2. SHELVE (verb) – टालना

Pronunciation: shelv

Meaning: decide not to proceed with a project or plan, either temporarily or permanentlySynonyms: postpone, stay, suspend, , delay, defer, reschedule, adjournAntonyms: execute, implement, reviveUsage: They had to shelve their holiday plans because their son was ill.

3. ENLIGHTENMENT (noun) – प्रबोधन

Pronunciation: uhn·lai·tuhn·muhnt
Meaning: the action of being informed
Synonyms: understanding, insight, education, learning, knowledge, awareness, information
Antonyms: ignorance, unenlightenment
Usage: The man's search for spiritual <u>enlightenment</u> led him to the monastery.

4. ANTECEDENT (noun) – पूर्वज

Pronunciation: an·tuh·see·dnt

Meaning: a person's ancestors or family and social background **Synonyms**: ancestor, forefather, forebear, predecessor, progenitor, family



Antonyms: descendant, successor Usage: Her early life and <u>antecedents</u> have been traced.

5. BRIO (noun) – चुस्ती

Pronunciation: bree • ow
Meaning: vigor or vivacity of style or performance
Synonyms: vigor, vivacity, gusto, verve, zest, sparkle, dash
Antonyms: lethargy, inertia, inactivity
Usage: Michele is an elderly woman whose <u>brio</u> astounds everyone.



6. INSURGENT (noun) – विद्रोही

Pronunciation: uhn·suh·jnt

Meaning: a person fighting against a government or invading force **Synonyms**: rebel, revolutionary, mutineer, agitator, subversive, guerrilla, anarchist **Antonyms**: loyalist

Usage: The soldiers were trained to shoot any enemy insurgent on sight.

7. REASSURE (verb) - आश्वस्त

Pronunciation: ree.uh.shuor



Meaning: say or do something to remove the doubts or fears of someone

Synonyms: encourage, hearten, comfort, soothe, inspirit

Antonyms: alarm, unnerve

Usage: The banker tried to <u>reassure</u> the wary customer that his funds would be secure in the safe.

8. KUDOS (noun) – यश

Pronunciation: kyoo.dos
Meaning: praise and honor received for an achievement
Synonyms: prestige, cachet, glory, honor, status, standing, distinction
Antonyms: obscurity, infamy
Usage: The person who wrote that wonderful speech is worthy of kudos.

9. TRANSLUCENT (adjective) - पारदर्शी

Pronunciation: tranz·loo·snt
Meaning: allowing light, but not detailed shapes, to pass through
Synonyms: pellucid, diaphanous, colorless, glassy, gossamer, clear, crystalline
Antonyms: opaque
Usage: The police officer could see the shapes of two figures as he gazed through the translucent window.

10. ILLUSION (noun) - भ्रम

Pronunciation: uh·loo·zhn

Meaning: a deceptive appearance or impression

Synonyms: appearance, impression, deception, imitation, semblance, pretence, sham,

Antonyms: reality, actuality

Usage: After stepping down the stairs, the bifocals created an <u>illusion</u> so that it looked like the step was closer than it really was.
