




DAILY VOCAB DOSE

1. COMMODIOUS (adjective) – বিशाल

Pronunciation: kuh·mow·dee·uhs **Meaning**: roomy and comfortable

Synonyms: roomy, capacious, spacious, ample, substantial, generous, sizeable

Antonyms: cramped

Usage: I finally found an inexpensive hotel with rooms that are commodious enough for

the whole family.

2. SERENITY (noun) - शांतचित्तता

Pronunciation: suh·reh·nuh·tee

Meaning: the state of being calm, peaceful, and untroubled

Synonyms: calmness, calm, composure, tranquility, peace, collectedness, poise

Antonyms: anxiety, agitation, disruption

Usage: Deep breathing and intense focus during meditation can help enhance the feeling of

serenity.

3. INCEPTION (noun) – आरंभ

Pronunciation: uhn·sep·shn

Meaning: the establishment or starting point of an institution or activity

Synonyms: initiation, establishment, institution, foundation, founding, formation,

origination

Antonyms: conclusion, end, completion

Usage: Unfortunately, the <u>inception</u> of the Internet has made it easier for bullies to torment

their victims.

4. OPERATIVE (adjective) – ऑपरेटिव

Pronunciation: o·puh·ruh·tuhv



Meaning: functioning or having effect

Synonyms: effective, valid, functioning, working, running, operational, workable

Antonyms: invalid, broken, defective

Usage: The car was not <u>operative</u> until the engine was fixed.

5. DEBONAIR (adjective) – सुशील

Pronunciation: deh.buh.neuh

Meaning: confident, stylish, and charming

Synonyms: suave, urbane, sophisticated, cultured, confident, charming, gracious

Antonyms: unsophisticated, ignorant

Usage: Onscreen and in person, the Hollywood actor always manages to look so debonair.



6. MODEST (adjective) – आडंबरहीन, विनयपूर्ण

Pronunciation: mo·duhst

Meaning: humble in spirit or manner

Synonyms: humble, unpretentious, diffident, unassuming, unpresuming, unostentatious

Antonyms: boastful, conceited

Usage: He is very modest about his success.

7. EMINENT (adjective) – प्रख्यात



Pronunciation: eh·muh·nuhnt

Meaning: famous and respected within a particular sphere

Synonyms: illustrious, distinguished, renowned, esteemed, notable, noteworthy, great

Antonyms: unimportant, unknown

Usage: The students are expecting the arrival of an <u>eminent</u> scientist.

8. ABBERANT (adjective) – पथभष्ट

Pronunciation: uh·beh·ruhnt

Meaning: departing from an accepted standard

Synonyms: deviant, deviating, abnormal, divergent, atypical, anomalous, digressive

Antonyms: normal, typical

Usage: Once my nephew started using drugs, he began to behave in an aberrant fashion.

9. WITHSTAND (verb) – सहन करना

Pronunciation: wuhth-stand

Meaning: remain undamaged or unaffected by

Synonyms: resist, endure, tolerate, fight, combat, oppose, face, confront

Antonyms: surrender, yield

Usage: This fabric can <u>withstand</u> steam and high temperatures.

10. JUVENILE (adjective) - किशोर

Pronunciation: joo·vuh·nail

Meaning: for or relating to young people

Synonyms: young, teenage, adolescent, teenaged, junior, underage

Antonyms: adult

Usage: He was shipped off to a <u>juvenile</u> detention center.
