

1. PERVERSITY (noun) : प्रतिकूलता

Pronunciation: puh·vuhs·uh·tee
Meaning: a deliberate desire to behave in an unreasonable or unacceptable way; contrariness.
Synonyms: contrariness, perverseness, awkwardness
Antonyms: amiability, serenity
Sentence: She's marrying him out of sheer perversity.

2. AVID (adj.) : उत्सुक

Pronunciation: ay vuhd **Meaning:** having or showing a keen interest in or enthusiasm for something. **Synonyms:** keen, eager, enthusiastic **Antonyms:** apathetic, indifferent, unenthusiastic **Sentence:** She's an <u>avid</u> reader of historical novels.

3. RISIBLE (adj.) : हास्यास्पद

Pronunciation: ri·zuh·blMeaning: such as to provoke laughter.Synonyms: laughable, comedic, comicAntonyms: humorless, lame, unamusingSentence: A risible comment that made the whole class laugh.

4. ENTICE (verb) : लुभाने

Pronunciation: uhn·tise
Meaning: attract or tempt by offering pleasure or advantage.
Synonyms: tempt, allure, lure
Antonyms: drive (away or off), repulse
Sentence: The adverts <u>entice</u> the customer into buying things they don't really want.

5. HEINOUS (adj.) : जघन्य

Pronunciation: hay nuhs

Meaning: (of a person or wrongful act, especially a crime) utterly odious or wicked. **Synonyms:** odious, wicked, evil



Antonyms: innocuous, inoffensive, pleasant **Sentence:** They admitted to the most <u>heinous</u> crimes.

6. CONVALESCE (verb) : अच्छा हो जाना

Pronunciation: kawn·vuh·les
Meaning: recover one's health and strength over a period of time after an illness or operation.
Synonyms: get better, recover, get well
Antonyms: ail, collapse, sicken
Sentence: He will need about a week to <u>convalesce</u> after his hospital stay.

7. STRENUOUS (adj.) : ज़ोरदार

Pronunciation: streh·nyoo·uhs
Meaning: requiring or using great exertion.
Synonyms: arduous, difficult, hard
Antonyms: effortless, facile, simple
Sentence: All your muscles need more oxygen during <u>strenuous</u> exercise.

8. ROUSE (verb) : उत्तेजित करना

Pronunciation: rawzMeaning: cause to feel angry or excited.Synonyms: stir up, excite, galvanizeAntonyms: rest, calmSentence: The crowds were roused to fever pitch by the drama of the race.

9. UNWONTED (adj.) : असामान्य

Pronunciation: uhn·vawnt·uhd **Meaning:** unaccustomed or unusual. **Synonyms:** unusual, uncommon, unaccustomed **Antonyms:** common, customary, normal **Sentence:** He spoke with <u>unwonted</u> enthusiasm.

10. CYNICAL (adj.) : संदेहास्पद

Pronunciation: si·nuhk·uhl
Meaning: having or showing a deep distrust of human beings and their motives
Synonyms: distrustful, doubtful
Antonyms: trustful, cheerful
Sentence: I think she takes a rather <u>cynical</u> view of men.
