### 1. STIPULATED (verb): तय करना

**Pronunciation:** sti.pyoo.lay.tuhd

**Meaning:** demand or specify (a requirement), typically as part of an agreement

**Synonym:** Specify, Demand, require

**Antonym:** Suggest, Imply, variable

**Sentence:** The contract stipulated that all payments must be made on time.

### 2. APPREHENSIVE (adjective): भयभीत

**Pronunciation:** a.pruh.hens.uhv

**Meaning:** anxious or fearful that something bad or unpleasant will happen

**Synonym:** Anxious, Worried, nervous

**Antonym:** Confident, Unconcerned, unaware

**Sentence:** She was apprehensive about the results of her medical test.

### 3. CESSATION (noun): समापन

**Pronunciation:** ses.ay.shn

**Meaning:** the fact or process of ending or being brought to an end

**Synonym:** Termination, Conclusion, finish

**Antonym:** Continuation, Start, prolongation

**Sentence:** The cessation of hostilities was welcomed by all parties involved in the conflict.

### 4. TREMORS (noun): झटके

**Pronunciation:** treh.muhz

**Meaning:** involuntary shaking movements, often of the earth

**Synonym:** Quakes, Shivers, quiver

**Antonym:** Stability, Calm, steadiness

**Sentence:** The tremors were felt across the city, causing panic among the residents.

### 5. DREAD (noun): डर लगना

**Pronunciation:** dred

**Meaning:** great fear or apprehension

**Synonym:** Terror, Fear, cower at

**Antonym:** Calmness, Welcome, lulling

**Sentence:** She felt a sense of dread as she walked alone in the dark alley.

**6. GIGANTIC (adjective): विशाल**

**Pronunciation:** jai.gan.tik

**Meaning:** very large; huge

**Synonym:** Enormous, Colossal , huge

**Antonym:** Tiny, Small, micro

**Sentence:** The gigantic statue dominated the skyline of the city.

**7. SHARDS (noun): टुकड़े**

**Pronunciation:** shaadz

**Meaning:** pieces of a broken glass, pottery, or other hard substances

**Synonym:** Fragments, Splinters, scarp

**Antonym:** Whole, Intact, hunk

**Sentence:** Shards of broken glass lay scattered across the floor after the accident.

**8. LATENT (adjective): अव्यक्त**

**Pronunciation:** lay.tnt

**Meaning:** existing but not yet developed or manifest; hidden; concealed

**Synonym:** Dormant, Hidden, unused

**Antonym:** Obvious, Manifest, active

**Sentence:** She was surprised by her latent talent for singing that emerged later in life.

**9. PENT-UP (adjective): मन में दबा हुआ**

**Pronunciation:** pent-up

**Meaning:** not expressed or released; held in

**Synonym:** Suppressed, Bottled , repressed

**Antonym:** Released, Expressed

**Sentence:** Pent-up frustration finally erupted in a loud argument.

**10. SHED(noun): ओसारा**

**Pronunciation:** shed

**Meaning:** a small building that is used for keeping things or animals in

**Synonyms:** hut, lean-to, shack

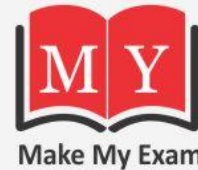
**Antonyms:** use, take on, adopt

**Sentence:** the snake had shed its skin.

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
