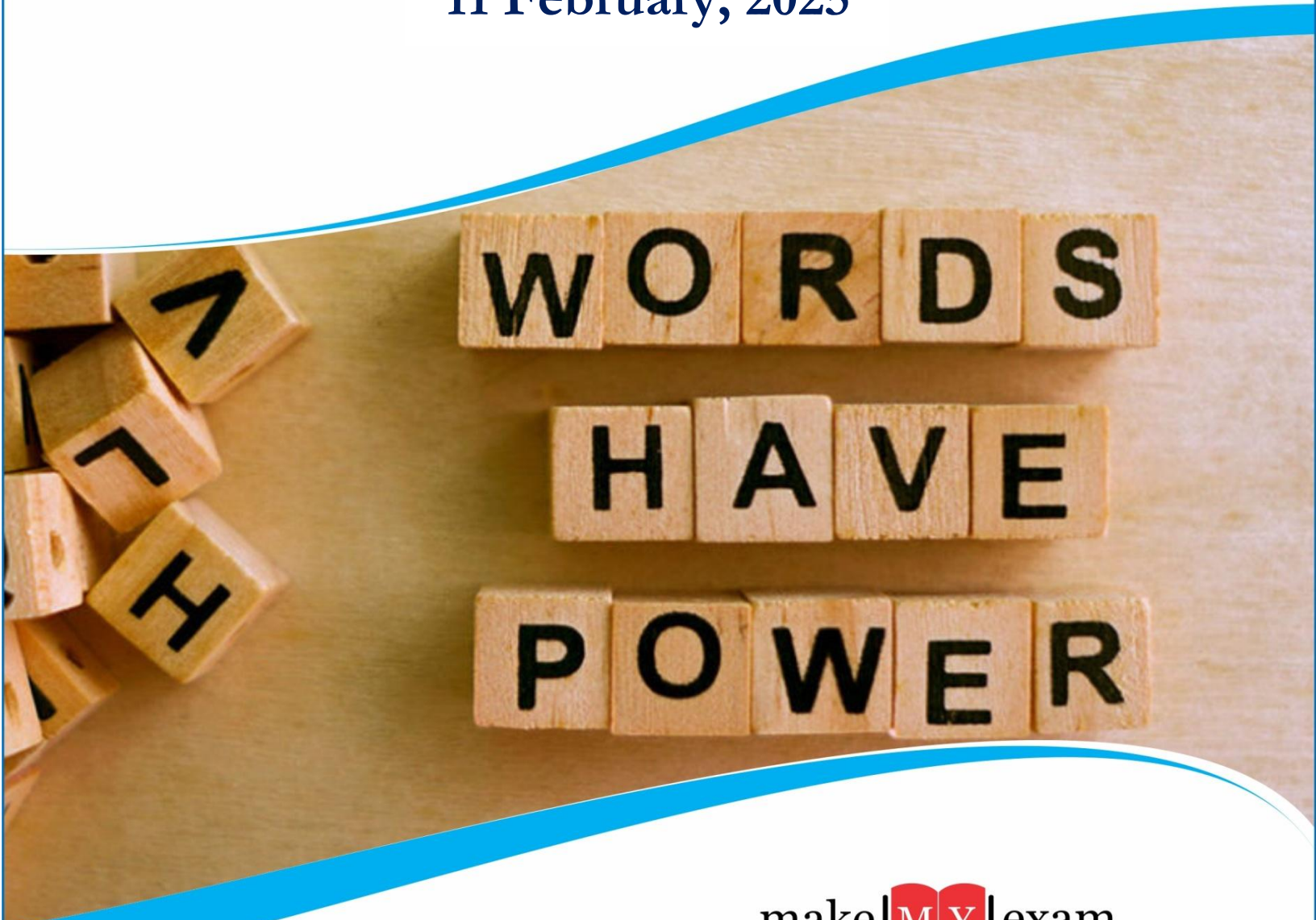


# DAILY VOCAB DOSE

### 1. THRIVE (VERB): फलना-फूलना

**Pronunciation:** thrive

**Meaning:** to grow or develop well

**Synonyms:** prosper, burgeon, root

**Antonyms:** decline, fail, struggle

**Sentence:** Education groups thrive on organization.

### 2. MORIBUND (ADJECTIVE): मरणासन्न

**Pronunciation:** maw·ruh·buhnd

**Meaning:** in a very bad condition; dying

**Synonyms:** expiring, at death's door, near the end

**Antonyms:** alive, live, quick

**Sentence:** On examination she was moribund and dehydrated.

### 3. RECONCILE (VERB): मेल मिलाप

**Pronunciation:** ri·kuhn·sile

**Meaning:** to find a way of dealing with two ideas, situations, statements, etc. that seem to be opposite to each other.

**Synonyms:** combine, adapt, align

**Antonyms:** upset, confuse, skew

**Sentence:** He sought my advice on how to reconcile the conflict.

### 4. FABLED (ADJECTIVE): झूठा

**Pronunciation:** fay·bld

**Meaning:** famous, especially by reputation.

**Synonyms:** mythical, mythic, famed

**Antonyms:** real, actual, true

**Sentence:** The movie mentioned the fabled Arendelle kingdom.

### 5. DENT (VERB): काटने का निशान

**Pronunciation:** dent

**Meaning:** a place where a flat surface, especially metal, has been hit and damaged but not broken.

**Synonyms:** hole, pit, cavity

**Antonyms:** projection, hill, rise

**Sentence:** This neither deterred him nor dented his enthusiasm.

### 6. CONVALESCE (VERB): अच्छा हो जाना

**Pronunciation:** kaw·n·vuh·les

**Meaning:** to rest and get better over a period of time after an illness.

**Synonyms:** recover, improve, get better

**Antonyms:** deteriorate, fail, worsen

**Sentence:** He spent eight months convalescing after the stroke.

### 7. IMPOVERISH (VERB): शक्तिहीन करना

**Pronunciation:** uhm·paw·vuh·ruhsh

**Meaning:** to make somebody/something poor or lower in quality.

**Synonyms:** ruin, beggar, bust

**Antonyms:** strengthen, richen, enrich

**Sentence:** The soil was impoverished by burning.

### 8. REPUDIATE (VERB): परित्याग करना

**Pronunciation:** ruh·pyoo·dee·ayt

**Meaning:** to say that you refuse to accept or believe something.

**Synonyms:** renounce, abandon, give up

**Antonyms:** embrace, admit, allow

**Sentence:** She has repudiated policies associated with previous party leaders.

### 9. VAGUELY (ADVERB): थोड़ा

**Pronunciation:** vayg·lee

**Meaning:** in a way that is not clear; slightly.

**Synonyms:** more or less, approximately, nearly

**Antonyms:** exactly, highly, very

**Sentence:** She vaguely remembered talking to him once.

### 10. UNBRIDLED (ADJECTIVE): निरंकुश

**Pronunciation:** uhn·brai·dld

**Meaning:** not controlled and therefore extreme.

**Synonyms:** unconstrained uncontrolled, rampant

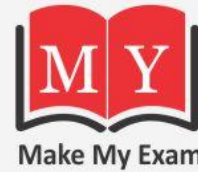
**Antonyms:** restrained, controlled, governed

**Sentence:** I felt a moment of unbridled ambition.

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
