1. ILLEGITIMATE (adjective) – अवैध

Pronunciation: i·luh·ji·tuh·muht
Meaning: not authorized by the law
Synonyms: illegal, unlawful, illicit, criminal, actionable, felonious, unlicensed
Antonyms: legitimate, lawful
Usage: The election was dismissed as <u>illegitimate</u> by the opposition.

2. FORBID (verb) – मना करना

Pronunciation: fuh·bid
Meaning: to prohibit or ban
Synonyms: prohibit, ban, outlaw, veto, proscribe, disallow, preclude
Antonyms: permit, allow, sanction
Usage: The teacher tried to <u>forbid</u> the students from using their cell phones, but they wouldn't listen to her.

3. BLINDLY (adverb) - अंधवत्

Pronunciation: blaind·lee
Meaning: without being able to see
Synonyms: impulsively, rashly, hastily, recklessly, uncontrollably, wildly, irrationally
Antonyms: cautiously, critically
Usage: Don't just <u>blindly</u> accept what you are told.

4. RECURRENT (adjective) – आवर्तक

Pronunciation: ruh·kuh·ruhntMeaning: occurring often or repeatedlySynonyms: repeated, recurring, repetitive, periodic, cyclic, regularAntonyms: isolated, single, unique



Usage: Putting our mail in the neighbor's mailbox was a <u>recurrent</u> incident with our postman.

5. COERCION (noun) - दबाव

Pronunciation: kow·uh·shn

Meaning: the action of using threats or force to get someone to do something **Synonyms**: force, compulsion, constraint, duress, oppression, enforcement, harassment **Antonyms**: freewill, choice, preference

Usage: I refuse to employ <u>coercion</u>, because I believe it is wrong to make people do things by force.



6. RESTIVE (adjective) - अशांत

Pronunciation: reh·stuhv
Meaning: impatient especially under restriction or delay
Synonyms: restless, fidgety, edgy, tense, uneasy, nervous, agitated, anxious
Antonyms: calm, biddable, peaceable
Usage: The audience was becoming restive as they waited for the performance to begin.

7. NARCISSISM (noun) – आत्ममोह

Pronunciation: $naa \cdot su \cdot si \cdot zm$



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Meaning: extreme love for oneself Synonyms: vanity, conceit, egotism, arrogance, egoism, insolence Antonyms: modesty, diffidence Usage: He went to the gym every day, driven purely by <u>narcissism</u>.

8. GRANDIOSE (adjective) - शानदार

Pronunciation: gran.dee.ows **Meaning**: appearing to be impressive but not really possible or practical **Synonyms**: magnificent, impressive, grand, imposing, splendid, resplendent, superb **Antonyms**: unimpressive, humble **Usage**: The lottery commercials appeal to consumers by leading them to believe they t

Usage: The lottery commercials appeal to consumers by leading them to believe they too can have <u>grandiose</u> lives.

9. BRAINY (adjective) – बुद्धिमान

Pronunciation: brei·nee
Meaning: having or showing intelligence
Synonyms: clever, intelligent, bright, brilliant, gifted, intellectual, erudite
Antonyms: stupid, brainless, foolish
Usage: Some people are born brainy.

10. EFFICACIOUS (adjective) – प्रभावी

Pronunciation: eh·fuh·kei·shuhs
Meaning: having the power to produce a desired effect
Synonyms: effective, successful, effectual, productive, constructive, fruitful, powerful
Antonyms: inefficacious, ineffective, unproductive
Usage: Because my medicine is <u>efficacious</u>, I expect to feel better soon.



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
