




DAILY **VOCAB DOSE**

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Some exceptional words of English vocabulary from the newspaper 'The Hindu' are listed here. Go through these words and read their usages to learn how to use them in sentences. This will really help you boost up your learning.

1. ASCEND (verb) – ऊपर जाना; चढ़ना

Pronunciation: usend **Meaning:** go up or climb

Synonyms: arise, mount, scale, conquer

Antonym: descend

Usage:

- My child stopped crying when I told him his dead puppy would <u>ascend</u> to heaven and live with the puppy angels.
- The divers have begun to <u>ascend</u> to the surface of the water.

2. SEDATE (adjective, verb) - गंभीर, शांत

Pronunciation: si-deit

Meaning: calm, dignified, and unhurried; calm (someone) or make them sleep by administering a sedative drug

Synonyms: calm, tranquil, placid, composed, serene; tranquillize, quieten, pacify, soothe, relax

Antonyms: exciting, wild, fast; invigorate, energize

Usage:

- We spent a <u>sedate</u> evening at home.
- She was heavily <u>sedated</u>.

3. GLUM (adjective) - अप्रसन्न, मलिनमुख

Pronunciation: glum

Meaning: looking or feeling sad and depressed

Synonyms: morose, gloomy, downcast, downhearted, dejected, disconsolate

Antonyms: cheerful, merry

Usage: Finding out that their field trip was cancelled, the students' moods took a glum turn.

4. RESPONSIVE (adjective) – अनुक्रियाशील

Pronunciation: ris-pon-siv

Meaning: reacting quickly and positively

Synonyms: reactive, receptive, amenable, flexible, accessible

Antonyms: apathetic, insensitive

Usage: She is fairly <u>responsive</u> to new ideas.

5. ENIGMA (noun) – रहस्य, पेचदार

Pronunciation: enig-maa

Meaning: a person or thing that is mysterious or difficult to understand **Synonyms:** mystery, puzzle, riddle, conundrum, paradox, problem

Usage: Iran remains an enigma for the outside world.

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6. ANTEDATE (verb) - पूर्व दिनांकित करना

Pronunciation: anti-deit

Meaning: precede in time; come before (something) in date

Synonyms: precede, predate

Antonym: postdate

Usage: The economic troubles antedate the current administration.

7. KISMET (noun) – किस्मत, भाग्य

Pronunciation: kiz-met **Meaning:** destiny; fate

Synonyms: fortune, providence

Usage: Bill believes kismet caused him to miss the plane that crashed into the ocean.

8. SENILE (adjective) – जरा-जीर्ण

Pronunciation: see-nail

Meaning: (of a person) having or showing the weaknesses or diseases of old age, especially a loss of mental faculties

Synonyms: doddering, doddery, decrepit, aged

Usage: He spent many years caring for his <u>senile</u> mother.

9. SLICK (adjective) - धाराप्रवाह पर प्रभावहीन; चिकना

Pronunciation: slik

Meaning: done or operating in an impressively smooth and efficient way; smooth and superficially impressive but insincere or shallow; (of skin or hair) smooth and glossy; (of a surface) smooth, wet, and slippery

Synonyms: efficient, smooth, smooth-running, polished, well organized; glib, smooth, fluent, plausible; shiny, glossy, shining, sleek, smooth, silky, silken; slippery, wet, greasy, oily

Antonyms: amateurish, clumsy, inexpert; profound, thoughtful; dry, rough

Usage:

- The dancers gave a very <u>slick</u> performance.
- She's very slick, but I don't believe a word she says.
- His hair dark looked slick after shower.
- The roads were slick with rain.

10. PRESCIENT (adjective) – भविष्य ज्ञानी

Pronunciation: presi-unt

Meaning: having or showing knowledge of events before they take place

Synonyms: prophetic, predictive, visionary, psychic, clairvoyant

Antonym: undiscerning

Usage: Extraordinarily prescient, the 1905 book accurately predicted what is going on in today's times.



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
