

1. GLEANED (verb) : से प्राप्त

Pronunciation: gleend

Meaning: extract (information) from various sources.

Synonyms: obtain, get, take

Antonyms: dug, extirpated, picked

Sentence: What do you glean from the news?

2.SURREAL (adj.): अवास्तविक

Pronunciation: suh-reel

Meaning: having the qualities of surrealism; bizarre.

Synonyms: unreal, bizarre, unusual

Antonyms: certain, sure, true

Sentence: The whole situation was completely <u>surreal</u>.

3. IDYLLIC (adj.) : सुखद जीवन का

Pronunciation: uh·dil·uhk

Meaning: (especially of a time or place) like an idyll; extremely happy, peaceful, or

picturesque.

Synonyms: perfect, ideal, idealized **Antonyms:** imperfect, amiss, flawed

Sentence: It appears to be an <u>idyllic</u> domestic setup.

4. SHRUG (verb) : कंधे उचकाने की क्रिया

Pronunciation: shruhg

Meaning: raise (one's shoulders) slightly and momentarily to express doubt, ignorance, or

indifference.

Synonyms: action, bow, curtsy.

Antonyms: repose, rest.

Sentence: "I suppose so," said Anna with a shrug.

5. INQUIRINGLY (adv.) : जाँचते

Pronunciation: in quire ingly **Meaning:** to search through or into

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Synonyms: examine, inspect, study

Antonyms: disinterested, incurious, unskeptical.

Sentence: Victor looked at her <u>inquiringly</u>.

6. MUSHY (adj.) : भावुक

Pronunciation: muhsh-ee

Meaning: excessively sentimental.

Synonyms: sentimental, mawkish, emotional

Antonyms: unsentimental, hard-edged

Sentence: Don't go getting all <u>mushy</u> and sentimental.

7. IMPINGING (verb) : प्रभाव पडना

Pronunciation: uhm·pinj·uhng

Meaning: have an effect or impact, especially a negative one.

Synonyms: banging, bashing, bumping

Antonyms: missing, skirting

Sentence: Nora was determined that the tragedy would <u>impinge</u> as little as possible on

Constance's life.

8. INDUCEMENT (noun) : प्रलोभन

Pronunciation: uhn·dyoos·muhnt

Meaning: a thing that persuades or influences someone to do something.

Synonyms: incentive, attraction, encouragement

Antonym: deterrent

Sentence: The higher payments were offered as an <u>inducement</u>.

9. DE FACTO (adj.) : वास्तव में

Pronunciation: de fac·to

Meaning: denoting someone or something that is such in fact.

Synonyms: actual, existing, existent

Antonyms: conjectural, hypothetical, nonexistent

Sentence: The island has been <u>de facto</u> divided into two countries.

10. IRRETRIEVABLY (adv.) : अपूर्य

Pronunciation: i.ruh.treev.uh.blee

Meaning: in a way that cannot be retrieved or put right.


Synonyms: incorrigible, incurable, irrecoverable

Antonyms: curable, reversible, recoverable

Sentence: Some of our old traditions are <u>irretrievably</u> lost.
