

1.UNASSAILABLE (adj.) : अभेद्य

Pronunciation : uhn·uh·sayl·uh·bl
Meaning: unable to be attacked, questioned, or defeated.
Synonyms: impregnable, invulnerable, impenetrable
Antonyms: assailable, defenseless
Sentence: That is one of the <u>unassailable</u> beliefs of that political party.

2.TRITE (adj) : घिसे-पिटे

Pronunciation : trite
Meaning: overused and consequently of little import; lacking originality or freshness.
Synonyms: hackneyed, banal, clichéd
Antonyms : original, fresh, imaginative
Sentence: This point may now seem obvious and <u>trite</u>.

3.SKULDUGGERY (noun) : छल

Pronunciation : skuhl·duh·guh·ree
Meaning: underhanded or unscrupulous behavior; trickery.
Synonyms: trickery, swindling, fraudulence
Antonyms: sincerity, candidness
Sentence: He is serving a prison sentence for financial skulduggery.

4.BEREAVE (verb) : वंचित करना

Pronunciation : buh-reev **Meaning:** be deprived of a loved one through a profound absence, especially due to the loved one's death. **Synonyms:** deprive, dispossess, strip

Antonyms : satisfy, enrich, hold

Sentence: The plane crash bereaved her of her husband.

5.SQUANDERED (verb) : गंवाना

Pronunciation : skvawn.duhd
Meaning: waste (something, especially money or time) in a reckless and foolish manner.
Synonyms: waste, misspend, misuse
Antonyms: conserved, preserved

Sentence: He's squandered all his savings on drink.

6.SPRAWLING (verb) : फैलाना

Pronunciation : sprawl·uhng
Meaning: spreading out over a large area in an untidy or irregular way.
Synonyms: radiating, extending, splaying
Antonyms: limiting, restricting, contracting
Sentence: There were weeds <u>sprawling</u> in the yard.

7.PIOUS (adj.) : धर्मनिष्ठ

Pronunciation : pai·uhs
Meaning: devoutly religious.
Synonyms: religious, devout, devoted
Antonyms: faithless, impious, irreligious
Sentence: Alexander is a pious follower of the faith.

8.CAVILING (verb) : गुस्ताखी करना

Pronunciation : ka·vuhl·uhng
Meaning: make petty or unnecessary objections.
Synonyms: complaint, carp, grumble
Antonyms: approving, supporting
Sentence: They <u>caviled</u> at our calculations.

9.INIMITABLE (adj.) : अनोखी

Pronunciation : uhn·i·muh·tuh·bl
Meaning: so good or unusual as to be impossible to copy; unique.
Synonyms: unique, distinctive, idiosyncratic
Antonyms: common, familiar, ordinary
Sentence: He entertained us in his <u>inimitable</u> style.



10.ABSTRUSE (adj.) : अव्यक्त

Pronunciation : uhb·stroos
Meaning: difficult to understand; obscure.
Synonyms: obscure, arcane, esoteric
Antonyms: easy, facile, simple
Sentence: Einstein's theory of relativity is very <u>abstruse</u>.
