

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Exceptional words of English vocabulary from the newspaper 'The Hindu' are listed here. 1. STRAGGLING (verb) - पिछड़ गया

Pronunciation: stra-guh-luhng

Meaning: move along slowly, typically in a small irregular group, so as to remain some

distance behind the person or people in front.

Synonyms: trail, amble, dawdle **Antonyms:** hustler, scrambler

Sentence: Her hair was straggling over her eyes.

2. DISSEMINATE (verb) - प्रसार

Pronunciation: duh-seh-muh-nayt

Meaning: spread (something, especially information) widely.

Synonyms: spread, circulate, distribute **Antonyms:** cloak, conceal, enshroud

Sentence: The agency would collect and <u>disseminate</u> information.

3. CHURLISH (adj) – अशिष्ट

Pronunciation: chur•luhsh

Meaning: rude in a mean-spirited and surly way. **Synonyms:** rude, ill-mannered, discourteous

Antonyms: civil, courteous, polite

Sentence: It 'seems <u>churlish</u> to refuse such a generous offer.

4. ECSTATIC (adj) – उन्मादपूर्ण

Pronunciation: uhk • sta • tuhk

Meaning: feeling or expressing overwhelming happiness or joyful excitement.

Synonyms: enraptured, elated, transported **Antonyms:** depressed, dejected, despondent **Sentence:** Sally was <u>ecstatic</u> about her new job.

5. SQUEAMISH (adj) – नकचढ़ा

Pronunciation: skwee•muhsh

Meaning: (of a person) easily made to feel sick, faint, or disgusted, especially by

unpleasant images, such as the sight of blood.

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Synonyms: easily nauseated, nervous **Antonyms:** settled, healthy, well

Sentence: She's really <u>squeamish</u> and can't stand the sight of blood.

6. BELLIGERENT (adj) – युद्धरत

Pronunciation: buh•li•jr•uhnt **Meaning:** hostile and aggressive.

Synonyms: hostile, aggressive, threatening

Antonyms: nonaggressive, nonbelligerent, pacific

Sentence: Harris is a <u>belligerent</u> man with an explosive temper.

7. ABREAST (adverb) – बराबर में

Pronunciation: uh•brest

Meaning: side by side and facing the same way. **Synonyms:** in a row, side by side, alongside **Antonyms:** lost, out of touch, unaware

Sentence: His car was abreast of the leading car.

8. PERFERVID (adj) – उत्साही

Pronunciation: per•fer•vid

Meaning: intense and impassioned. **Synonyms:** ardent, emotional, fervent

Antonyms: dispassionate, emotionless, impassive **Sentence:** I feel the people of the city are <u>perfervid</u>.

9. EXULTANT (adj) – ख़ुशियां मनानेवाला

Pronunciation: uhg•zuhl•tnt **Meaning:** triumphantly happy.

Synonyms: jubilant, thrilled, triumphant **Antonyms:** dejected, depressed, disconsolate

Sentence: The <u>exultant</u> crowds were dancing in the streets.

10. PORTEND (verb) - संकेत मिलता

Pronunciation: por•tend

Meaning: be a sign or warning that (something, especially something momentous or

calamitous) is likely to happen.

Synonyms: presage, augur, foreshadow **Antonyms:** describe, narrate, recite

Sentence: The change did not <u>portend</u> a basic improvement in social conditions.

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
