1.Acutely (adv) - तीव्रता से

Pronunciation: uh·kyoot·lee **Meaning:** with reference to something unpleasant or unwelcome; intensely. **Synonyms:** extremely, severely, sharply, harshly, keenly, piercingly **Antonyms:** slightly, chronically, blissfully, gladly, happily **Usage:** The whole situation was acutely embarrassing.

2.Underlying (adj) - आधारभूत

Pronunciation: uhn·duh·laing
Meaning: important in a situation but not easily noticed or stated clearly
Synonyms: fundamental, basic, prime, primary, basal, beginning, elemental
Antonyms: secondary, refined, complex, sophisticated, high,
Usage: The <u>underlying</u> assumption is that the amount of money available is limited.

3.Unearth (verb) - पता लगाना

Pronunciation: uhn·uhth **Meaning:** discover(something hidden, lost or kept secret) by investigation or searching **Synonyms:** uncover, find, come across, disinter, exhume **Antonyms:** hide, conceal, cover, bury, entomb, inhume **Usage:** They have done all they can to <u>unearth</u> the truth.

4.Feasible (adj) - संभव

Pronunciation: fee·zu·bl
Meaning: possible to do easily or conveniently
Synonyms: practicable, attainable, workable, doable, possible
Antonyms: impossible, unattainable, impractical, doubtful, dubious
Usage: It's just not <u>feasible</u> to manage the business on a part-time basis.

5.Debilitating (adj) - दुर्बल

Pronunciation: duh·bi·luh·teit·uhng

Meaning: (of a disease or condition) making someone very weak and infirm **Synonyms:** Enervating, draining, weakening, exhausting, fatiguing, wearing **Antonyms:** invigorating, refreshing, exhausting, fatiguing, wearing



Usage: Many people spend a substantial part of old age in <u>debilitating</u> condition.

6.Protrusion (noun) - फलाव

Pronunciation: pruh·troo·zhn
Meaning: a thing that sticks out from a place or surface
Synonyms: jutting, obtrusion, projection, bulge, bunch, convexity
Antonyms: furrow, groove, trench, trough, dimple, gouge, impression, notch
Usage: He grabbed at a protrusion of rock with his right hand.

7.Rapacious (adj) - लालची

Pronunciation: ruh·pei·shuhs
Meaning: aggressively greedy or grasping
Synonyms: grasping, avaricious, acquisitive, devouring, gobbling, gorging
Antonyms: liberal, lavish, ,agnanimous, content, full, glutted
Usage: He had a <u>rapacious</u> appetite for bird's nest soup.

8.Unnerving (adj) - हतोत्साहित

Pronunciation: uhn·nuhv·uhng
Meaning: inspiring fear
Synonyms: agitating, anxious, creepy, disquieting, distressful
Antonyms: calming, comfortable, easy, peaceful, quiet
Usage: It is very <u>unnerving</u> to find out that someone you see every day is carrying a potentially deadly virus.

9.Hobbled (verb) - शौक़ीन

Pronunciation: haw bld **Meaning:** hamper the action or progress of **Synonyms:** absence, lack, need, want, deprivation, dispossession **Antonyms:** acquisition, gain, control, hands, having, keeping, possession **Usage:**The old man <u>hobbled</u> along with the help of his grandson.

10.Bereave (verb) - वंचित करना

Pronunciation: buh·reev **Meaning:** be deprived of a close relation or friend through their death. **Synonyms:** deprive, dispossess, rob, divest, abate, denude **Antonyms:** acquisition, gain, control, hands, having **Usage:** The accident <u>bereaved</u> Jack of his wife.
