# 1.FROLIC (verb) – उछल-कूद करना

**Pronunciation:** fro·luhk

Meaning: to move about playfully and energetically

**Synonyms:** frisk, gambol, cavort, caper, carouse, lark, play

**Antonym:** work

Usage: It's fun to watch the playful goats frolic around the meadow in the afternoon.

### 2.FIDGETY (adjective) - बेचैन

**Pronunciation:** fi juh tee **Meaning:** restless or uneasy

Synonyms: apprehensive, impatient, agitated, jittery, jumpy, restless, uneasy

Antonyms: calm, still, composed

Usage: The children get fidgety if they have nothing to do.

# 3.RASPY (adjective) - कर्कश

Pronunciation: raa-spee

Meaning: hoarse or harsh sounding

Synonyms: rough, hoarse, gruff, gravelly, scratchy, throaty

Antonym: soft

**Usage:** His voice was <u>raspy</u> from days of non-stop campaigning.

### 4.BIDDABLE (adjective) – आज्ञाकारी

Pronunciation: bi·duh·bl

Meaning: ready to accept and follow instructions

Synonyms: obedient, tractable, amenable, pliable, pliant, complaisant, cooperative

Antonyms: disobedient, uncooperative, rebellious

Usage: He was a biddable boy, and went on without further question.

# 5.ABSURDITY (noun) – मूर्खता

Pronunciation: uhb·suh·duh·tee

Meaning: ridiculous situation or behavior

Synonyms: ridiculousness, idiocy, stupidity, foolishness, folly, silliness, inanity

Antonyms: reasonableness, wisdom



**Usage:** The absurdity of the situation made everyone laugh.

### 6.CRAGGY (adjective) - पथरीला

Pronunciation: kra·gee

Meaning: rough and uneven

Synonyms: rocky, rough, ragged, uneven, bumpy, stony, irregular

**Antonyms:** flat, smooth, even

**Usage:** The craggy peaks of the mountains are so uneven that no hiker could ever stand on

them.

### 7.UMBRAGE (noun) – रोष

Pronunciation: uhm·bruhj

Meaning: offence or annoyance

Synonyms: grudge, anger, annoyance, offense, fury, huff, rage

Antonyms: calmness, cheer, delight

Usage: I certainly took <u>umbrage</u> for not being invited to my best friend's wedding.

#### 8.GAUCHERIE (noun) – अशिष्टता

Pronunciation: gow·shuh·ree

**Meaning:** awkward or unsophisticated ways

Synonyms: barbarism, indecency, rudeness, immodesty, vulgarism, indecorum, solecism

Antonyms: decency, decorum, modesty

Usage: I cannot stand his gaucherie any more.

## 9.VOID (adjective) – खाली, रिक्त

Pronunciation: voyd

**Meaning:** completely empty

Synonyms: empty, emptied, vacant, blank, unfilled, unoccupied

Antonyms: full, filled, valid

Usage: The void spaces between the atoms count for nothing.

# 10.PEACEABLE (adjective) – शांतिप्रिय

**Pronunciation:** pee·suh·bl

Meaning: inclined to avoid conflict or dissent

Synonyms: peaceful, friendly, serene, amiable, calm, complacent, nonviolent

Antonyms: aggressive, unfriendly

**Usage:** He has lived a <u>peaceable</u> and honest life.

#### 11.STRIVE (verb) – प्रयास करना



**Pronunciation:** straiv

Meaning: to struggle or try something very hard

**Synonyms:** try, attempt, aim, aspire, venture, undertake

**Antonyms:** relax, rest, laze

**Usage:** We have to strive for what we want.

# 12.CONCISE (adjective) – संक्षिप्त

Pronunciation: kuhn·sais

**Meaning:** expressing much in few words

**Synonyms:** short, brief, compact, pithy, incisive, crisp, compressed

**Antonyms:** lengthy, wordy

Usage: Since I get bored easily, I only read concise stories under fifty pages.

### 13.MODERATION (noun) – संयम

Pronunciation: mo·duh·rei·shn

**Meaning:** the avoidance of excess or extremes

Synonyms: restraint, fairness, patience, temperance, constraint, balance

**Antonyms:** extremism, intemperance

Usage: Eating fatty foods is acceptable as long as you do it in moderation without

overdoing it.

#### 14.TRIFLING (adjective) – নুভ্ড

**Pronunciation:** trai-fuh-luhng **Meaning:** unimportant or trivial

Synonyms: trivial, unimportant, insignificant, minor, inconsiderable, nominal, negligible

Antonyms: important, serious, considerable

Usage: My time is too valuable to spend on trifling matters that have little worth.

### 15.CHOKE (verb) – दम घ्टना

**Pronunciation:** chowk

Meaning: to have issue in breathing

Synonyms: suffocate, asphyxiate, smother, stifle, strangle, throttle

**Antonyms:** free, loose, release

Usage: Peanuts can choke a small child.

#### 16.UNFATHOMABLE (adjective) – अथाह

**Pronunciation:** uhn·fa·thuh·muh·bl

Meaning: incapable of being fully explored or understood



Synonyms: inscrutable, incomprehensible, enigmatic, incalculable, indecipherable,

obscure, esoteric

**Antonyms:** comprehensible, intelligible, understandable

Usage: After five hours, we still could not figure out the <u>unfathomable</u> riddle.

#### 17.DETONATE (verb) - विस्फोट करना

**Pronunciation:** deh·tuh·neit **Meaning:** to ignite or blow up

Synonyms: blast, burst, explode, bang, ignite, trigger, spark

**Antonyms:** dismantle

**Usage:** A remote control device was used to <u>detonate</u> the bomb.



### 18.MINDSET (noun) – मानसिकता

**Pronunciation:** maind set

**Meaning:** the established set of attitudes held by someone **Synonyms:** attitude, psychology, ethos, mentality, psyche

**Antonym:** physicality

Usage: I am of the mindset that there's no reason to put off things I can do now to instead

do later.

## 19.TRACTABLE (adjective) – शिक्षणीय

**Pronunciation:** trak · tuh · bl

**Meaning:** easy to control or influence

Synonyms: controllable, manageable, malleable, yielding, amenable, complaisant,

compliant

**Antonyms:** obstinate, defiant, recalcitrant

Usage: The dog was more <u>tractable</u> when he wore the vibrating collar.

# 20.PROSPERITY (noun) – समृद्धि



**Pronunciation:** pro · speh · ruh · tee

**Meaning:** the state of being prosperous

Synonyms: wealth, success, profitability, affluence, riches, opulence, growth

**Antonyms:** hardship, failure, poverty

**Usage:** The growth of tourism brought <u>prosperity</u> to the island.

### 21.PROSPECT (noun) - अपेक्षा, संभावना

**Pronunciation:** pruh·spekt

**Meaning:** the possibility or likelihood of some future event

Synonyms: likelihood, hope, expectation, anticipation, chances, odds, probability

**Antonyms:** hopelessness, impossibility, unlikelihood **Usage:** There was no prospect of any reconciliation.

#### 22.SURMOUNT (verb) – विजय पाना

**Pronunciation:** suh mawnt

**Meaning:** to conquer a problem or obstacle

Synonyms: overcome, conquer, overpower, subdue, surpass, vanquish

**Antonyms:** lose, fail, surrender

**Usage:** One of Janet's goals is to surmount her fear of flying.

### 23.MAVERICK (noun) - अपरंपरागत, विद्रोही

**Pronunciation:** ma·vuh·ruhk

Meaning: tending to choose a different path from everyone else

**Synonyms:** individualist, nonconformist, radical, extremist, trendsetter

Antonyms: conformist, conservative, moderate

**Usage:** The maverick boy made his fortune by using a selling strategy different from that

of his competitors.

#### 24.INDEFATIGABLE (adjective) – স্থক

**Pronunciation:** in · duh · fa · tuh · guh · bl

**Meaning:** persisting tirelessly

Synonyms: tireless, untiring, unwearied, unflagging, energetic, dynamic

**Antonyms:** feeble, tired

Usage: The director of the homeless shelter is an indefatigable woman who works almost

eighteen hours every day.

# 25.AMALGAMATE (verb) – मिश्रित करनाना

**Pronunciation:** uh·mal·guh·meit **Meaning:** to join or combine



Synonyms: blend, alloy, ally, coalesce, combine, fuse, mingle

Antonyms: divide, part

Usage: Because of budget cuts, the two schools were forced to <u>amalgamate</u> into one

building.

#### 26.AVID (adjective) – उत्सुक

**Pronunciation:** a · vuhd

**Meaning:** having or showing a keen interest in or enthusiasm for something

Synonyms: keen, eager, enthusiastic, ardent, passionate, fervent

**Antonyms:** indifferent, disinterested

**Usage:** He took an <u>avid</u> interest in the project.

## 27.CONSPICUOUS (adjective) – सुस्पष्ट, सहजदृश्य

Pronunciation: kuhn·spi·kyoo·uhs

Meaning: clearly visible

Synonyms: noticeable, observable, discernible, perceptible, clear, detectable, prominent

Antonyms: hidden, unnoticeable, indistinct

**Usage:** The notice must be displayed in a <u>conspicuous</u> place.

# 28.RECTIFY (verb) – सुधारना, ठीक करना

Pronunciation: rek·tuh·fai Meaning: to correct an issue

Synonyms: correct, amend, fix, debug, repair, troubleshoot

Antonyms: ruin, worsen, damage

Usage: The software engineers worked quickly to rectify the bug that was deleting user

accounts.

## 29.PRONE (adjective) – आँधा

**Pronunciation:** prown

**Meaning:** lying flat, especially face downwards

Synonyms: prostrate, procumbent, decumbent, flat, horizontal

Antonyms: upright, supine, straight

**Usage:** He was lying <u>prone</u> on a foam mattress.

### 30.ALLIANCE (noun) – संधि

Pronunciation: alai-uns

**Meaning:** a union or association formed for mutual benefit

Synonyms: association, union, league, treaty, affinity

**Antonyms:** distance, separation



Usage: In order to protect their borders, the two countries formed an alliance.

# 31.UNFETTERED (adjective) – निरंकुश

Pronunciation: uhn-feh-tuhd

Meaning: not confined or restricted

**Synonyms:** unrestrained, unrestricted, unconstrained, free, unbridled, untrammeled,

unchecked

**Antonyms:** restricted, confined

Usage: Illegal drug sales go unfettered under the ignorant eyes of the crooked sheriff.

# 32.RIGHTEOUSNESS (noun) – सच्चाई, निष्कपटता

**Pronunciation:** rai·chus·nus

**Meaning:** the quality of being morally right or justifiable

Synonyms: goodness, rectitude, virtuousness, uprightness, decency, integrity, worthiness

**Antonyms:** infamy, dishonesty

**Usage:** Both sides in the dispute have been adopting a tone of moral <u>righteousness</u>.

### 33.LIAISE (verb) - मिलकर काम करना

Pronunciation: li·eiz

**Meaning:** cooperate on a matter of mutual concern

Synonyms: cooperate, collaborate, coordinate, synchronize, assist

Antonym: counteract

**Usage:** Our head office will <u>liaise</u> with the suppliers to ensure delivery.

#### 34.CONVINCE (verb) - मनाना

**Pronunciation:** kun·vins

**Meaning:** cause someone to do or believe something **Synonyms:** persuade, induce, assure, satisfy, reassure

**Antonyms:** dissuade, confuse, dissatisfy **Usage:** I was <u>convinced</u> by his explanation.

# 35.SPRUCE (verb) - स्वच्छ और सुंदर बनाना

**Pronunciation:** sproos

**Meaning:** to make something clean or neat

Synonyms: cleanse, wash, purify, neaten, refine

Antonyms: pollute, adulterate, worsen

**Usage:** The fund will be used to <u>spruce</u> up historic buildings.

## 36.IMPERATIVE (adjective) – अनिवार्य



**Pronunciation:** uhm·peh·ruh·tuhv **Meaning:** of vital importance

Synonyms: vital, crucial, critical, essential, necessary, indispensable, exigent

**Antonyms:** unimportant, optional, inessential

**Usage:** It is imperative for your recovery to continue the treatment for at least two months.

#### 37.VALOR (noun) – वीरता

**Pronunciation:** va·luh

Meaning: great courage in the face of danger, especially in battle

Synonyms: bravery, courage, fearlessness, pluck, nerve

Antonyms: cowardice, timidity, fear

**Usage:** He showed <u>valor</u> and skill on the battlefield.



### 38.SPECTATOR (noun) - दर्शक, देखनेवाला

**Pronunciation:** spek-tei-ter

**Meaning:** a person who watches at a show, game, or other event **Synonyms:** onlooker, watcher, viewer, observer, witness, sightseer

Antonyms: participant, player

**Usage:** About eighty thousand spectators packed into the stadium last night.

#### 39.RELENT (verb) – नरम पड़ना, कोमल होना

**Pronunciation:** ri·lent

Meaning: become less severe or intense

Synonyms: acquiesce, soften, capitulate, quit, relax, slacken, subside

Antonyms: harden, strengthen, worsen

Usage: The rain did not relent, and even seemed to be enhanced at times.

# 40. ARISTOCRAT (noun) – रईस, कुलीन

**Pronunciation:** a·ruh·stuh·krat



**Meaning:** a member of the highest class in certain societies

Synonyms: nobleman, peer, patrician, grandee, swell

Antonyms: commoner, plebian, proletariat

**Usage:** Henry Cyril Paget was an <u>aristocrat</u> so wealthy that he built a dance theater so that

he could perform for his royal family and friends.

#### 41.BELITTLE (verb) - अपमान करना

Pronunciation: buh·li·tl

**Meaning:** dismiss as unimportant

Synonyms: deride, discredit, disparage, downplay, lower, undervalue, underrate

**Antonyms:** praise, flatter, overrate

Usage: To project himself as a very smart manager, Larry will often belittle his employees

who come to him with questions.

#### 42.DIVULGE (verb) - प्रकट करना

**Pronunciation:** dai vuhlj **Meaning:** make known

Synonyms: disclose, reveal, tell, impart, expose, uncover

Antonyms: conceal, hide

Usage: Doctors must be careful to not divulge confidential information about their

patients.

# 43.GRANDILOQUENT (adjective) - शब्दाडंबरपूर्ण

Pronunciation: gran-di-luh-kwnt

Meaning: pompous or extravagant in language, style, or manner

Synonyms: pompous, bombastic, magniloquent, pretentious, ostentatious, rhetorical,

orotund

Antonyms: unpretentious, concise, simple

Usage: Jack's use of grandiloquent terminology failed to impress the job interviewer.

#### 44.ADVENT (noun) - आगमन

**Pronunciation:** ad · vent

**Meaning:** the arrival of a notable person or thing

**Synonyms**: arrival, appearance, emergence, entrance, visitation

**Antonyms:** departure, disappearance, retreat

**Usage:** The elder discussed the <u>advent</u> of the saint and how it would usher in a new world

order.

### 45.CRYPTIC (adjective) - गुप्त



**Pronunciation:** krip·tuhk

Meaning: having a meaning that is mysterious or obscure

Synonyms: enigmatic, mysterious, confusing, mystifying, perplexing

**Antonyms:** straightforward, clear

**Usage:** I received a cryptic message through the post.

#### 46.ALOFT (adverb) - ऊपर

Pronunciation: uh·loft

**Meaning:** upwards or into the air

Synonyms: upwards, overhead, above, high, skyward, up

Antonyms: down, below, under

Usage: The graduating class threw their caps <u>aloft</u> during commencement.

### 47.AFFLUENT (adjective) - धनी, संपन्न

Pronunciation: a.floo.uhnt

**Meaning:** having a great deal of money

Synonyms: wealthy, moneyed, prosperous, rich, upscale

Antonyms: poor, failing, destitute

Usage: He is an affluent man.

# 48.PUNCTILIOUS (adjective) – सूक्ष्मताप्रिय

**Pronunciation:** puhngk·ti·lee·uhs

**Meaning:** showing great attention to detail or correct behavior

Synonyms: meticulous, conscientious, careful, diligent, attentive, scrupulous, painstaking

Antonyms: careless, slapdash, uncaring

**Usage:** Margaret's tendency to be <u>punctilious</u> makes her a great accountant.

### 49.CRIMP (verb) - मोड़ना

**Pronunciation:** krimp

Meaning: compress something into small folds or ridges

Synonyms: coil, crease, crinkle, crisp, crumple, frizz, wrinkle

Antonym: straighten

Usage: Because she likes her hair to look wavy and creased, the stylist uses a special tool

to crimp each strand.

# 50.NAIVETY (noun) – भोलापन, सादगी

Pronunciation: nai·ee·vuh·tee

Meaning: lack of experience, wisdom, or judgement

Synonyms: innocence, simplicity, naturalness, gullibility, immaturity



**Antonym:** sophistication

**Usage:** They laughed at the <u>naivety</u> of his suggestion.

# 51.TRANSGRESS (verb) - उल्लंघन करना

**Pronunciation:** tranz·gres

**Meaning:** go beyond the limits of what is morally, socially, or legally acceptable

Synonyms: misbehave, lapse, degenerate, trespass, disobey, defy

**Antonyms:** obey, heed

Usage: People who transgress the boundaries of social etiquette will be politely turned

away at the door.

#### 52.TREASON (noun) - राज-द्रोह

**Pronunciation:** tree · zn

**Meaning:** the offense of betraying a nation

Synonyms: disloyalty, crime, mutiny, sedition, subversion, treachery, deceit

**Antonyms:** loyalty, faithfulness

Usage: When the soldier sold military secrets to a foreign government, he was arrested for

the crime of treason.

# 53.INCEPTION (noun) – आरंभ

**Pronunciation:** uhn·sep·shn

Meaning: the establishment or starting point of an institution or activity

Synonyms: initiation, establishment, institution, foundation, founding, formation,

origination

Antonyms: conclusion, end, completion

Usage: Unfortunately, the <u>inception</u> of the Internet has made it easier for bullies to torment

their victims.

# 54.DEBONAIR (adjective) – सुशील

Pronunciation: deh.buh.neuh

Meaning: confident, stylish, and charming

Synonyms: suave, urbane, sophisticated, cultured, confident, charming, gracious

Antonyms: unsophisticated, ignorant, clumsy

Usage: Onscreen and in person, the Hollywood actor always manages to look so debonair.

#### 55.ELUCIDATE (verb) – स्पष्ट करना, समझाना

**Pronunciation:** il-yusi-deit **Meaning:** make something clear

Synonyms: explain, illuminate, clarify, enlighten, unfold



Antonyms: confuse, obscure, complicate

**Usage:** Please <u>elucidate</u> the reasons for your action.

#### 56.CONJECTURE (noun) – अनुमान

**Pronunciation:** kuhn·jek·chuh

**Meaning:** an opinion or conclusion formed on the basis of incomplete information

Synonyms: guess, speculation, surmise, fancy, hypothesis

**Antonyms:** proof, reality, truth

Usage: That was a conjecture, not a fact.



#### 57.SNOOTY (adjective) - अकड्नेवाला

Pronunciation: snoo·tee

**Meaning:** showing disapproval or contempt towards others

Synonyms: arrogant, haughty, conceited, condescending, egotistical, pompous, snobbish

**Antonyms:** friendly, modest, humble

Usage: Many people believe that those who are wealthier are snooty and conceited, which

is not true for everyone of a higher social class.

#### 58.EFFETE (adjective) – अशक्त

Pronunciation: uh-feet

Meaning: weak or effeminate

Synonyms: weak, effeminate, unmasculine, unmanly, soft, timid, fearful

**Antonyms:** manly, masculine, strong

**Usage:** The huge wrestler made fun of the effete man who entered the ring to challenge

him.

#### 59.MELODIOUS (adjective) – मधुर

**Pronunciation:** muh·low·dee·uhs **Meaning:** having a pleasing sound

Synonyms: harmonious, tuneful, melodic, musical, dulcet, round, soothing



**Antonyms:** discordant, grating

Usage: Melodious flutes played throughout the auditorium.

## 60.ADVENTUROUS (adjective) – साहसी

**Pronunciation:** uhd·ven·chuh·ruhs

**Meaning:** willing to undertake or seeking out new and daring enterprises **Synonyms:** daring, intrepid, venturesome, bold, audacious, fearless, brave

**Antonyms:** cowardly, fearful

Usage: John is an <u>adventurous</u> man, unafraid of risks.

#### 61.IMPUDENT (adjective) – धृष्ट, ग्स्ताख़

Pronunciation: im-pyuh-dnt

Meaning: not showing due respect for another person

Synonyms: impertinent, insolent, cheeky, audacious, brazen, shameless, immodest

Antonyms: polite, respectful, modest

Usage: Even though Mary needed a new vacuum cleaner, the impudent attitude of the sales

clerk made her decide to leave the store.

#### 62.JUVENILE (adjective) - किशोर

**Pronunciation:** joo·vuh·nail

Meaning: for or relating to young people

Synonyms: young, teenage, adolescent, teenaged, junior, underage

Antonym: adult

Usage: He was shipped off to a <u>juvenile</u> detention center.

#### 63.FANTASY (noun) - कल्पना

Pronunciation: fan·tuh·see

**Meaning:** a pleasant thought of an unlikely enjoyable situation **Synonyms:** imagination, creativity, fancy, vision, speculation

Antonyms: truth, reality, actuality

**Usage:** Sometimes reality and <u>fantasy</u> are hard to distinguish.

#### 64.SERMON (noun) – उपदेश

**Pronunciation:** suh·muhn

**Meaning:** a lecture

Synonyms: lecture, tirade, harangue, diatribe, speech, monologue, declamation

Antonym: commendation

**Usage:** The guest speaker preached a moving <u>sermon</u> about forgiveness.



# 65.HYPERBOLE (noun) - अतिशयोक्ति

Pronunciation: hai puh buh lee

**Meaning:** exaggerated statements or claims not meant to be taken literally

Synonyms: exaggeration, overstatement, magnification, amplification, embellishment

Antonyms: understatement, lessening, compression

**Usage:** If the politician uses one more <u>hyperbole</u> in his speech, I will know he is

exaggerating about all his claims.

### 66.UMPTEEN (adjective) - अनेक

**Pronunciation:** uhmp·teen **Meaning:** indefinitely many

Synonyms: countless, numerous, innumerable, untold, myriad, divers

**Antonyms:** few, limited

Usage: He has produced <u>umpteen</u> books, plays and television series.

#### 67.HOLLER (verb) – चिल्लाना

Pronunciation: ho·luh

**Meaning:** give a loud shout or cry

Synonyms: shout, yell, cry, call, roar, howl, vociferate

Antonyms: whisper, mumble

Usage: Then they turn around and holler against federal regulation in the marketplace.

# 68.PHENOMENAL (adjective) – अद्भुत, असाधारण

**Pronunciation:** fuh·no·muh·nuhl **Meaning:** extremely remarkable

Synonyms: astounding, remarkable, extraordinary, fantastic, marvelous, outstanding,

prodigious

Antonyms: insignificant, ordinary, usual

Usage: After seeing the play, the critics praised the young actor on his phenomenal talent.

# 69.SALVATION (noun) – मुक्ति, रक्षा

Pronunciation: sal·vei·shn

**Meaning:** preservation or deliverance from harm, ruin, or loss **Synonyms:** rescue, saving, escape, liberation, redemption

Antonyms: destruction, downfall, endangerment

Usage: Since the country has few natural resources to sell overseas, it sees tourism as its

financial salvation.

# 70.LEGITIMATE (adjective) – वैध, कानूनी



**Pronunciation:** li·jit·uh·mit

**Meaning:** conforming to the law or to rules

Synonyms: authentic, legal, lawful, licit, valid, legit

Antonyms: illegal, illegitimate, fraudulent

Usage: Because William did not think the terms of the contract were legitimate, he spoke

to his lawyer before signing the agreement.
