### **1. TANGY (adjective) – तीखा**

**Pronunciation:** tang·ee

**Meaning:** having a strong, piquant flavor or smell

**Synonyms:** sharp, acid, acidic, tart, sour, bitter, harsh

**Antonyms:** sweet, bland

**Usage:** It comes with a tangy coarse-grained mustard sauce.

### **2. WIRY (adjective) – बलवान**

**Pronunciation:** wai·uh·ree

**Meaning:** lean, tough, and sinewy

**Synonyms:** sinewy, strong, tough, athletic, lean, spare

**Antonyms:** frail, flabby

**Usage:** The man's lean and wiry body type made him stand out from the rest of the actors at the audition.

### **3. SAVVY (adjective) – कुशाग्रता**

**Pronunciation:** sa·vee

**Meaning:** shrewd and knowledgeable

**Synonyms:** shrewd, astute, sharp, acute, intelligent, clever, canny

**Antonyms:** stupid, gullible

**Usage:** When the savvy investor sold his stock before its value dropped, he made a very profitable transaction.

### **4. LOUTISH (adjective) – बेअदब**

**Pronunciation:** law·tuhsh

**Meaning:** uncouth and aggressive

**Synonyms:** uncouth, rude, impolite, unmannerly, coarse, thuggish, boorish

**Antonyms:** polite, well behaved

**Usage:** He was not as loutish as his manner suggested.

### 5. STUPENDOUS (adjective) – आश्चर्यजनक

**Pronunciation:** styoo·pen·duhs

**Meaning:** extremely impressive

**Synonyms:** amazing, astounding, astonishing, extraordinary, remarkable, wonderful, prodigious

**Antonyms:** ordinary, standard

**Usage:** The store did not expect a stupendous throng of customers to line up around the building.



### 6. BOUNDLESS (adjective) – असीम

**Pronunciation:** bawnd·luhs

**Meaning:** unlimited or immense

**Synonyms:** limitless, unlimited, illimitable, unbounded, bottomless, immeasurable

**Antonyms:** limited, bounded

**Usage:** The toddler's boundless energy seemed endless, as he played from sun up to sun down.

### 7. CONVENE (verb) – एकत्र होना

**Pronunciation:** kuhn·veen

**Meaning:** come or bring together for a meeting or activity

**Synonyms:** summon, assemble, order, hold, convoke, gather, meet

**Antonyms:** disperse, scatter

**Usage:** Tomorrow morning, the teachers will convene in the cafeteria to discuss the dress code.

### **8. LUMBER (verb) – लड़खड़ाकर चलना**

**Pronunciation:** luhm·buh

**Meaning:** move in a slow, heavy, awkward way

**Synonyms:** lurch, stumble, shamble, shuffle, reel, waddle, trudge

**Antonyms:** nimble, agile

**Usage:** The old man lumbered upstairs.

### **9. STREW (verb) – बिखेरना**

**Pronunciation:** stroo

**Meaning:** scatter or spread things untidily over a surface or area

**Synonyms:** scatter, spread, disperse, distribute, litter, toss, sprinkle

**Antonyms:** gather, congregate

**Usage:** The library would have to work overtime after a customer strewed books all over the table.

### **10. INFLAME (verb) – भड़काना**

**Pronunciation:** uhn·fleim

**Meaning:** provoke or intensify strong feelings (especially anger) in someone

**Synonyms:** incite, arouse, ignite, provoke, animate, foment, actuate

**Antonyms:** dampen, calm, soothe

**Usage:** The attorney tried to inflame the jury by pointing out things that he knew would make them angry.

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
