

1.ENDURANCE (noun): धैर्य

Pronunciation: uhn·dyoh·ruhns

Meaning: the fact or power of enduring an unpleasant or difficult process or situation

without giving way.

Synonyms: toleration, bearing, sufferance

Antonyms: cessation, end

Sentence: She showed great endurance in the face of pain.

2.PERUSAL (noun) : अध्ययन

Pronunciation: puh·rooz·uhl

Meaning: the action of reading or examining something.

Synonyms: reading, scrutiny, inspection

Antonyms: ignorance, neglect,

Sentence: I continued my <u>perusal</u> of the instructions.

3.CHASTISE (verb) : दंड देना

Pronunciation: chas-tise

Meaning: rebuke or reprimand severely.

Synonyms: scold, upbraid, berate **Antonyms:** excuse, pardon, spare

Sentence: He <u>chastised</u> his colleagues for their laziness.

4.PROVISOS (noun) : प्रावधानों

Pronunciation: pruh·vai·zoze

Meaning: a condition attached to an agreement. **Synonyms:** condition, stipulation, provision **Antonyms:** fullness, wetness, unsoundness

Sentence: He left his unborn grandchild a trust fund with the proviso that he be named

after the old man.

5.FORMIDABLE (adj.) : दुर्जेय

Pronunciation: fuh·mi·duh·bl

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Meaning: inspiring fear or respect through being impressively large, powerful, intense, or

capable.

Synonyms: intimidating, forbidding, redoubtable

Antonyms: calming, comforting, consoling

Sentence: No government can be long secure without a formidable opposition.

6.SUPPLE (adj.): लचीला

Pronunciation: suh·pl

Meaning: bending and moving easily and gracefully; flexible.

Synonyms: lithe, limber, nimble **Antonyms:** inflexible, rigid, stiff

Sentence: The gloves were made of very <u>supple</u> leather.

7.CAVEAT (noun) : चेतावनी

Pronunciation: ka-vee-at

Meaning: a warning or proviso of specific stipulations, conditions, or limitations.

Synonyms: warning, caution, admonition

Antonyms: disqualification, inability, inaptitude, lack

Sentence: He agreed to the interview, with the <u>caveat</u> that he could approve the final

article.

8.UNWONTED (adj.) : असामान्य

Pronunciation: uhn·vawnt·uhd **Meaning:** unaccustomed or unusual.

Synonyms: unusual, uncommon, unaccustomed

Antonyms: common, customary, normal

Sentence: He spoke with <u>unwonted</u> enthusiasm.

9.GAIETY (noun): आमोद-प्रमोद

Pronunciation: gay·uh·tee

Meaning: the state or quality of being lighthearted or cheerful.

Synonyms: cheerfulness, merriment, joy **Antonyms:** misery, mourning, despondence **Sentence:** Their <u>gaiety</u> helped the party a lot.

10.PROMISCUITY (noun) : संकीर्णता

Pronunciation: praw·muh·skyoo·uh·tee

Meaning: the fact or state of being promiscuous. **Synonyms:** license, licentiousness, promiscuousness

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


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Antonyms: fidelity, allegiance, constancy

Sentence: Although most birds are monogamous, <u>promiscuity</u> is not unusual among brood

parasites.



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
