

1. FRAGILE (adjective) – कोमल

Pronunciation: fra·jail

Meaning: easily broken or damaged

Synonyms: breakable, delicate, feeble, frail, weak, shatterable

Antonyms: firm, strong, tough

Usage: This glass disc looks very fragile.

2. DEVISE (verb) – ईजाद करना, चिंतन करना

Pronunciation: duh·vaiz

Meaning: plan or invent by careful thought

Synonyms: conceive, formulate, concoct, design, frame, invent

Antonyms: destroy, ruin, shatter

Usage: You must take time to devise a scheme that suits your own needs.

3. BREATHER (noun) – विश्राम

Pronunciation: bree·thuh

Meaning: a brief pause for rest

Synonyms: break, rest, pause, interval, respite

Antonym: continuation

Usage: The weekend will give me a slight breather.

4. GAFFE (noun) – चूक

Pronunciation: gaf

Meaning: an unintentional act or remark causing embarrassment to its originator

Synonyms: blunder, mistake, error, slip, indiscretion, impropriety

Antonyms: correction

Usage: He didn't realize what a gaffe he had made.

5. REVAMP (verb, noun) – सुधार

Pronunciation: ree·vamp

Meaning: give new and improved form, structure, or appearance to

Synonyms: renovate, redecorate, refurbish, recondition, rehabilitate, rebuild

Antonyms: hurt, damage, harm

Usage: The attempt to revamp the museum's image remained successful.

6. TICKLISH (adjective) – समस्यात्मक, मुश्किल

Pronunciation: ti·kuh·luhsh

Meaning: difficult or tricky and requiring careful handling

Synonyms: problematic, tricky, delicate, sensitive, controversial, awkward

Antonyms: easy, simple, uncomplicated

Usage: The skilled attorney is good at posing ticklish questions that most people would want to avoid during a trial.

7. VERBATIM (adjective) – प्रतिशब्द

Pronunciation: vuh·bei·tm

Meaning: in exactly the same words as were used originally

Synonyms: literally, exactly, precisely, accurately, directly

Antonym: loosely

Usage: Because he had such a great memory, Jason could recite the lyrics of a song verbatim after only hearing it once.

8. RECEPTIVE (adjective) – ग्रहणशील

Pronunciation: ruh·sep·tuhv

Meaning: willing to consider or accept new suggestions and ideas

Synonyms: open, responsive, amenable, sympathetic, interested, attuned

Antonyms: resistant, unresponsive, insensitive

Usage: Children are more receptive to new experiences if their parents prepare them ahead of time.

9. SOAR (verb) – उंची उड़ान भरना

Pronunciation: saw

Meaning: fly or rise high in the air

Synonyms: wing, take off, ascend, climb, rise, mount

Antonym: plummet

Usage: She watched the dove soar above the chestnut trees.

10. RESONANT (adjective) – गुंजयमान

Pronunciation: reh·zuh·nuhnt

Meaning: deep, clear, and continuing to sound or reverberate

Synonyms: deep, sonorous, vibrant, rich, clear, ringing, orotund

Antonyms: faint, thin, weak

Usage: The resonant sound in the amphitheater travels to every seat in the house.
