

1. ASKANCE (adverb) – संदेहात्मक दृष्टि से

Pronunciation: uh·skaans
Meaning: with an attitude or look of suspicion or disapproval
Synonyms: suspiciously, skeptically, cynically, dubiously, contemptuously
Antonyms: approvingly
Usage: As the police officer listened to the woman's crazy story, he could not help but look <u>askance</u> at her.

2. POMP (noun) – धूमधाम

Pronunciation: pomp
Meaning: ceremony and splendid display
Synonyms: ceremony, spectacle, show, splendor, grandeur, magnificence
Antonyms: simplicity
Usage: There was much pomp to be seen at the celebrity wedding.

3. CRABBED (adjective) – अपठनीय

Pronunciation: krabd
Meaning: very small and difficult to decipher
Synonyms: cramped, bad, shaky, scribbled, illegible, unreadable, indecipherable
Antonyms: bold, clear
Usage: His <u>crabbed</u> handwriting covered both sides of the page.

4. PALLID (adjective) – फीका

Pronunciation: pa·luhd
Meaning: pale, typically because of poor health
Synonyms: pale, white, pasty, wan, colorless, anemic, bloodless
Antonyms: flushed, rosy
Usage: Paul looked <u>pallid</u> and sick.


5. DEVOLVE (verb) – अवक्रमित होना

Pronunciation: duh·volv **Meaning**: transfer or delegate power to a lower level



Synonyms: delegate, depute, transfer, transmit, commit, assign, consign **Antonyms**: centralize, retain

Usage: A law was passed to <u>devolve</u> some powers of the central government to regional councils.



6. GENTILITY (noun) - शिष्टाचार

Pronunciation: jen·ti·luh·tee

Meaning: social superiority as demonstrated by polite and respectable manners, behavior, or appearances

Synonyms: respectability, refinement, distinction, ascendancy, couth, politeness

Antonyms: vulgarity, indecency

Usage: She conveys an aura of elegance and gentility.

7. SENTIENT (adjective) – संवेदनशील

Pronunciation: sen·tee·uhnt
Meaning: able to perceive or feel things
Synonyms: feeling, living, live, conscious, aware, responsive, reactive
Antonyms: insentient
Usage: Many people believe plants to be <u>sentient</u> and responsive to things such as music and the human voice.

8. LUXURIANT (adjective) - प्रचुर

Pronunciation: luhg·zhuor·ree·uhnt **Meaning**: rich and profuse in growth **Synonyms**: lush, rich, abundant, superabundant, profuse, exuberant, prolific



Antonyms: barren, sparse

Usage: In the spring months, thousands of tourists visit the <u>luxuriant</u> gardens near the art museum.

9. WHITTLE (verb) – घटाना

Pronunciation: wi·tlMeaning: reduce something in size, amount, or extent by a gradual series of stepsSynonyms: reduce, diminish, decrease, undermine, weaken, subvert, lessenAntonyms: increase, augmentUsage: We need to whittle down the list of guests for the party.

10. UNDERHAND (adjective) – गुप्त, कपटपूर्ण

Pronunciation: uhn·duh·hand
Meaning: done in a secret or dishonest way
Synonyms: deceitful, dishonest, unethical, unprincipled, illegal, unlawful, fishy
Antonyms: honest, fair, above board
Usage: He has been involved in some <u>underhand</u> dealings.
