

1. ELUDE (verb) : टलना

Pronunciation: uh·lood

Meaning: evade or escape from (a danger, enemy, or pursuer), typically in a skillful or

cunning way.

Synonyms: evade, avoid, dodge **Antonyms:** catch, embrace, pursue

Sentence: He managed to elude his pursuers by escaping into an alley.

2. PERTAINED (verb) : संबंधित

Pronunciation: puh-taynd

Meaning: be appropriate, related, or applicable.

Synonyms: concern, relate to, involve

Antonyms: irrelevant, irrelative

Sentence: Your questions should <u>pertain</u> directly to the discussion topic.

3. INCONSOLABLE (adj.) : गमगीन

Pronunciation: in kuhn sole uh bl

Meaning: (of a person or their grief) not able to be comforted or alleviated.

Synonyms: heartbroken, devastated, miserable

Antonyms: blissful, buoyant, cheerful

Sentence: The old man's grief was agonizing and <u>inconsolable</u>.

4. AGILE (adj.) : चुस्त

Pronunciation: uh.jile

Meaning: able to move quickly and easily.

Synonyms: nimble, lithe, spry

Antonyms: clumsy, gawky, graceless **Sentence:** He was as <u>agile</u> as a monkey.

5. ASSESS (verb) : आकलन

Pronunciation: a · suhs

Meaning: evaluate or estimate the nature, ability, or quality of.

Synonyms: evaluate, judge, gauge

Antonyms: ignore, neglect

Sentence: The committee must <u>assess</u> the relative importance of the issues.

6. AMBIT (noun) : सीमा

Pronunciation: am·buht

Meaning: the scope, extent, or bounds of something.

Synonyms: scope, extent, bounds

Antonyms: center, central core, central location

Sentence: Her case falls within the <u>ambit</u> of moral law.

7. ENSNARE (verb) : फ्सलाना

Pronunciation: uhn · sneuh

Meaning: catch in or as in a trap. Synonyms: capture, catch, seize Antonyms: clear, free, liberate

Sentence: Spiders ensnare flies and other insects in their webs.

8. INTRICATE (adj.) : जटिल

Pronunciation: in truh kuht

Meaning: very complicated or detailed.

Synonyms: complex, complicated, convoluted

Antonyms: plain, simple, uncomplicated

Sentence: Police officers uncovered an intricate web of deceit.

9. DOLEFUL (adj.): मातमी

Pronunciation: dole-ful

Meaning: expressing sorrow; mournful. **Synonyms:** mournful, woeful, sorrowful

Antonyms: happy, joyful, blissful

Sentence: As soon as I saw the doctor's <u>doleful</u> expression, I knew my father's condition

was not good.

10. INSOLENT (adj.) : बदतमीज

Pronunciation: in suh luhnt


Meaning: showing a rude and arrogant lack of respect.

Synonyms: impertinent, impudent, cheeky **Antonyms:** meek, humble, respectful

Sentence: She hated the <u>insolent</u> tone of his voice.
