**1.POLYMATH (noun): बहुश्रुत**

**Pronunciation:** paw·lee·math

**Meaning:** a person of wide-ranging knowledge or learning.

**Synonyms:** polyhistor, Renaissance man, brainier

**Antonyms:** ignoramus, illiterate, know-nothing

**Sentence:** Miller is a brilliant polymath and he has trounced his rivals by thinking differently.

**2.LAUREATE (noun): विजेता**

**Pronunciation:** law·ree·uht

**Meaning:** a person who is honored with an award for outstanding creative or intellectual achievement.

**Synonyms:** acclaim, applaud, cheer

**Antonyms:** discredit, disgrace, dishonor

**Sentence:** John Dryden was appointed the first Poet Laureate.

**3.ESCALATION (noun) : वृद्धि**

**Pronunciation:** eh·skuh·lay·shn

**Meaning:** a rapid increase; a rise.

**Synonyms:** rapid increase, rise, hike

**Antonyms:** Decrease, reduction

**Sentence:** A further escalation of the crisis now seems inevitable.

**4.PERVERSION (noun) : आचारभ्रष्टता**

**Pronunciation:** puh·vuh·shn

**Meaning:** the alteration of something from its original course, meaning, or state to a distortion or corruption of what was first intended.

**Synonyms:** distortion, misrepresentation, falsification

**Antonyms:** conformity, normality, regularity

**Sentence:** His craving for publicity has become almost a perversion.

**5.CONTEMPLATION (noun) : विचार**

**Pronunciation:** kawn·tuhm·play·shn

**Meaning:** the action of looking thoughtfully at something for a long time.

**Synonyms:** examination, inspection, observation

**Antonyms:** ignorance, avoidance, disdain.

**Sentence:** The road is too busy for leisurely contemplation of the scenery.

**6.SACKED (verb) :** बर्खास्त

**Pronunciation:** sakt

**Meaning:** dismiss from employment.

**Synonyms:** dismiss, throw out, let go

**Antonyms:** hire, take on, recruited

**Sentence:** Any official found to be involved would be sacked on the spot.

**7.CINCH (noun) :** आसान काम

**Pronunciation:** sinch

**Meaning:** an extremely easy task.

**Synonyms:** easy, uncomplicated, not difficult

**Antonyms:** challenging, complicated, difficult

**Sentence:** This dish is a cinch to make.

**8.AGILE (adj.) :** चुस्त

**Pronunciation:** uh·jile

**Meaning:** able to move quickly and easily.

**Synonyms:** lithe, nimble, spry

**Antonyms:** clumsy, gawky, graceless

**Sentence:** She is such an agile dancer!

**9.HERALD (verb) :** सूचना देना

**Pronunciation:** heh·ruhld

**Meaning:** be a sign that (something) is about to happen.

**Synonyms:** signal, indicate, announce

**Antonyms:** hide, keep secret

**Sentence:** The speech heralded a change in policy.

**10.EPITHET (noun) :** विशेषण

**Pronunciation:** eh·puh·thet

**Meaning:** an adjective or descriptive phrase expressing a quality characteristic of the person or thing mentioned.

**Synonyms:** sobriquet, nickname, byname

**Antonyms:** Compliment, Accolade, Commendation

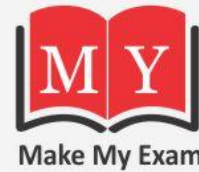
**Sentence:** Old men are often unfairly awarded the epithet “dirty”.

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
