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India's Coastline Length Revised to 11,098.81 km Following Updated Methodology

India's coastline length has been officially revised to 11,098.81 km following the adoption of an updated measurement methodology. This new calculation offers a more accurate representation of the country's coastal boundaries. The revision was carried out using advanced geospatial techniques to ensure precision. It reflects the dynamic nature of coastal features and aims to support better coastal planning and management. The update is significant for environmental, economic, and strategic coastal initiatives in India.

Foot notes:

- The main reason for the deviation from the previous length is the difference in scale and calculation methods.
- The new measurement uses a scale of 1:250,000, capturing more intricate details like bays and inlets, whereas the 1970s data were likely computed at a scale of 1:4,500,000 or smaller.
- The revised length includes the coastline lengths of 1,298 offshore islands/islets (1,059 islands and 239 islets), which were possibly omitted in earlier calculations due to scale constraints.
- Gujarat has the longest coastline among states with 2,340.62 kilometers, while Goa has the shortest with 193.95 kilometers.

India's Exports Hit Record \$824.9 Billion in FY 2024–25

India's exports reached a record high of \$824.9 billion in the fiscal year 2024–25, marking a 6.01% increase over the previous year. This growth was primarily driven by a significant surge in services exports, which rose 13.6% to \$387.5 billion, with strong performances in IT, financial services, and travel sectors . Non-petroleum merchandise exports also contributed, achieving a new peak of \$374.1 billion, up 6% from the previous year . This milestone underscores India's growing role in global trade and the resilience of its export sectors amid challenging global conditions.

- Record-Breaking Exports: India's total exports for FY 2024-25 reached an all-time high of \$824.9 billion, marking a 6.01% growth from the previous year's figure of \$778.1 billion.
- Services Export Growth: Services exports drove the surge, witnessing a double-digit growth of 13.6% to reach \$387.5 billion, up from \$341.1 billion in FY 2023-24.
- Merchandise Exports: Merchandise exports (excluding petroleum) grew 6.0% to \$374.1 billion, up from \$352.9 billion, showcasing India's rising competence in non-oil sectors.
- March 2025 Services Exports: Services exports in March 2025 stood at \$35.6 billion, reflecting an 18.6% growth over March 2024.



• Policy Objectives: The growth in exports aligns with policy initiatives like Atmanirbhar Bharat and Foreign Trade Policy 2023, aiming to position India as a global trade powerhouse.

ITBP Scales Mt. Makalu Historic Feat in Twin Peak Expedition

The Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) achieved a historic milestone by successfully scaling Mount Makalu, the world's fifth-highest peak at 8,485 meters, on April 19, 2025. This ascent marks the first-ever summit of Mt. Makalu by any Central Armed Police Force (CAPF) in India, underscoring ITBP's exceptional high-altitude capabilities. The expedition was part of ITBP's ambitious Twin Peak International Mountaineering Mission, which also included an attempt on Mount Annapurna (8,091 meters). Flagged off from New Delhi on March 21, the 12-member team was led by Deputy Commandant Anoop Kumar Negi and divided into two groups.

Foot notes:

- Mt. Makalu Conquest: The Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) successfully scaled Mt. Makalu, the world's fifth-highest mountain at 8,485 meters, as part of a twin peak expedition. This marks the force's first-ever attempt to summit both Mt. Makalu and Mt. Annapurna.
- High Success Rate: The ITBP team achieved an impressive 83% success rate, with five out of six climbers reaching the summit of Mt. Makalu on April 19, 2025.
- Twin Peak Expedition: The expedition was a historic dual-peak mission that also attempted to climb Mt. Annapurna (8,091 meters), although the team had to retreat 150 meters short of the summit due to adverse weather conditions.
- Environmental Efforts: The ITBP team collected 150 kg of non-biodegradable waste from high-altitude camps, reinforcing their commitment to environmental conservation and the expedition.

India Breaks Records in Mining Production in FY 2024-25

India's mining sector achieved record-breaking production levels in the fiscal year 2024–25, reflecting robust industrial demand and economic growth. Iron ore production reached 289 million metric tonnes (MMT), marking a 4.3% increase from the previous year's 277 MMT. Manganese ore output rose by 11.8% to 3.8 MMT, while bauxite production grew by 2.9% to 24.7 MMT. In the non-ferrous metals segment, primary aluminium production climbed to 42 lakh tonnes (LT), and refined copper output saw a significant 12.6% increase to 5.73 LT. These achievements underscore India's position as the second-largest aluminium producer, among the top ten in refined copper, and the fourth-largest iron ore producer globally.

Foot notes:

• Iron Ore Production: India produced 289 million metric tonnes (MMT) of iron ore, a 4.3% increase from 277 MMT in FY 2023-24, accounting for 70% of total MCDR mineral production by value.



- Non-Ferrous Metal Growth: Primary aluminium production reached 42 lakh tonnes (LT), up from 41.6 LT, while refined copper production surged 12.6% to 5.73 LT from 5.09 LT.
- Global Rankings: India is the world's 4th largest iron ore producer, 2nd largest aluminium producer, and among the top 10 producers of refined copper globally.
- Key Mineral Production: Manganese ore production rose 11.8% to 3.8 MMT, bauxite increased 2.9% to 24.7 MMT, and lead concentrate grew 3.1% to 393 thousand tonnes.
- Economic Impact: The increased output supports core industries like steel, energy, infrastructure, construction, and automotive manufacturing, aligning with the "Make in India" and "Atmanirbhar Bharat" missions.

India Advances to 130th Rank in 2025 Human Development Report

India has advanced to the 130th position out of 193 countries in the 2025 Human Development Index (HDI), as reported by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). This marks a three-place improvement from its 2022 ranking of 133, with India's HDI score increasing from 0.676 to 0.685. The rise is attributed to gains in life expectancy, education, and income, driven by national health programs like Ayushman Bharat and educational reforms such as the Right to Education Act and the National Education Policy 2020.

- Current Ranking: According to the 2023/24 Human Development Report, India's HDI rank is 134 out of 193 countries, not 130. This ranking places India in the medium human development category.
- HDI Value: India's HDI value has increased from 0.633 in 2021 to 0.644 in 2022, indicating progress in human development.
- Improvement in Life Expectancy: Life expectancy at birth in India has risen by 9.1 years since 1990, reaching 67.7 years in 2022.
- Gender Inequality: India has shown progress in reducing gender inequality, with a Gender Inequality Index (GII) value of 0.437, which is better than the global average of 0.462 and the South Asian average of 0.478.

India's Exports to US Hit Record \$11.2 Billion in March

India's exports to the United States reached a record \$11.2 billion in March 2025, marking the first time they surpassed the \$10 billion threshold and representing nearly a 50% increase over the 12-month average. This surge contributed to a total bilateral goods trade of approximately \$15 billion for the month, with India achieving a trade surplus of \$7.4 billion. The spike in exports coincided with a 90-day reciprocal tariff pause announced by U.S. President Donald Trump, which encouraged increased shipments ahead of potential new tariffs. Notably, smartphone exports, particularly Apple iPhones, played a significant role in this growth, with manufacturers expediting shipments to the U.S. before the anticipated tariff changes.



- Record Exports: Although the provided information doesn't confirm if \$11.2 billion is a record for India's exports to the US in March, India's overall merchandise exports in March 2024 reached \$41.68 billion, the highest monthly exports in FY 2023-24.
- Merchandise Exports: India's merchandise exports in March 2024 were \$41.68 billion, slightly lower than \$41.96 billion in March 2023.
- Key Sectors: Main drivers of merchandise export growth in FY 2023-24 include electronic goods, drugs & pharmaceuticals, engineering goods, iron ore, and ceramic products & glassware.
- Non-Petroleum Exports: Non-petroleum and non-gems & jewelry exports in March 2024 were \$33.67 billion, increasing from \$30.87 billion in March 2023.
- Trade Deficit: India's overall trade deficit improved significantly in FY 2023-24, declining by 35.77% to \$78.12 billion, while merchandise trade deficit decreased by 9.33% to \$240.17 billion.

GRSE delivers first anti-submarine warfare shallow water craft to navy

Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers (GRSE) has delivered the Indian Navy's first Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft (ASW SWC), INS Arnala, marking a significant milestone in India's naval modernization efforts. Designed and built indigenously, INS Arnala is the lead ship in a series of eight vessels aimed at enhancing the Navy's capabilities in coastal defense and anti-submarine operations. Measuring 77.6 meters in length and equipped with advanced sonar systems, lightweight torpedoes, and ASW rockets, the vessel is optimized for shallow water missions.

- Delivery of INS Arnala: Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers (GRSE) delivered INS Arnala, the first of eight Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft (ASW-SWC), to the Indian Navy on May 8, 2025.
- Contract Details: The contract for eight ASW-SWC vessels was signed in April 2019, valued at 6,311 crore, with GRSE partnering with Larsen & Toubro (L&T) for fabrication of some hulls.
- Vessel Capabilities: INS Arnala is designed for anti-submarine operations in coastal waters, subsurface surveillance, and coordinated ASW operations with maritime patrol aircraft. It can also lay mines and conduct search-and-rescue missions.
- Indigenous Content: The ASW-SWC vessels have over 80% indigenous content, showcasing India's growing defense manufacturing capabilities.
- Project Timeline: The Indian Navy plans to have all 16 ASW-SWC vessels, being built by GRSE and Cochin Shipyard, in active service by 2026.

India's Ladakh records World's highest snow leopard population

India's Ladakh region has achieved a remarkable feat by recording the world's highest population of snow leopards. This discovery highlights the region's rich biodiversity and its



importance in global wildlife conservation. The survey was conducted using scientific methods, including camera traps and field assessments. Ladakh's harsh climate and rugged terrain provide a perfect natural habitat for these elusive big cats. Conservation efforts by the Indian government and local communities have played a key role in this success.

- Snow Leopard Density: Ladakh has the world's highest recorded density of snow leopards, with approximately 477 animals, accounting for nearly 68% of India's estimated 709 snow leopards.
- Habitat and Distribution: Snow leopards in Ladakh occupy an extensive area of 47,572 square kilometers, with Hemis National Park recording the world's highest snow leopard density of about 2.07 individuals per 100 square kilometers.
- Conservation Factors: The region's success in conservation is attributed to cultural values, good governance, and a healthy prey population, showcasing decades of community-defended protection and a shift from hunting to conservation.
- Coexistence with Humans: Over 60% of Ladakh's snow leopards coexist in landscapes shared with humans, emphasizing the need for inclusive conservation planning, especially in the face of development and climate pressure.

India Ranks Among Top Six Patent Filers in 6G Technology

India has emerged as a significant player in the global race for 6G technology, now ranking among the top six countries in 6G patent filings. This advancement is part of the government's proactive approach under the 'Bharat 6G Vision', aiming to position India at the forefront of 6G design, development, and deployment by 2030. The Department of Telecommunications (DoT) has been instrumental in this progress, funding next-generation testbeds and evaluating numerous proposals to accelerate 6G research. India's goal is to contribute 10% of global 6G patents and one-sixth of the global standards in the next three years. This strategic push is supported by collaborations between the government, academia, and industry leaders, fostering a robust innovation ecosystem.

- Ranking and Potential Impact: India is now among the top six nations globally in 6G patent filings, with the potential to add \$1 trillion to the economy by 2035. This ranking positions India alongside major global players like the US, China, Japan, South Korea, and the European Union.
- Government Support and Funding: The government has funded over 111 research projects with 300 crore to support innovation in 6G technology. Initiatives like "Bharat 6G Vision" and "Bharat 6G Alliance" aim to drive technological innovation and collaboration.
- Research and Development: India is focusing on key areas like spectrum efficiency, AI integration, and quantum communication to develop 6G technology. The country has also established research centers and partnerships with global universities and tech companies.

• Patent Filings and Global Standards: India could secure 10% of all 6G patents globally and contribute one-sixth to global standards within the next three years. The Department of Telecommunications has launched a patent and IPR support framework to encourage inventors and organizations to file patents.

President Murmu Invokes Article 143 Over Governors' Bill Assent Powers

President Droupadi Murmu has invoked Article 143(1) of the Indian Constitution to seek the Supreme Court's advisory opinion on the powers and responsibilities of Governors and the President concerning the assent of state bills. This action follows the Supreme Court's April 8 verdict, which imposed timelines for Governors and the President to act on state legislation, prompting concerns about potential judicial overreach. The Supreme Court's forthcoming opinion, though advisory, is anticipated to have substantial implications for the balance of power within India's federal structure.

- Article 143: Article 143 of the Indian Constitution allows the President to seek the opinion of the Supreme Court on any question of law or fact that is of public importance.
- Purpose: The purpose of Article 143 is to enable the President to obtain the Supreme Court's advisory opinion on matters that are significant and contentious, helping to resolve disputes and provide clarity on constitutional issues.
- Scope: The President can refer any matter to the Supreme Court under Article 143, and the Court is bound to provide its opinion. However, the Court has the discretion to decline to answer questions that are too vague or lack specificity.
- Binding Nature: The Supreme Court's opinion provided under Article 143 is not binding on the President. The President can accept or reject the opinion, although it carries significant weight due to the Court's authoritative interpretation of the Constitution.

Geeta Samota, First CISF Officer to Summit Mount Everest

Geeta Samota, a Sub-Inspector in the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF), made history on May 19, 2025, by becoming the first officer from her force to summit Mount Everest, the world's highest peak at 8,849 meters. Hailing from Chak village in Rajasthan's Sikar district, Samota's journey from a rural upbringing to this monumental achievement is a testament to her determination and resilience. Initially a hockey player, an injury redirected her path towards mountaineering, leading her to join the CISF in 2011 and pursue specialized training in the field.

- First Woman from CAPF to Scale: Mount Satopanth (7,075 meters) in Uttarakhand and Mount Lobuche (6,119 meters) in Nepal in 2019.
- Fastest Indian Woman to Complete Four Continental Peaks: Mount Kosciuszko (Australia), Mount Elbrus (Russia), Mount Kilimanjaro (Tanzania), and Mount Aconcagua (Argentina) in six months and 27 days.



- Scaling Five Peaks in Ladakh's Rupshu Region: She climbed five peaks, including three above 6,000 meters, in just three days.
- Awards and Recognition: Geeta has received the International Women's Day Award 2023 from the Delhi Commission for Women and the Giving Wings to Dreams Award 2023 from the Ministry of Civil Aviation.
- Inspiration and Impact: Geeta's achievement is a source of national pride and inspiration, especially for women in India's paramilitary forces. Her journey showcases the power of perseverance and highlights the growing contribution of Indian women in adventure sports and paramilitary excellence.

India ranked at 36th among 170 countries in Network Readiness Index 2025

India has achieved a significant milestone by ranking 36th out of 170 countries in the Frontier Technologies Readiness Index 2024, marking a notable improvement from its 48th position in 2022. This advancement underscores India's growing capabilities in research and industrial capacity, where it ranks 3rd and 10th respectively. However, challenges persist in areas such as ICT deployment and skills development, with rankings of 99th and 113th, highlighting the need for enhanced broadband infrastructure and formal training in emerging technologies. The country's overall progress reflects its commitment to embracing frontier technologies and fostering innovation.

Anthony Albanese has been re-elected as the Prime Minister of Australia

Anthony Albanese has been re-elected as the Prime Minister of Australia following a decisive electoral victory. His party, the Australian Labor Party, secured a majority, reaffirming public confidence in his leadership. During his previous term, Albanese focused on climate action, healthcare, and strengthening international relations. His re-election campaign emphasized



economic stability and social reforms. Voters responded positively to his vision and governance style. The victory ensures continuity in policy and leadership for Australia in the coming years. **Foot notes:**

On May 3, 2025, Yemen's Presidential Leadership Council appointed Salem Saleh Bin Braik as the country's new Prime Minister, following the resignation of Ahmed Awad bin Mubarak. Bin Mubarak stepped down citing political obstacles, including his inability to implement a cabinet reshuffle due to internal disputes within the council . Bin Braik, who previously served as Finance Minister since 2019, brings extensive experience in financial and administrative roles to his new position . His appointment aims to revitalize the Yemeni government, which has faced paralysis amid ongoing civil conflict and economic challenges. The leadership transition occurs as Yemen continues to grapple with a decade-long civil war, with Houthi rebels controlling significant portions of the country, including the capital, Sanaa .

in post-war German history, Merz failed to secure the required majority in the first round of voting, receiving only 310 out of 316 necessary votes. Merz will head a coalition government formed between his center-right CDU/CSU and the center-left Social Democrats (SPD), aiming to stimulate economic growth through corporate tax cuts and reduced energy prices.

World's first commercial scale e-methanol plant opens in Denmark

Developed by European Energy in collaboration with Japan's Mitsui & Co., the \in 150 million facility is powered by the adjacent 304 MW Kasso Solar Park and utilizes captured biogenic CO₂ to produce up to 42,000 tonnes of e-methanol annually . Major companies like Maersk, LEGO and Novo Nordisk have committed to using this green methanol to reduce their carbon footprints in shipping and manufacturing. The plant's excess heat will provide district heating for approximately 3,300 local households, enhancing its environmental benefits .

- Production Capacity: The facility has the capacity to produce up to 42,000 tonnes of emethanol annually, which will be used as a low-carbon fuel for shipping and as a raw material in the chemical industry.
- Renewable Energy Source: The plant uses renewable energy from a nearby 304 MW solar park to power its electrolysis process, which splits water into hydrogen and oxygen. The hydrogen is then combined with biogenic CO2 to produce e-methanol.
- Off-Takers: The e-methanol will be supplied to companies such as A.P. Moller-Maersk for use as a fuel, and LEGO Group and Novo Nordisk for use in producing lower-carbon plastics.
- Environmental Benefits: The plant will not only produce green fuel but also provide district heating for around 3,300 local households, showcasing a practical and scalable solution for decarbonizing industries



Sussan Ley becomes first female opposition leader in Australia

Sussan Ley has made history by becoming the first woman to lead Australia's Liberal Party and serve as Leader of the Opposition. Elected on May 13, 2025, following Peter Dutton's electoral defeat, Ley narrowly defeated Angus Taylor in a 29–25 leadership ballot . A member of the party's moderate wing, she brings a diverse background as a former commercial pilot, farmer, and economist . Ley has pledged to modernize the party, emphasizing inclusivity and a clear policy agenda that resonates with Australians .

- Historic Achievement: Sussan Ley has made history by becoming the first woman to lead the Liberal Party in its 80-year history and the first female opposition leader in Australia.

Born in Kentville, Nova Scotia, to Indian immigrant parents, Anand has had a distinguished career as a law professor and politician. She previously served as Canada's Minister of National Defence, where she played a key role in addressing military misconduct and supporting Ukraine during the Russian invasion. Anand took her oath of office on the Bhagavad Gita, reflecting her cultural and religious heritage. Anand's leadership is expected to influence Canada's approach to international affairs, including its relations with India and the United States.

- Background: Anand is a lawyer, academic, and politician. She holds four degrees, including a Bachelor of Arts in political studies from Queen's University and a Bachelor of Laws from Dalhousie University.
- Minister of National Defence: She played a central role in Canada's efforts to provide military aid to Ukraine during the 2022 Russian invasion.
- Minister of Public Services and Procurement: Anand oversaw Canada's procurement of vaccines and personal protective equipment during the COVID-19 pandemic.

China Launched 12 AI-Satellites to build World's 1st Supercomputer

China has embarked on an ambitious project to build the world's first space-based AI supercomputer by launching 12 satellites as part of its "Star Compute" initiative. Developed by Chengdu-based ADA Space in collaboration with Zhejiang Lab, these satellites are the initial components of a planned 2,800-satellite constellation designed to process data directly in orbit, thereby reducing reliance on Earth-based data centers. Each satellite is equipped with advanced AI processors capable of 744 tera operations per second (TOPS).

Foot notes:

- Computing Power: Each satellite can process 744 trillion operations per second, with a combined computing power of 5 peta operations per second (POPS) and 30 terabytes of onboard storage. The full constellation aims to achieve 1,000 POPS, equivalent to 1 quintillion operations per second.
- Advanced Features: The satellites are equipped with AI-powered computing systems, high-speed laser communication links, and advanced AI models with 8 billion parameters. They can process raw data directly in orbit, reducing reliance on ground-based computing infrastructure.
- Potential Benefits: The space-based supercomputer could offer a solution to Earth's growing energy and water consumption concerns. Orbital data centers can harness solar power and radiate heat into space, reducing energy needs and carbon footprint.

China's Miao Lijie & Japan's Yuko Oga Named as Ambassadors for FIBA Women's Asia Cup 2025

Chinese basketball legend Miao Lijie and Japanese icon Yuko Oga have been appointed as ambassadors for the FIBA Women's Asia Cup 2025, set to take place in Shenzhen, China, from July 13 to 20. Miao, a three-time Olympian and 2024 FIBA Hall of Fame inductee, led China to four Asia Cup titles and holds the distinction of being the first Chinese player to win both WCBA and WNBA championships. Oga, inducted into the FIBA Hall of Fame in 2023, was Japan's dynamic point guard for over a decade, earning multiple medals and becoming the top scorer at the 2010 FIBA Women's Basketball World Cup.

- Ambassadors: Miao Lijie from China and Yuko Oga from Japan have been appointed as ambassadors for the FIBA Women's Asia Cup 2025.
- Event Details: The FIBA Women's Asia Cup 2025 is scheduled to take place from July 13 to 20, 2025.

USA Became India's 4th Largest Crude Oil Supplier

The United States became India's fourth-largest crude oil supplier, overtaking the United Arab Emirates. India's imports of U.S. crude oil nearly doubled year-over-year, reaching 0.33 million barrels per day, up from 0.17 million barrels per day in April 2024. This increase is attributed to a decline in U.S. exports to Europe and refinery closures, redirecting supplies toward Asia, particularly India. Despite this shift, Russia remains India's top crude oil supplier, accounting for 37.8% of imports, followed by Iraq and Saudi Arabia. The growing energy trade between India and the U.S. reflects India's efforts to diversify its energy sources and strengthen bilateral relations.

Foot notes:

- Increased Supply: The US nearly doubled its crude oil supply to India in April, reaching 0.33 million barrels per day, and surpassing the UAE to become India's fourth-largest supplier.
- Market Share: The US achieved a 7.3% share of India's crude imports in April, exceeding the UAE's 6.4% share. Russia maintained its top position with a 37.8% share, followed by Iraq (19.1%), and Saudi Arabia (10.4%).
- Reason for Growth: The growth in US crude oil exports to India is attributed to slowing US exports to Europe, prompting a shift towards Asian markets. India's private sector refineries, operated by Reliance Industries and Nayara Energy, are the primary recipients of US crude oil.

India assumes Chairmanship of Asian Productivity Organization for 2025-26

India has officially assumed the chairmanship of the Asian Productivity Organization (APO) for the 2025–26 term, as announced by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry. The handover took place during a meeting in Jakarta, Indonesia, marking a significant milestone in India's efforts to enhance regional productivity. This leadership role enables India to influence regional productivity strategies, foster cooperation among Asia-Pacific member countries, and promote sustainable socio-economic development through productivity growth. India's active participation in APO initiatives underscores its commitment to driving productivity and sustainable development in the region.

Under his guidance, the Nuggets pushed the top-seeded Oklahoma City Thunder to a seven-game series in the Western Conference semifinals, earning praise from players like Nikola Jokic and Aaron Gordon for his leadership and communication style.

This strategic move also reflects Algeria's broader ambition to diversify its international partnerships and reduce reliance on Western-dominated financial institutions like the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank.

- Membership Approval: Algeria deposited its instrument of accession on May 19, 2025, officially becoming the newest member of the NDB, a multilateral development bank established by BRICS nations (Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa).

World largest aerospace-grade titanium unit inaugurated in Lucknow

On May 12, 2025, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath inaugurated the world's largest aerospace-grade titanium and superalloy materials



manufacturing plant in Lucknow. Operated by Aerolloy Technologies Limited, a subsidiary of PTC Industries, this state-of-the-art facility features a German-engineered Vacuum Arc Remelting (VAR) furnace with an annual capacity of 1,500 metric tons, capable of producing titanium alloy ingots up to 1,000 mm in diameter. This development positions India among an elite group of nations—such as the United States, Russia, China, France, and the United Kingdom—that possess the capability to produce high-grade titanium alloys for aerospace applications.

- Advanced Technologies: The plant utilizes cutting-edge technologies like Vacuum Arc Remelting (VAR), Electron Beam (EB), Plasma Arc Melting (PAM), and Vacuum Induction Melting (VIM) to produce high-grade materials critical for aerospace and defense sectors.

University of York to Open Its First Indian Campus in Mumbai

The University of York, a prestigious UK-based Russell Group institution, has announced plans to establish its first overseas campus in Mumbai, India. This initiative follows the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding with the Maharashtra government and discussions between Vice-Chancellor Professor Charlie Jeffery and Prime Minister Narendra Modi during the WAVES Summit in Mumbai. The Mumbai campus is set to commence operations in the 2026/27 academic year, initially offering undergraduate and postgraduate programs in computer science with AI and cybersecurity, business, economics, and creative industries.

- Location and Start Date: The University of York's first Indian campus will be located in Mumbai and is expected to welcome students from the academic year 2026/27.
- Licensing and Accreditation: The university is working on obtaining the necessary license from the University Grants Commission (UGC) in India to develop the campus.

Rajasthan to join India's first cheetah conservation corridor with MP

Rajasthan is set to join India's first interstate cheetah conservation corridor in collaboration with Madhya Pradesh, aiming to facilitate the natural movement of cheetahs between the two states. This initiative follows instances where cheetahs from Madhya Pradesh's Kuno National Park strayed into Rajasthan, highlighting the need for coordinated management. A joint corridor



management committee has been established, comprising senior forest officials from both states, to oversee the development of suitable habitats and the drafting of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for corridor development.

- Area Coverage: Madhya Pradesh will cover 10,500 square kilometers, while Rajasthan will cover 6,500 square kilometers of the corridor area.

The Indian Institute of Foreign Trade (IIFT) is set to establish a new international campus at Gujarat International Finance Tec-City (GIFT City) in Gandhinagar, following approval from the Ministry of Education. This initiative aligns with the government's vision to internationalize higher education and position GIFT City as a hub for global academic institutions. Union Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal has advocated for the establishment of this campus, emphasizing the importance of equipping Indian students with global competencies in trade and finance.

Indore Becomes the India's First Beggar- Free City

Indore has been officially declared India's first beggar-free city following a comprehensive rehabilitation campaign launched in February 2024. The initiative successfully identified and rehabilitated approximately 5,000 individuals engaged in begging, providing them with employment opportunities and enrolling their children in schools. The success of this campaign not only enhances Indore's reputation for cleanliness but also demonstrates the impact of coordinated social welfare efforts in addressing urban challenges.

Foot notes:

- Achievement: Indore has been declared India's first beggar-free city after a year-long campaign that began in February 2024, rehabilitating approximately 5,000 beggars.
- Rehabilitation Process: The campaign categorized beggars into three groups: habitual beggars (60%), those begging due to financial difficulties or disabilities (20%), and those forced into begging (20%), providing tailored support for each group.
- Community Involvement: The initiative involved community engagement, especially with communities like the Nath and Nut Samaj, who often resist rehabilitation. Training and support were provided directly within these communities to build trust.
- Government and Institutional Support: The campaign received extensive support from government bodies, including the Union Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment and the World Bank, which praised Indore's initiative as a model for other cities.
- Sustainability Measures: To maintain the city's beggar-free status, begging and giving alms are banned, with penalties for violations. Citizens are incentivized to report instances of begging with a reward of Rs 1,000, and many have already claimed this reward.

Telangana is the first state to launch AI-based 'AgriGPT' service

Telangana has become the first state in India to launch an AI-based agricultural advisory service called 'AgriGPT'. This initiative is part of the state's broader efforts to integrate artificial intelligence into agriculture, aiming to provide farmers with real-time, personalized advice on



crop management, weather forecasts, pest control, and market trends. Developed in collaboration with the World Economic Forum and the Indian Institute of Science, AgriGPT leverages data from various sources to offer actionable insights to farmers. The service is accessible through a user-friendly interface, ensuring that even farmers with limited technological proficiency can benefit from its features.

Archaeological Survey of India restores 16th CE stepwell in Delhi's Mehrauli

The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI), in collaboration with the World Monuments Fund and funded by the TCS Foundation, has completed the restoration of Rajon Ki Baoli, a 16thcentury stepwell located in Delhi's Mehrauli Archaeological Park. Built in 1506 during the reign of Sikandar Lodi, this four-tiered structure had suffered from decades of neglect, with silt and debris obstructing its water channels. The comprehensive six-month project involved desilting, structural repairs, restoration of decorative elements, and the installation of an automated water management system to maintain water quality and levels . This restoration is part of a broader initiative to rejuvenate Mehrauli Archaeological Park, which houses over 55 monuments spanning various historical periods .

Rohit Sharma retires from Test Cricket

Rohit Sharma, India's Test captain, has announced his retirement from Test cricket at the age of 38, effective immediately. This decision follows the selectors' move to replace him as captain ahead of the upcoming England tour, after a period of declining form that saw him average just 10.93 over the past year. Sharma's Test career spanned 67 matches, during which he amassed 4,301 runs at an average of 40.57, including 12 centuries. Despite stepping away from the longest format, he will continue to represent India in One-Day Internationals, aiming to contribute to the team's success in the 2027 World Cup. The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) acknowledged his contributions, calling it the end of an era.

This victory marks Sabalenka's 20th career WTA singles title and her third WTA 1000 title of the year, equaling Petra Kvitová's record for the most Madrid Open titles in the tournament's history. Sabalenka showcased her dominance by taking an early lead in the first set and overcoming a 3–5 deficit in the second to win the tiebreak. With this win, Sabalenka improved her 2025 record against top-10 players to 6–0, solidifying her position at the pinnacle of women's tennis.

Parth clinched his maiden World Cup medal by defeating France's Baptiste Addis 6-4, showcasing composure in a tightly contested match. These achievements contributed to India's impressive total of seven medals at the event, comprising two golds, one silver, and four bronzes. The medal haul highlights the strength and depth of India's archery talent on the global stage.

The Indian duo edged out Turkey's Tolga Tuncer and Pelin Kaya with a narrow 34-33 victory in the bronze-medal match at the Cyprus Olympic Shooting Range. In the qualification round, they secured fourth place among 34 teams, amassing a combined score of 142—Sabeera contributing 72 and Kynan 70. This bronze marks India's first medal at the tournament, with China taking gold and Poland securing silver in the event. The second Indian pair, Shardul Vihan and Kirti Gupta, finished 17th with a score of 137. Kynan and Sabeera's podium finish underscores India's growing prowess in international shooting competitions.

Kohli's Test career boasts 123 matches, during which he amassed 9,230 runs at an average of 46.85, including 30 centuries and 31 fifties. He served as India's Test captain from 2014 to 2022, leading the team to 40 victories in 68 matches, making him the most successful Indian Test captain and placing him fourth globally for most Test wins as captain .Kohli's retirement marks the end of an era for Indian cricket, as he follows closely on the heels of Rohit Sharma's departure from the format.

- Career Statistics: Kohli played 113 Test matches, scoring 9,230 runs at an average of 48.67, including 30 centuries and 31 fifties. His highest score was an unbeaten 254 against South Africa in Pune.

This tri-series, featuring India, Sri Lanka, and South Africa, served as a crucial preparation ahead of the upcoming Women's Cricket World Cup.

This substantial financial boost underscores the ICC's commitment to revitalizing interest in the longest format of the game.

Jasmine Paolini made history by becoming the first Italian woman in 40 years to win the Italian Open, defeating Coco Gauff 6–4, 6–2 in the final at Rome's Foro Italico . The 29-year-old showcased exceptional tactical play and composure, capitalizing on Gauff's 55 unforced errors and seven double faults to secure the title in just 89 minutes . This victory marks Paolini's second WTA 1000 title and propels her into the top four of the WTA rankings, solidifying her status as a leading contender on clay courts . Paolini's win not only ends a four-decade wait for an Italian champion in Rome but also highlights the resurgence of Italian tennis on the global stage .

- Historic Victory: Jasmine Paolini defeated Coco Gauff 6-4, 6-2 in the Italian Open final, becoming the first Italian woman to win the tournament in 40 years, since Raffaella Reggi in 1985.
- Impressive Performance: Paolini dominated the match, converting five of seven break points and producing 12 winners, while Gauff struggled with 55 unforced errors and double faults.

She defeated higher-ranked opponents with ease, reinforcing her status as India's top female paddler. Her aggressive playing style and precision shots drew praise from both fans and experts. Batra's win not only boosted her individual ranking but also brought attention to India's growing strength in international table tennis. Her success serves as an inspiration for young players across the country.

Although the tailwind exceeded the legal limit for record purposes, the performance underscored Simbine's dominance on the track. This victory adds to his undefeated streak this year, which includes wins at two Diamond League events and a bronze medal at the World Indoor Championships. Simbine also anchored South Africa's 4x100m relay team to a historic gold at the World Relays in Guangzhou.

- Wind-Aided Victory: Akani Simbine won the 100m dash with a wind-aided time of 9.86 seconds, showcasing his exceptional speed and skill.
- Historic Achievement: Simbine's win marks a historic milestone, as he becomes the first athlete to run sub-10 seconds in the 100m for 11 consecutive years, breaking Usain Bolt's record.

This triumph marks Alcaraz's seventh Masters 1000 title and 19th career title, solidifying his reputation as a formidable force on clay courts. With this victory, Alcaraz ascends to World No. 2 and emerges as a leading contender for the upcoming French Open.

The Games feature over 1,350 athletes from more than 30 states and Union Territories, competing in six medal events: beach soccer, beach volleyball, beach kabaddi, beach sepak takraw, pencak silat, and open water swimming .

- Participating Athletes: Over 1,000 athletes from 36 states and union territories are participating in the games, competing in six medal events: beach soccer, beach volleyball, beach kabaddi, beach sepak takraw, pencak silat, and open water swimming.
- Demonstration Sports: In addition to the medal events, two demonstration sports mallakhamb and tug-of-war - are also being featured during the games, showcasing India's rich sporting diversity.



- Objective: The Khelo India Beach Games aim to boost the popularity and reach of beachbased disciplines, promoting sports competition and talent development across the country. Prime Minister Modi described the event as a watershed moment in India's sporting history.
- Duration and Venue: The games are being held at Ghoghla Beach in Diu from May 19 to 24, 2025, and feature teams from across the country, with coastal teams like Goa and Gujarat already making their presence felt in the competitions.

India's Adriyan Karmakar Bags Silver Medal At ISSF Junior World Cup

Adriyan Karmakar, a 20-year-old Indian shooter and son of Olympian Joydeep Karmakar, made a remarkable debut at the ISSF Junior World Cup in Suhl, Germany, by clinching a silver medal in the men's 50m rifle prone event. He achieved a score of 626.7, narrowly missing the gold by just 0.3 points to Sweden's Jesper Johansson, who scored 627.0. This performance not only marked India's first medal at the tournament but also set a new junior national record in the event. His success continues the legacy of his father and underscores the rising prominence of Indian shooters on the global stage.

She achieved a score of 239.0 in the 24-shot final, surpassing Moldova's two-time Olympian and reigning European champion, Anna Dulce, by 1.7 points. Kanak's victory was marked by a strong finish, including a crucial 10.5 shot that propelled her into the lead, followed by a series of high-scoring shots that solidified her top position. This triumph adds to her previous accomplishments, including a silver medal at the Junior World Championships in Lima last year.

- Opponent: She defeated Anna Dulce, a two-time Olympian and reigning European champion from Moldova, by a margin of 1.7 points.
- Performance: Kanak showed remarkable composure in the final stages, hitting crucial high-scoring shots, including three high 10s and a 10.1, to secure the gold medal.
- Qualification: Kanak and fellow Indian shooter Prachi qualified for the final with scores of 572 and 571, respectively. While Prachi finished fifth, Kanak's consistent performance earned her the top spot.

India's Raiza Dhillon secured a silver medal in the ISSF Junior World Cup 2025

Indian skeet shooter Raiza Dhillon clinched a silver medal at the 2025 ISSF Junior World Cup in Suhl, Germany, marking a significant milestone in her shooting career. In the women's skeet final, Dhillon hit 51 out of 60 targets, finishing just behind Great Britain's Phoebe Bodley-Scott, who secured gold with 53 hits . This achievement is particularly noteworthy as it represents Dhillon's first individual ISSF World Cup medal at any level, achieved during her final year as a junior competitor . Earlier in the competition, she advanced to the final after a tense three-way shoot-off in the qualifiers, where she posted a score of 116 .

With Idris at the helm, Sudan aims to initiate peace talks, boost economic recovery, and foster international cooperation.

- Background of Kamil Idris: Idris is a respected legal expert and diplomat who has served as Sudan's legal adviser at the UN mission and is a member of the UN International Law Commission. His neutral and non-partisan stance is expected to improve acceptance across factions.
- Objectives: The appointment aims to form a transitional government that may lead to elections and civilian rule, restore political legitimacy domestically and internationally, and serve as a counter to the RSF's Nairobi charter.
- Humanitarian Crisis: The conflict has resulted in a devastating humanitarian crisis, with over 20,000 deaths reported, 13 million displaced, and 4 million refugees fleeing to neighboring countries. Half of Sudan's 50 million population faces severe hunger and food insecurity.

affiliations could increase his acceptance among various Sudanese communities, including RSF supporters.

Justice Kempaiah Somashekar has been appointed as the Chief Justice of the Manipur High Court, effective May 22, 2025. His appointment follows the retirement of Justice D. Krishnakumar on May 21, 2025. Justice Somashekar began his legal career in 1990 and was directly appointed as a District and Sessions Judge in 1998. He served in various capacities, including as Registrar Judicial and Registrar Vigilance at the Karnataka High Court, before being elevated to the High Court bench as an Additional Judge in 2016 and becoming a Permanent Judge in 2018.

La Prensa, Nicaragua's oldest newspaper, has been awarded the 2025 UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize for its unwavering commitment to independent journalism despite severe government repression. Since 2021, the newspaper has operated in exile after its offices were raided, assets seized, and its general manager, Juan Lorenzo Holmann, imprisoned by the Ortega regime. UNESCO Director-General Audrey Azoulay expressed regret over Nicaragua's decision, reaffirming the agency's commitment to press freedom and the importance of supporting courageous journalism worldwide.

- Award Recipient: La Prensa, a Nicaraguan newspaper founded in 1926, has been awarded the UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize 2025 for its courageous efforts to report the truth despite severe repression.

Through his Sood Charity Foundation, he facilitated transportation for stranded individuals, distributed medical aid, and launched initiatives like free education and employment training programs. In addition to receiving the award, Sood will serve as one of the official judges for the grand finale, joining a distinguished panel to crown the next Miss World. **Foot notes:**

This project aims to harness Bhutan's vast hydro potential, contributing to sustainable energy production and strengthening bilateral ties between the Adani Group and Bhutan. The hydroelectric plant is expected to supply power domestically and export surplus electricity to India, enhancing energy cooperation between the two countries. **Foot notes:**

- The MoU is for a 570 MW green hydroelectric power plant, not 5000 MW, in Chukha province, Bhutan.
- Partnership Details: Adani Group signed the MoU with Bhutan's Druk Green Power Corporation (DGPC) to develop the hydroelectric facility, aligning with Bhutan's goal of sustainable development.

C-DOT, CSIR-NPL partner to boost quantum, classical communication tech

The Centre for Development of Telematics (C-DOT) and the Physical Research Laboratory (PRL) have achieved a significant milestone by integrating C-DOT's indigenous fiber-based Quantum Key Distribution (QKD) system with PRL's Free Space QKD system. This collaboration has resulted in the establishment of an end-to-end quantum communication link that utilizes both fiber and free space as transport mediums. The demonstration of this integrated system was presented to Prof. Ajay Sood, Principal Scientific Adviser to the Government of India, and Dr. Neeraj Mittal, Secretary of the Department of Telecommunications, during the 2nd International Quantum Communication Conclave held at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi.

World Press Freedom observed on 03rd May

World Press Freedom Day is observed annually on May 3 to celebrate the fundamental principles of press freedom, evaluate its state worldwide, and honor journalists who have lost their lives in the line of duty. Established by the United Nations General Assembly in 1993, the day commemorates the adoption of the Windhoek Declaration, which laid the foundation for a free, independent, and pluralistic press. The 2025 theme, "Reporting in the Brave New World: The Impact of Artificial Intelligence on Press Freedom and the Media," focuses on how AI



affects press freedom, the free flow of information, media independence, and the global goal of ensuring access to information for all .

Foot notes:

- History: The day was declared by the United Nations General Assembly in 1993, inspired by the Windhoek Declaration of 1991, which advocated for a free, independent, and pluralistic press.
- Theme: The 2025 theme is "Reporting in the Brave New World: The Impact of Artificial Intelligence on Press Freedom and the Media," highlighting the challenges journalists face with AI-generated content and digital disinformation.

Organized annually by the Global Initiative for Asthma (GINA), this day aims to raise awareness about asthma management and the importance of accessible treatment options . In India, where asthma-related deaths account for over 15% of the global total, health experts emphasized the critical need for improved access to inhaled medications, especially in rural and low-income areas . The Vidarbha Chest Association (VCA) in Nagpur advocated for universal access to affordable asthma care, noting that despite the availability of effective treatments, many individuals remain deprived of essential care.

- Global Significance: This day aims to raise awareness about asthma, promote early diagnosis and treatment, advocate for access to essential medications, and educate the public on asthma management strategies.
- Asthma Impact: Over 260 million people worldwide live with asthma, which can cause recurring episodes of breathlessness, wheezing, chest tightness, and coughing, with approximately 455,000 deaths globally in 2019.
- Importance of Inhaled Treatments: Inhaled medications like short-acting bronchodilators and inhaled corticosteroids provide direct delivery to the lungs, minimizing systemic side effects and improving long-term outcomes in asthma management.
- Global Initiatives: World Asthma Day is marked by public engagement events, including free asthma screening clinics, inhaler education sessions, awareness walks, and digital campaigns to strengthen community knowledge and encourage timely treatment.

World Athletics Day observed on 07th May

the war, she emigrated to the United States, where she lived for over six decades with her husband, Adolf Friedländer, another Holocaust survivor. In 2010, at the age of 88, she returned to Berlin and dedicated her life to Holocaust education, speaking to German youth about her experiences and advocating against antisemitism and racism. Her memoir, Try to Make Your Life, published in 2008, encapsulated her mother's final words and her journey of survival and resilience.

Preliminary investigations suggest the possibility of suicide, though authorities have not ruled out other causes, and a post-mortem examination is underway.

- Renowned Scientist: Dr. Subbanna Ayyappan was a distinguished aquaculture scientist who played a pivotal role in India's Blue Revolution, advancing fisheries science and aquaculture development.
- Investigation: Preliminary investigations suggest that he may have died by suicide, but authorities are still investigating the exact cause of death.
- Career Highlights: Dr. Ayyappan held several key positions, including Director-General of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) and Secretary of the Department of Agricultural Research and Education (DARE).

Former Atomic Energy Commission Chairman M.R. Srinivasan passed away

Veteran nuclear scientist and former Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission, Dr. M.R. Srinivasan, passed away at the age of 95 on May 20, 2025, in Ooty, Tamil Nadu. A pivotal figure in India's nuclear energy development, he began his career in 1955 with the Department of Atomic Energy, working closely with Dr. Homi Bhabha on the nation's first nuclear research reactor, Apsara, which achieved criticality in 1956. As the founding Director General of the National Council of Science Museums (NCSM) from 1979 to 1997, he was instrumental in establishing a nationwide network of interactive science centers, including the Science City in Kolkata, the National Science Centre in New Delhi, and the Nehru Science Centre in Mumbai. Dr. Ghose introduced the concept of Mobile Science Museums to bring science education to remote areas and played a pivotal role in modernizing India's museology landscape.

- Pioneering Work: Dr. Ghose was a pioneer in science communication and popularization, transforming the way science is presented to the public through interactive exhibits and museums.
- National Council of Science Museums (NCSM): He served as the Director General of NCSM from 1979 to 1997, establishing a network of science centers across India, including the Nehru Science Centre in Mumbai and the National Science Centre in New Delhi.
- Awards and Recognition: Dr. Ghose received several prestigious awards, including the Padma Bhushan (2007) and Padma Shri (1989) for his contributions to science popularization.
- International Impact: He was a globally recognized figure, serving as President of the International Council of Museums (ICOM) and leading international exhibitions like "India: A Heritage of Science," which showcased India's scientific achievements worldwide.



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
