




# DAILY VOCAB DOSE

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Some exceptional words of English vocabulary from the newspaper 'The Hindu' are listed here. Go through these words and read their usages to learn how to use them in sentences. This will really help you boost up your learning.

#### 1. CONTAGION (noun) – छूत वाली बीमारी

Pronunciation: kun-tei-jun Meaning: a disease spread by close contact Synonyms: contamination, infection, disease, illness, infirmity, pestilence **Usage:** The <u>contagion</u> spread slowly at first, almost unnoticed.

#### 2. CIRCUMSCRIBE (verb) – सीमित करना, पाबंदी लगाना

Pronunciation: suh-kum-skraib Meaning: restrict (something) within limits Synonyms: restrict, limit, delimit, curb, confine, bound Usage: Please circumscribe the words which are wrongly spelled.

#### 3. REPAST (noun) – भोजन, खाना

Pronunciation: ri-paast Meaning: a meal Synonyms: meal, feast, banquet, snack Usage: Breakfast at our house is a light repast.

#### 4. ARCHAIC (adjective) – प्रातन, प्राचीन

Pronunciation: aa-kei-ik Meaning: very old or old-fashioned Synonyms: obsolete, obsolescent, out of date, anachronistic, old-fashioned Antonyms: new, modern **Usage:** The English used in Chaucer's plays is an <u>archaic</u> form of the language.

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#### 5. PARCHED (adjective) – शुष्क; बह्त प्यासा

Pronunciation: paa-cht Meaning: dried out with heat; extremely thirsty Synonyms: dry, arid, desiccated, dehydrated Antonyms: wet, soaking Usage:

- The lack of rain had <u>parched</u> the land.
- I must get a drink I'm absolutely <u>parched</u>!

#### 6. BEWITCH (verb) – मंत्रम्ग्ध और प्रसन्न करना

Pronunciation: bi-wich
Meaning: enchant and delight (someone)
Synonyms: captivate, entrance, enrapture, charm
Antonym: repel
Usage: The wicked fairy <u>bewitched</u> the princess and made her fall into a long sleep.

#### 7. TIPSY (adjective) – हलके नशे में मस्त

Pronunciation: tipsi
Meaning: slightly drunk
Synonyms: merry, mellow, tiddly, squiffy
Antonym: sober
Usage: After the second glass of wine I was feeling a little tipsy.

#### 8. PRESSING (adjective, noun) – आग्रहयुक्त

#### Pronunciation: presing

**Meaning:** requiring quick or immediate action or attention; expressing something strongly or persistently; an act or instance of applying force or weight to something

**Synonyms:** urgent, critical, crucial, acute, desperate; insistent, persistent, determined, resolute, tenacious, obstinate

Antonym: unimportant Usage:

- Inflation was the most pressing problem. (adjective)
- Pure-grade olive oil is the product of the second or third pressings. (noun)

#### 9. GODFORSAKEN (adjective) – आकर्षण का अभाव

Pronunciation: god-fuh-sei-k(u)n
Meaning: lacking any merit or attraction
Synonyms: wretched, miserable, dreary, dismal, depressing, grim
Antonyms: charming, bustling
Usage: This is such a godforsaken place.

#### 10. REPARTEE (noun) – हाजिर जवाबी, क्षिप्र उत्तर

Pronunciation: rep-aa-tee Meaning: conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies Synonyms: banter, badinage, bantering, raillery Usage: She was good at <u>repartee</u>.
