

1. INTRANSIGENCE (NOUN): हठ

Pronunciation: uhn·tran·zuh·jns

Meaning: refusing to change your opinions or behavior. **Synonyms:** stubbornness, obduracy, obstinacy, persistence

Antonyms: complaint, flexible

Sentence: He often appeared angry and frustrated by the intransigence of both sides.

2. VAINGLORIOUS (ADJECTIVE): अभिमानी

Pronunciation: vayn·glaw·ree·uhs

Meaning: excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain.

Synonyms: egotistic, proud, arrogant, bigheaded

Antonyms: egoless, humble, selfless

Sentence: The vainglorious trainer spent more flexing his muscles than he did helping

build his client's.

3. HUMBUG (NOUN): पाखण्ड

Pronunciation: huhm·buhg

Meaning: deceptive or false talk or behavior. **Synonyms:** hypocrisy, insincerity, dishonesty

Antonyms: original, genuine

Sentence: Because the voters were not fooled by the politician's humbug, they gave

their support to his opponent.

4. SACKED (VERB): वर्खास्त

Pronunciation: sakt

Meaning: to let go from office, service, or employment.

Synonyms: dismissed, fired, discharged **Antonyms:** employed, engaged, hired

Sentence: He was sacked for computer misuse

5. HOBNOBBING (VERB): नजदीकियां बढ़ाना

Pronunciation: hawb·nawb·uhng

Meaning: to socialize or talk informally.

Synonyms: Mingle, Fraternize

Antonyms: Isolate, Avoid, withdraw

6. HUDDLE (NOUN OR VERB): भीड

Pronunciation: huh·dl

Meaning: to crowd, push, or pile together. Synonyms: Cluster, Group, Gathering Antonyms: Disperse, Scatter, Separation

Sentence: The players formed a huddle on the field to discuss their strategy.

7. CONFABULATIONS (NOUN): बातचीत

Pronunciation: kuhn·fa·byoo·lay·shn

Meaning: the act of engaging in conversation or discussion, especially in a casual or

informal manner.

Synonyms: Discussion, Chat, Dialogue **Antonyms:** Silence, Quiet, Isolation

Sentence: We sat around the bonfire, engaging in lively confabulation late into the

night.

8. BARGING (VERB): जबरदस्ती घुसना

Pronunciation: baaj·uhng

Meaning: to push people out of the way in order to get past them.

Synonyms: Push, Shove, Jostle, Elbow **Antonyms:** Yield, Give Way, Defer

Sentence: The impatient commuter started barging through the crowded subway

station, causing annoyance and frustration among fellow passengers.

9. VERACIOUS (ADJECTIVE): सत्यनिष्ठ

Pronunciation: vuh·ray·shuhs

Meaning: honest and not telling or containing any lies

Synonyms: honest, truthful, genuine

Antonyms: mendacious, dishonest, untruthful **Sentence:** He was a strictly veracious reporter

10. COMPLACENT (ADJECTIVE): आत्म संतुष्ट

Pronunciation: kuhm·play·snt

Meaning: feeling so satisfied with your own abilities or situation that you feel you do

not need to try any harder.

Synonyms: pleased, self satisfied **Antonyms:** dissatisfied, irritated
