1. CRUX (NOUN): निचोड़

Pronunciation: kruhks

Meaning: the central or most important point

Synonyms: Core, essence, heart, nucleus, key point

Antonyms: Periphery, fringe, superficiality

Sentence: The crux of the matter was that effective communication was necessary for the success of the project.

2. TENET(NOUN): सिद्धांत

Pronunciation: teh·nuht

Meaning: a principle or belief, especially one of the main principles of a religion or philosophy.

Synonyms: Doctrine, dogma, principle, belief, creed

Antonyms: Heresy, disbelief, dissent

Sentence: The tenet of the organization is to promote equality and social justice for all members of the community.

3. RECONVENED(NOUN): फिर से इकट्ठा होना

Pronunciation: ree·kuhn·veend

Meaning: to convene or assemble again, especially after a break or adjournment.

Synonyms: reassembled, regathered

Antonyms: Adjourned, dispersed, disbanded

Sentence: After a short recess, the meeting reconvened to discuss the remaining agenda items.

4. PROROGUED(VERB): स्थगित किया गया

Pronunciation: pruh·roged

Meaning: to discontinue a session of a legislative body without dissolving it; to temporarily suspend or postpone.

Synonyms: Postponed, suspended, deferred, adjourned

Antonyms: Convened, resumed, continued

Sentence: The parliament prorogued its session due to unforeseen circumstances, with plans to reconvene in a month.

5. DIVESTED (ADJECTIVE): छीनना**Pronunciation:** dai·vest·uhd**Meaning:** to strip or deprive someone or something of certain attributes, possessions, or characteristics.**Synonyms:** dispossessed, unloaded, sold off**Antonyms:** Endowed, invested, adorned, retained**Sentence:** The company divested itself of noncore businesses in order to focus on its primary strengths and improve profitability.**6. TENDER (ADJECTIVE): दयालु****Pronunciation:** ten·duh**Meaning:** caring.**Synonyms:** kind, kindly**Antonyms:** hard-hearted**Sentence:** He was unusually tender to me, and for a brief space the shadow lifted.**7. PLENARY (ADJECTIVE): विस्तृत****Pronunciation:** plee·nuh·ree**Meaning:** unconditional.**Synonyms:** unlimited, unrestricted**Antonyms:** conditional**Sentence:** Crusaders were offered a plenary indulgence by the Pope.**8. LETHAL (ADJECTIVE): घातक****Pronunciation:** lee·thl**Meaning:** fatal.**Synonyms:** deadly, mortal**Antonyms:** harmless**Sentence:** In addition, no antibiotic therapy was administered, as it was a lethal model.**9. GENIUS (ADJECTIVE): प्रतिभाशाली****Pronunciation:** in·jee·nee·uhs**Meaning:** inventive.**Synonyms:** creative, imaginative**Antonyms:** unimaginative**Sentence:** He was ingenious enough to overcome the limited budget.**10. UNPRECEDENTED (ADJECTIVE): अभूतपूर्व****Pronunciation:** uhn·preh·suh·duhn·tuhd

Meaning: unparalleled.

Synonyms: unequalled, unmatched

Antonyms: normal, common

Sentence: The preparations were made on an unprecedented scale.

11. REBELLIOUS (ADJECTIVE): अवज्ञापूर्ण

Pronunciation: ruh·bel·ee·uhs

Meaning: defiant.

Synonyms: disobedient, insubordinate

Antonyms: conformist

Sentence: I became very rebellious and opted out.

12. MAGNIFICENCE (NOUN): भव्यता

Pronunciation: mag·ni·fuh·sns

Meaning: splendor.

Synonyms: grandeur, greatness

Antonyms: cheapness

Sentence: The magnificence of the surrounding countryside captured everyone's attention.

13. RUDDY (ADJECTIVE): लाल

Pronunciation: ruh·dee

Meaning: reddish.

Synonyms: red, rosy

Antonyms: pale

Sentence: He's got the classic ruddy cheeks and twinkle in his eye.

14. CONTEMPT (NOUN): तिरस्कार

Pronunciation: kuhn·tempt

Meaning: scorn.

Synonyms: disdain, disrespect

Antonyms: respect

Sentence: He stared at me with total contempt.

15. POPULIST (ADJECTIVE): जनवादी या लोकवादी

Pronunciation: paw·pyoo·luhst

Meaning: relating to or characteristic of a political approach or style that seeks to appeal to ordinary people.

Synonyms: Demagogue, people-oriented, grassroots.

Antonyms: Elitist, exclusive, establishment-friendly.

Sentence: The charismatic leader's populist rhetoric resonated with many voters, promising to address their concerns and challenges.

16. CROSSROADS (noun): चौराहा

Pronunciation: kraw·srodez

Meaning: a point where two or more roads intersect, typically with a choice of different routes to take.

Synonyms: Intersection, junction, turning point

Antonyms: Straight path, straightforward route, continuity.

Sentence: At the crossroads of his career, he faced a challenging decision about whether to pursue further education or enter the workforce immediately.

17. COALITION (NOUN): गठबंधन

Pronunciation: koh·uh·li·shn

Meaning: a temporary alliance or partnership formed by different groups, individuals or parties for a common purpose or goal, often in politics.

Synonyms: Alliance, union, partnership, federation, confederation.

Antonyms: Rivalry, opposition, discord, disunion.

Sentence: The two political parties formed a coalition to address the pressing economic issues facing the country.

18. RADICAL (ADJECTIVE): मौलिक

Pronunciation: ra·duh·kl

Meaning: favoring or making thorough or complete changes in political, economic, or social institutions.

Synonyms: extremist, drastic, thorough, sweeping.

Antonyms: Conservative, moderate, gradual.

Sentence: The activist advocated for radical reforms in the education system to address inequality.

19. INFLUX (NOUN): आगम

Pronunciation: in·fluhks

Meaning: the arrival or entry of a large number of people or things.

Synonyms: Inflow, arrival, incursion, incurrence, inundation.

Antonyms: Outflow, departure, exodus, egress.

Sentence: The city experienced a significant influx of tourists during the holiday season.

20. FASCIST (NOUN): तानाशाही

Pronunciation: fa·shuhst

Meaning: a person who supports or advocates for fascism, which is a political system characterized by dictatorial power, strong centralized government, often led by a single leader and suppression of opposition.

Synonyms: Authoritarian, totalitarian, autocratic

Antonyms: Democrat, liberal, egalitarian.

Sentence: The rise of a charismatic leader with authoritarian tendencies raised concerns among the citizens, who feared the country might be heading toward a fascist regime.

21. SLAPDASH (ADJECTIVE): जल्दबाज़

Pronunciation: slap·dash

Meaning: something that is done hastily or in a careless and rushed manner, often resulting in a lack of attention to detail or quality.

Synonyms: Cursory, Shoddy

Antonyms: Diligent, Thorough, Meticulous

Sentence: The report was completed in a slapdash manner, with numerous errors and inconsistencies that could have been avoided with more careful consideration and attention to detail.

22. HINDSIGHT (NOUN): दीर्घदर्श

Pronunciation: hined·site

Meaning: the understanding or awareness of a situation, event, or decision after it has occurred.

Synonyms: Reflection, Retrospection

Antonyms: Foresight, Prescience

Sentence: In hindsight, she realized that her decision to change careers was the best choice she could have made, leading to greater happiness and fulfilment.

23. GASP (VERB): दम तोड़ देना

Pronunciation: gaasp

Meaning: shock, or a lack of breath.

Synonyms: Pant, Wheeze, Gulp

Antonyms: Exhale, Breathe out, Relax

Sentence: She couldn't help but gasp when she opened the door to find a room filled with balloons and confetti, a surprise birthday party awaiting her.

24. WISTFUL (ADJECTIVE): उदास

Pronunciation: vist·ful

Meaning: a feeling of melancholy or yearning, often accompanied by a sense of longing or nostalgia for something that may not be attainable.

Synonyms: Nostalgic, Dreamy, Yearning

Antonyms: Content, Satisfied

Sentence: As she looked at the old photographs, a wistful expression crossed her face, reminiscing about the carefree days of her youth.

25. CRABBED (ADJECTIVE): तीक्ष्ण

Pronunciation: krabd

Meaning: something that is irritable, grumpy, or difficult to deal with.

Synonyms: Cross, Testy, Cranky

Antonyms: Cheerful, Pleasant, Affable

Sentence: His crabbed demeanor made it challenging for others to approach him with questions or concerns, creating a tense atmosphere in the office.

26. CLAMMY (ADJECTIVE): चिप चिपा

Pronunciation: kla·mee

Meaning: something that is damp, sticky.

Synonyms: Sweaty, Dank, Moist

Antonyms: Warm, Smooth, Comfortable

Sentence: After the intense workout, her skin felt clammy, and she welcomed the cool breeze to provide some relief.

27. PUERILE (ADJECTIVE): बचकाना

Pronunciation: pyu·rile

Meaning: something that is childish, immature, or silly in a way that is typical of a child or youth.

Synonyms: Immature, Juvenile, Infantile

Antonyms: Adult, Sophisticated, Grown.up.

Sentence: His puerile jokes during the important business meeting were not well received, as the team expected a more professional and mature approach to the discussion.

28. CANDOR (NOUN): स्पष्टवादिता

Pronunciation: can·dor

Meaning: the quality of being open, honest, and straightforward in speech or expression.

Synonyms: Frankness, Openness

Antonyms: Deceit, Dishonesty, Concealment, Evasiveness

Sentence: Her candour in admitting her mistakes not only earned her the respect of her colleagues but also helped to build a culture of transparency in the workplace.

29. DERISIVE (ADJECTIVE): व्यंग्यात्मक

Pronunciation: di·rai·siv

Meaning: something that expresses contempt or ridicule, often in a mocking or scornful manner.

Synonyms: Mocking, Sneering, Ridiculing

Antonyms: Admiring, Appreciative, Complimentary

Sentence: The comedian's derisive comments about certain political figures drew laughter from the audience but also left some feeling uneasy about the level of sarcasm in his humour.

30. MENDACIOUS (ADJECTIVE): मिथ्या, गलत

Pronunciation: men·day·shuhs

Meaning: the quality of being untruthful or dishonest. It describes someone or something that tends to lie or deceive.

Synonyms: Deceptive, False

Antonyms: Sincere, Genuine, Honest

Sentence: The mendacious politician claimed to have accomplished numerous feats, but upon investigation, it was revealed that most of his statements were fabricated.

31. ROCOCO (ADJECTIVE): अलंकृत

Pronunciation: ruh·koh·koh

Meaning: ornate

Synonyms: fancy, curlicue

Antonyms: plain

Sentence: The present building, in florid rococo style, dates from 1744.1767.

32. FLOUNDER (VERB): संघर्ष करना

Pronunciation: flawn·duh

Meaning: struggle

Synonyms: thrash, thresh

Antonyms: prosper

Sentence: He was floundering about in the shallow offshore waters.

33. VIGNETTES (NOUN): लघु चित्र, चित्र या शब्द चित्र

Pronunciation: vuh·nyets

Meaning: a short, descriptive literary sketch or scene that captures a moment, character, or impression in a concise and vivid manner.

Synonyms: Glimpse, Portrayal

Antonyms: Detailed, Comprehensive

Sentence: Her travel journal was filled with vignettes of the people she met and the places she visited.

34. EXILED (ADJECTIVE): निर्वासित**Pronunciation:** ek·siled**Meaning:** having been sent away from one's home country or place of residence, typically as a punishment or as a result of political, social, or personal reasons.**Synonyms:** Expelled, Banished**Antonyms:** Embraced, Reinstated**Sentence:** The artist felt like an outcast in the art community, leading to a self-imposed exile from the art scene.**35. SCRUPULOUS (ADJECTIVE): सावधान****Pronunciation:** skroo·pyoo·luhs**Meaning:** careful**Synonyms:** meticulous, painstaking**Antonyms:** careless**Sentence:** The research has been carried out with scrupulous attention to detail.**36. INSCRUTABLE (ADJECTIVE): रहस्यपूर्ण****Pronunciation:** uhn·skroo·tuh·bl**Meaning:** enigmatic**Synonyms:** unreadable, impenetrable**Antonyms:** expressive**Sentence:** Guy looked blankly inscrutable.**37. WANTON (ADJECTIVE): अकारण****Pronunciation:** vawn·tn**Meaning:** showing no care or concern for others; reckless.**Synonyms:** Reckless, malicious, cruel, irresponsible**Antonyms:** Careful, responsible, conscientious, considerate**Sentence:** The wanton destruction of the property angered the community.**38. DISMANTLE (VERB): अलग करना****Pronunciation:** duhs·man·tl**Meaning:** to take apart or pull down; to strip furniture, equipment, or fittings; to disassemble.**Synonyms:** Deconstruct, demolish, take apart**Antonyms:** Assemble, construct, build, put together**Sentence:** The workers were instructed to dismantle the old machinery before installing the new one.

39. KERFUFFLE (ADJECTIVE): शोर शराबा, हंगामा**Pronunciation:** kuh.fuf.ful**Meaning:** a commotion or fuss, especially one caused by conflicting views (noise, excitement, and argument).**Synonyms:** commotion, stir, fuss, disturbance, turmoil**Antonyms:** hush, peace, quiet, calm, tranquility, stillness**Sentence:** There was a kerfuffle at the party when two guests got into a heated argument.**40. MENACE (VERB):** खतरा**Pronunciation:** meh·nuhs**Meaning:** danger, or someone or something that is likely to cause harm.**Synonyms:** threat, danger, peril, risk, hazard**Antonyms:** guard, protect, save**Sentence:** Reckless driving on the road is a menace to other drivers and pedestrians.**41. BLUSTER (NOUN):** धमकी**Pronunciation:** bluh•stuh**Meaning:** loud, aggressive, or indignant talk with little effect.**Synonyms:** ranting, hectoring, thundering**Antonyms:** tranquillity, quietude**Sentence:** I believe deeply in persuasion, not bluster.**42. POMPOUS (ADJECTIVE):** गर्वित**Pronunciation:** pawmp·uhs**Meaning:** affectedly and irritatingly grand, solemn, or self-important.**Synonyms:** self-important, imperious, overbearing**Antonyms:** egoless, humble, modest**Sentence:** He appears pompous but is a good man underneath.**43. INOPPORTUNE (ADJECTIVE):** बेवक़्त**Pronunciation:** i·naw·puh·choon**Meaning:** occurring at an inconvenient or inappropriate time.**Synonyms:** untimely, ill-timed, badly timed**Antonyms:** timely, expected**Sentence:** They arrived at an inopportune moment.**44. ENNOBLE (VERB):** उदात्त बनाना**Pronunciation:** uh·noh·bl**Meaning:** give (someone) a noble rank or title.

Synonyms: aggrandize, canonize, elevate

Antonyms: abase, degrade, demean

Sentence: The heroic actions of firefighters during the terrorist attack did much to ennoble the profession of fire fighting in the public mind.

45. MASCULINITY (NOUN): बहादुरता

Pronunciation: ma·skyoo·lin·uh·tee

Meaning: qualities or attributes regarded as characteristic of men.

Synonyms: virility, manliness, maleness

Antonyms: muliebrity, effeminacy

Sentence: Handsome, muscled, and driven, he's a prime example of masculinity.

46. QUELL (VERB): शांत करना

Pronunciation: Kvel

Meaning: put an end to (a rebellion or other disorder), typically by the use of force.

Synonyms: end, finish, get rid of

Antonyms: support, foment, incite

Sentence: Soldiers were sent in to quell the riots.

47. BLARNEY (NOUN): चापलूसी

Pronunciation: blaa·nee

Meaning: talk that aims to charm, pleasantly flatter, or persuade.

Synonyms: blandishments, honeyed word, flattery

Antonyms: disparagement, coerce,

Sentence: Only a fool will believe your blarney.

48. PENCHANT (NOUN): लगन

Pronunciation: pawn·shawn

Meaning: a strong or habitual liking for something or tendency to do something.

Synonyms: liking, fondness, preference

Antonyms: apathy, dislike, distaste

Sentence: She has a penchant for Indian food.

49. FOMENTED (VERB): भड़काना

Pronunciation: fuh·ment·uhd

Meaning: instigate or stir up (an undesirable or violent sentiment or course of action).

Synonyms: instigate, incite, provoke

Antonyms: allay, calm, settle

Sentence: They accused him of fomenting political unrest.

50. RAUCOUS (ADJECTIVE): कर्कश**Pronunciation:** raw·kuhs**Meaning:** making or constituting a disturbingly harsh and loud noise.**Synonyms:** harsh, strident, screeching**Antonyms:** sedate, sober, quiet**Sentence:** I heard the raucous call of the crows.**51. REPOSE (NOUN): विश्राम****Pronunciation:** ruh·poze**Meaning:** a state of rest, sleep, or tranquility.**Synonyms:** rest, relaxation, inactivity**Antonyms:** exertion, labor, toil**Sentence:** The doctor ordered a period of repose for the patient recovering from pneumonia.**52. TUMBLE (VERB): लुढ़क****Pronunciation:** tuhm·bl**Meaning:** (typically of a person) fall suddenly, clumsily, or headlong.**Synonyms:** fall (over), fall down, topple over**Antonyms:** get up, rise, stand (up)**Sentence:** Children tumble over each other in play.**53. JEOPARDIZED (VERB): खतरे में डालना****Pronunciation:** jep·er·dized**Meaning:** put into a situation in which there is a danger of loss, harm, or failure.**Synonyms:** threaten, endanger, imperil**Antonyms:** guarded, protected, sheltered**Sentence:** He jeopardized his life to save the drowning child.**54. CULPABILITY (NOUN): दोषी****Pronunciation:** kuhl·puh·bil·uh·tee**Meaning:** responsibility for a fault or wrong; blame.**Synonyms:** guilt, blame, fault**Antonyms:** blamelessness, guiltlessness, innocence**Sentence:** After the accident, the company refused to accept culpability.**55. FLOUNDERING (VERB): लड़खड़ाना****Pronunciation:** flawn·duh·ruhng**Meaning:** struggle or stagger helplessly or clumsily in water or mud.

Synonyms: barging, clumping, flogging

Antonyms: coasting, gliding, sliding

Sentence: People were floundering about in the water, shouting and screaming.

56. SUBVERSIVE (ADJECTIVE): विनाशक

Pronunciation: suhb·vuhs·uhv

Meaning: seeking or intended to subvert an established system or institution.

Synonyms: disruptive, troublemaking, inflammatory

Antonyms: liberal, progressive

Sentence: A subversive organization determined to unseat a leader who they believed operated outside the law.

57. ENTWINE (VERB): गुथना

Pronunciation: uhn·tvine

Meaning: wind or twist together; interweave.

Synonyms: wind around, twist around, coil around

Antonyms: disentangle, uncoil, entwine

Sentence: All these threads, and more, entwine in the lines of longitude.

58. QUEASY (ADJECTIVE): रोगी

Pronunciation: kvee·zee

Meaning: nauseated; feeling sick.

Synonyms: nauseous, nauseated, bilious

Antonyms: healthy, well

Sentence: The youngster felt a little queasy after eating too much Easter candy.

59. DEPRAVED (ADJECTIVE): भ्रष्ट

Pronunciation: duh·prayvd

Meaning: morally corrupt; wicked.

Synonyms: corrupted, perverted, deviant

Antonyms: virtuous, uncorrupted, honest

Sentence: He thought we were all depraved gamblers.

60. FLAGGED (VERB): कमज़ोर होना

Pronunciation: flagd

Meaning: becoming smaller or weaker.

Synonyms: Abate, Deteriorate

Antonyms: Enhance, Revive

Sentence: The conversation flagged, and the soldiers began settling down to sleep.
