### 1. IMPOSING (adjective) – भव्य, आलीशान

Pronunciation: uhm·pow·zuhng

**Meaning**: grand and impressive in appearance

Synonyms: impressive, striking, eye-catching, spectacular, staggering, stunning, awesome,

awe-inspiring

Antonyms: unimposing, modest

Usage: The castle is an imposing building.

#### 2. TERSE (adjective) – संक्षिप्त

**Pronunciation**: tuhs

Meaning: sparing in the use of words

Synonyms: curt, brusque, abrupt, clipped, blunt, gruff, short

**Antonyms**: verbose, rambling

Usage: Although Phillip is known for making long speeches, this speech was incredibly

terse.

#### 3. VERACITY (noun) – सच्चाई

Pronunciation: vuh·ra·suh·tee

Meaning: conformity to facts; accuracy

Synonyms: truthfulness, truth, accuracy, correctness, exactness, realism, authenticity,

faithfulness

Antonyms: delusion, falsity

Usage: They questioned the veracity of her story.

#### 4. TENTATIVE (adjective) – प्रयोगात्मक

**Pronunciation**: ten·tuh·tuhv

Meaning: not certain or fixed; provisional



Synonyms: provisional, unconfirmed, unsettled, indefinite, preliminary, speculative,

conjectural

Antonyms: definite, certain, final

Usage: We have made a tentative plan for the vacation but haven't really decided yet.

#### 5. ARDUOUS (adjective) - कठिन

**Pronunciation**: aa·dyoo·uhs **Meaning**: difficult and tiring

Synonyms: onerous, taxing, difficult, hard, heavy, laborious, burdensome, strenuous

Antonyms: easy, effortless, facile

Usage: Playing the piano may seem arduous at first, but it gets easier with practice.



#### 6. RATIONAL (adjective) - तर्कसंगत

**Pronunciation**: ra·shuh·nuhl

Meaning: based on or in accordance with reason or logic

Synonyms: logical, reasoned, sensible, reasonable, cogent, coherent, intelligent

Antonym: irrational, illogical

Usage: Humans are essentially <u>rational</u> beings.

#### 7. BEATIFIC (adjective) – आनन्दप्रद

Pronunciation: bee·uh·ti·fuhk

Meaning: feeling or expressing blissful happiness

Synonyms: rapturous, joyful, ecstatic, seraphic, blissful, serene, happy

Antonyms: miserable, sorrowful, unhappy

**Usage**: She had a <u>beatific</u> expression on her pretty face.



#### 8. MERCURIAL (adjective) – अस्थिर

**Pronunciation**: muh·kyuor·ree·uhl

Meaning: subject to sudden or unpredictable changes of mood or mind

Synonyms: volatile, capricious, excitable, fickle, changeable, unpredictable, variable

Antonyms: stable, steady, constant

Usage: The trending topics on Twitter are mercurial because they often change within

seconds.

#### 9. LOPSIDED (adjective) – एकतरफा, असंत्लित

Pronunciation: lop·sai·duhd

**Meaning**: with one side lower or smaller than the other

Synonyms: asymmetrical, uneven, unbalanced, unequal, askew, unsymmetrical

**Antonyms**: even, level, balanced

Usage: Wiggling back and forth, the lopsided chair distracted the worker from finishing

her work.

#### 10. EFFETE (adjective) – अशक्त

Pronunciation: uh-feet

Meaning: weak or effeminate

Synonyms: effeminate, unmanly, weak, soft, timid, fearful

**Antonyms**: manly, masculine, strong

Usage: The huge wrestler made fun of the effete man who entered the ring to challenge

him.
