


1.INSULAR (ADJ): द्वीपीय

Pronunciation: ins·yoo·luh

Meaning: ignorant of or uninterested in cultures, ideas, or peoples outside one's own experience

Synonyms: narrow-minded, blinkered

Antonyms: broad-minded, tolerant

Sentence: They are very insular and dislike foreign culture

2.BUNGLER (noun) : गोलमाल करनेवाला

Pronunciation: buhng·guh1·uh

Meaning: a person who habitually bungles things; an amateur.

Synonyms: blunderer, incompetent, amateur

Antonyms: Bungler, expert, maestro

Sentence: The Los Angeles Times this morning called them bunglers.

3.GRATIFICATION (noun) : संतुष्टि

Pronunciation: gra·tuh·fuh·kay·shn

Meaning: pleasure, especially when gained from the satisfaction of a desire.

Synonyms: satisfaction, fulfillment, indulgence

Antonyms: discontent, displeasure, dissatisfaction

Sentence: His son's success was a great gratification to him.

4.SCURRILOUS (adj.) : मिथ्या

Pronunciation: skuh·ruh·luhs

Meaning: making or spreading scandalous claims about someone with the intention of damaging their reputation.

Synonyms: abusive, vituperative, derogatory

Antonyms: moderate, temperate, praiseful

Sentence: Scurrilous and untrue stories were being invented.

5.INCOMMODIOUS (adj.) : असुविधाजनक

Pronunciation: in·kuh·moh·dee·uhs

Meaning: causing inconvenience or discomfort.

Synonyms: limited, restricted

Antonyms: commodious, capacious

Sentence: The harbor is unsafe and incommodious.

6.GAZILLION (noun) : अधिक

Pronunciation: guh·zi·lee·uhn

Meaning: a huge number or quantity (used for emphasis).

Synonyms: million, thousands, excess

Antonyms: little, inadequacy, deficiency

Sentence: I have a gazillion things to do.

7.RECOMPENSE (noun) : मुआवज़ा

Pronunciation: reh·kuhm·pens

Meaning: compensation or reward given for loss or harm suffered or effort made.

Synonyms: compensation, reparation, indemnification

Antonyms: cost, dissatisfaction, penalty

Sentence: She received a gift as recompense.

8.HOWBEIT (adv.) : परन्तु

Pronunciation: hau·bee·uht

Meaning: nevertheless; however.

Synonyms: even so, however, nevertheless

Antonyms: all the same

Sentence: I've never written a poem before; howbeit, I feel my first attempt is quite good

9.CALIGINOUS (adj.) : अंधेरा

Pronunciation: ca·lig·i·nous

Meaning: being without light or without much light

Synonyms: black, dark, darkened

Antonyms: bright, brightened, illuminated

Sentence: Without a flashlight, there was no way to tell what kind of creatures lurked in the caliginous cave.

10.INDUCEMENT (noun) : प्रलोभन

Pronunciation: uhn·dyoos·muhnt

Meaning: a thing that persuades or influences someone to do something.

Synonyms: incentive, attraction, encouragement


Antonyms: disincentive, discouragement, dissuasion

Sentence: The higher payments were offered as an inducement.

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
