1. IMPANELED (verb) : सूची में रखना

Pronunciation: uhm·pa·nuhld

Meaning: as in enlisted

Synonyms: inducted, enlisted, enrolled **Antonyms:** excluded, rejected, omitted

Sentence: A new grand jury is to be <u>impaneled</u> Wednesday.

2. VOICING (verb) : व्यक्त करना

Pronunciation: voys·uhng

Meaning: to make known (as an idea, emotion, or opinion)

Synonyms: expressing, stating, announcing

Antonyms: suppressing, restricting

Sentence: They had no inhibitions about <u>voicing</u> their feelings.

3. PREROGATIVE (noun): विशेषाधिकार

Pronunciation: pruh·raw·guh·tuhv

Meaning: a right or privilege exclusive to a particular individual or class.

Synonyms: entitlement, right, privilege

Antonyms: duty, obligation

Sentence: Education was once the prerogative of the elite.

4. CONFLUENCE (noun) : संगम

Pronunciation: kawn·floo·uhns

Meaning: the coming together of two or more things to the same point

Synonyms: convergence, merging, combination

Antonym: divergence

Sentence: The Coalition was not really a <u>confluence</u> of parties.

5. WRITS (noun) : प्रादेश

Pronunciation: rits

Meaning: a written command in the name of a court or other legal authority to act, or

abstain from acting, in some way.

Synonyms: warrants, summonses, subpoenas

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Antonyms: cancel, ignore, neglect

Sentence: There have been at least seven <u>writs</u> issued against him for late payment of bills.

6. IMPROMPTU (adj.) : बिना तैयारी के

Pronunciation: im·prawmp·too

Meaning: done without being planned, organized, or rehearsed.

Synonyms: unprepared, unscripted, extempore

Antonyms: prepared, planned, rehearsed

Sentence: The announcement was made in an <u>impromptu</u> press conference at the airport.

7. DECOY (verb) : लुभाना

Pronunciation: decoy

Meaning: to lead away from a usual or proper course by offering some pleasure or

advantage.

Synonyms: lure, tempt, entice **Antonyms:** turn away, repulse

Sentence: He used a whistle to <u>decoy</u> the birds within range.

8. DALLY (verb) : विलंब करना

Pronunciation: da·lee

Meaning: act or move slowly. **Synonyms:** dawdle, delay, loiter

Antonyms: hurry, hasten

Sentence: Don't dally along the way! We haven't got much time.

9. THY (article) : तेरा

Pronunciation: THY

Meaning: archaic or dialect form of yours.

Synonyms: thine, thee, yours **Antonyms:** mine, its, their

Sentence: Hide nothing from thy physician.

10. RECHRISTENED (verb) : नामकरण

Pronunciation: re·chris·ten **Meaning:** give a new name to.

Synonyms: renamed, relabelled, called **Antonyms:** anonymous, conf, faceless

Sentence: He <u>rechristened</u> Zaire the Democratic Republic of Congo.

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
