

1. PROROGUED (VERB): अवसान करना

Pronunciation: pruh·roged

Meaning: to suspend or postpone a decision, action, or event.

Synonyms: Adjourned, Deferred **Antonyms:** Convened, Continued

Sentence: The committee decided to prorogue the discussion on the controversial issue

until they could gather more information and viewpoints from experts.

2. OPIOID (NOUN): अफ़ीम या अफीम जैसे पदार्थ

Pronunciation: oh·pee·oyd

Meaning: a class of powerful pain. relieving drugs that are derived from or chemically

similar to opium, typically used to manage severe pain.

Synonyms: Narcotic, Analgesic

Antonyms: stimulant, waking, rousing

Sentence: The doctor prescribed an opioid medication to manage the patient's excruciating

post. surgery pain.

3. PROPITIATING (ADJECTIVE): आराधन

Pronunciation: pruh·pi·shee·ayt·uhng

Meaning: appeasing or attempting to appease someone, often by making offerings or

gestures to gain favour or avoid their anger.

Synonyms: Soothing, Mollifying **Antonyms**: Resistant, Disobedient

Sentence: The employee's propitiating attitude towards the supervisor helped defuse a

potential conflict in the workplace

4. ABSTINENCE (NOUN): संयम

Pronunciation: ab·stuh·nuhns

Meaning: the act of voluntarily refraining from indulging in certain behaviours, especially the consumption of food, drink, or other pleasures, typically for moral, religious, or health reasons

Synonyms: Sobriety, Restraint **Antonyms:** Indulgence, Excess

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Sentence: After years of overeating, Jane adopted a lifestyle of abstinence from unhealthy foods and lost a significant amount of weight.

5. DESECRATING (VERB): अप वत्र करना

Pronunciation: deh·suh·krayt·uhng

Meaning: treating something sacred or revered with disrespect, irreverence, or violation.

Synonyms: Violating, Profaning **Antonyms**: Revering, Sanctifying

Sentence: The religious leader condemned the act of desecrating sacred texts, urging his

followers to treat them with the utmost reverence and care.

6. HARKS (VERB): स्नना

Pronunciation: haaks

Meaning: listens attentively or pays heed to something.

Synonyms: Heeds, Attends **Antonyms:** Ignores, Neglects

Sentence: She harks to the advice given by her mentor, applying the wisdom to navigate

challenging situations in her career.

7. RUE (NOUN/VERB): पछताना

Pronunciation: roo

Meaning: a feeling of regret, sorrow, or repentance.

Synonyms: Lament, Bemoan **Antonyms:** Celebrate, Welcome

Sentence: As he gazed at the old photograph, he couldn't help but rue the missed

opportunities of his youth.

8. DISCRIMINATION (NOUN):भेदभाव

Pronunciation: di·skri·mi·nay·shn

Meaning: treating one person or group worse than others.

Synonyms: Prejudice, Bias **Antonyms:** Equity, Impartiality

Sentence: The law prohibits discrimination against the disabled.

9. PROFESS (VERB): ढोंग करना

Pronunciation: pruh·fes

Meaning: declare something, often insincerely.

Synonyms: Announce, Proclaim

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Antonyms: Conceal, Disavow

Sentence: She still professes her innocence.

10. LACKADAISICAL (ADJECTIVE): लापरवाह


Pronunciation: la·kuh·day·zuhk·uhl

Meaning: careless.

Synonyms: lazy, lax

Antonyms: enthusiastic

Sentence: Raj has a rather lackadaisical approach to his work.



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
