1.CAJOLE (verb) – मीठी बातों से मिला लेना

Pronunciation: kuh•jole

Meaning: persuade (someone) to do something by sustained coaxing or flattery.

Synonyms: persuade, wheedle, coax

Antonyms: bugged, nagged, pestered

Sentence: He hoped to cajole her into selling the house.

2.APROPOS (adj) – उचित

Pronunciation: a•pruh•poh

Meaning: very appropriate to a particular situation.

Synonyms: appropriate, pertinent, relevant

Antonyms: inapposite, irrelevant, pointless

Sentence: The composer's reference to child's play is apropos.

3.ARRAIGNMENT (noun) – आक्षेप

Pronunciation: uh•rayn•muhnt

Meaning: the action of arraigning someone in court.

Synonyms: indictment, accusation, denunciation

Antonyms: guiltlessness, innocence

Sentence: They are scheduled for arraignment October 5th.

4.SALUBRIOUS (adj) – स्वास्थ्यप्रद

Pronunciation: suh•loo•bree•uhs

Meaning: health-giving; healthy.

Synonyms: healthy, beneficial

Antonyms: insalubrious, noxious, unhealthful

Sentence: He doesn't live in a very salubrious part of town.

5.IMPIETY (noun) – नास्तिकता

Pronunciation: uhm•pai•uh•tee

Meaning: lack of piety or reverence, especially for a god.

Synonyms: godlessness, ungodliness, unholiness

Antonyms: adoration, glorification, worship

Sentence: He blamed the fall of the city on the impiety of the people.

6.REVEL (verb) – आनंद लेना**Pronunciation:** reh•vl**Meaning:** enjoy oneself in a lively and noisy way, especially with drinking and dancing.**Synonyms:** celebrate, make merry, have a party**Antonyms:** mourn, cry**Sentence:** They spent the evening reveling with their guests.**7.DENOUEMENT (noun) :- उपसंहार****Pronunciation:** day•noo•mawn**Meaning:** the final part of a play, movie, or narrative in which the strands of the plot are drawn together and matters are explained or resolved.**Synonyms:** final act, climax, epilogue**Antonyms:** beginning, start**Sentence:** The film's denouement was unsatisfying and ambiguous.**8.CLAMOR (noun) – कोलाहल****Pronunciation:** clam•or**Meaning:** a loud and confused noise, especially that of people shouting vehemently.**Synonyms:** babel, uproar, loud noise**Antonyms:** quiet, silence, calm**Sentence:** There was a clamor of voices outside the office.**9.SCORCH (verb) – जलाकर राख कर देना****Pronunciation:** skawch**Meaning:** burn the surface of (something) with flame or heat.**Synonyms:** burn, sear, singe**Antonyms:** hydrate, wash, dampen**Sentence:** Surrounding houses were scorched by heat from the blast.**10.ERUDITE (adj) – वैज्ञानिक****Pronunciation:** eh•roo•dite**Meaning:** having or showing great knowledge or learning.**Synonyms:** learned, scholarly, well educated**Antonyms:** illiterate, uneducated, unlearned**Sentence:** He could turn any conversation into an erudite discussion.

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
