pronunciation: vin·duh·kayt

Meaning: clear (someone) of blame or suspicion

Synonyms: prove, uphold **Antonyms:** condemn, accuse

Example: The evidence helped vindicate the accused.

30. EXUBERANT (ADJECTIVE): उत्साही

Pronunciation: uhgz·yoo·buh·ruhnt

Meaning: full of energy, excitement and cheerfulness

Synonyms: lively, energetic **Antonyms**: dull, depressed

Example: The children were exuberant at the thought of a picnic.

31. CRITICAL (ADJECTIVE): जरूरी

Pronunciation: kri·tuh·kl

Meaning: crucial

Synonyms: vital, essential **Antonyms:** unimportant

Sentence: Temperature is a critical factor in fruit storage.

32. SUSCEPTIBLE (ADJECTIVE): भोला

Pronunciation: suh·sep·tuh·bl

Meaning: impressionable **Synonyms:** vulnerable, prone

Antonyms: guarded



Sentence: They only do it to tease him as he's too susceptible.

33. LOOMING (VERB, ADJECTIVE):धुंधला दिखाई देना

Sentence: The government has not woken up to the looming crisis.

34. STREAM (NOUN): श्रंखला

35. INCLEMENT (ADJECTIVE): ख़राब

Antonyms: Placid, calm

Sentence: The game was postponed due to inclement weather forecast.

36. PERTURBED (ADJECTIVE): व्याकुल

Pronunciation: puh·tuhbd

Meaning: anxious.

Synonyms: worried, concerned

Antonyms: confident

Sentence: The unexpected news left her feeling perturbed.

37. Languish (Verb): दुर्बल

Pronunciation: lang-gvuhsh

Meaning: to be or live in a state of depression or decreasing vitality.

Synonyms: Weaken, Wilt

Antonyms: Recover, Recuperate

Sentence: The abandoned building languished, becoming a home for rats and weeds.

38. BLISTERING (ADJECTIVE): छाले पड़ना

Sentence: There was a blistering attack on the government's transport policy.

Sentence: Gradually, the army faction had increased.

42. Guile (Noun): चालाकी/छल

Pronunciation: gile

Meaning: sly or cunning intelligence.

Synonyms: Cunning, deceit **Antonyms:** Honesty, sincerity

Sentence: She used her guile to convince him.

43. PROTRACT (VERB): बढ़ाना

Pronunciation: pruh·trakt

Meaning: prolong.

Synonyms: extend, draw out

Antonyms: curtail

Sentence: He had certainly taken his time, even protracting the process.





44. CAPACIOUS (ADJECTIVE): लंबा-चौड़ा

Meaning: roomy.

45. PETULANT (Adjective): तुनक मिज़ाज

Sentence: The contract will obligate both parties to fulfill their promises.

47. VINDICATION (NOUN): दोष-निवारण

Meaning: justifying or defending one's actions, beliefs, or decisions.

Synonyms: Exoneration, Acquitted **Antonyms:** Accusation, Denunciation

Sentence: After years of false accusations, the new evidence finally brought vindication to

the wrongly accused man, and he was set free from prison.

48. PROPULSION (NOUN): संचालक शक्ति

Meaning: the force that pushes or drives a vehicle, etc. forward.

Meaning: the use of force to persuade someone to do something that they are unwilling to

do.

Synonyms: Compulsion, Harassment

Antonyms: Consent, Free Will

Sentence: The workers felt under constant coercion to work overtime, which led to

widespread discontent among them.

50. SURFEIT (NOUN): अधिकता

Pronunciation: suh-fuht

Meaning: too much of something **Synonyms:** Excess, abundance

Antonyms: Deficiency

Sentence: The market was flooded with a surfeit of cheap, low-quality products.
