Q1. Statement: The Government of our Country has made it mandatory for all cyclists to use radium stickers on the cycle-tyres, both front and rear.

Assumptions:

- I. There have been many accidents due to the invisibility of cyclists at night.
- II. The number of accidents of cyclists at night will reduce.
- III. The radium stickers will make the cycles visible at night.
- A. Only I is implicit.
- B. Only II is implicit.
- C. Only III is implicit.
- D. Both I and II are implicit.
- E. None of them is implicit.

Ans1.D. Both I and II are implicit.

Explanation:

The statement suggests that the radium stickers will make the cyclists easily visible at night, so it can be

safely assumed that it will reduce accidents happening due to their invisibility. Also, the government's insistence indicates that there have been accidents due to the invisibility of cyclists at night and the number is worrisome. So option I and II are implicit assumptions. Assumption III is rather an inference from the given statement, so it cannot be called an assumption.

Q2. Statement: About two year ago, President Ram Nath Kovind had told the world that the signature of a chartered accountant on financial statements was, perhaps, more powerful than even one of his own. 'Just like doctors don't want people to be ill to get more business, chartered accountants, too, need to safeguard the society's economic health. Your signature is more powerful than the President's, and the government also believes the accounts signed by you', Kovind had said.

Assumption:

I.The CA community, however, may not have woken up to the value of the initials they put on financial statements. Last year has been more of a challenge for the community's reputation, with banking frauds, asset quality divergences and mid-term auditor resignations dominating the headlines.

II. There cannot be a situation where there will be 100% agreement on everything. You may have rules but still judgmental factors in credit, asset recognition come in. The approach is that as soon as the asset is stretched, banks have to recognize the problem.

III. But even basic logic just went out of the window and banks together kept dishing out loans to such companies even when their annual turnover was half of the total debt.

Ans2. A. Only I is implicit

Explanation:

The correct answer is option (A), i.e. only I is implicit.

An assumption is a thing that is accepted as true or as certain to happen, without proof.

From the statement, it is evident that President said that the signature of a chartered accountant is of prime importance and has value even more than his own signatures. Based on this, Assumption (I) can be inferred as the assumption looks as a statement with respect to which the above statement by the President has been said. It can be assumed that last year was a bit difficult for the CA's and they themselves don't know the worth of their signatures. In respect to this the Presidents has said that their signatures are far more valuable than his.

Moreover, we don't have any option like 'None of the above' so we must look for an option choice from the ones stated and assumption (I) is the most appropriate from the rest of the two.

Both (II) and (III) can be rejected as in (II) problem has been confined only to banks and in (III) loans have been introduced. Since, they are very generic and not specific and neither do they hold any relevance with the given statement, both the assumptions can be rejected. Thus, all of the assumptions except (II) and (III) are irrelevant and can be rejected and the most appropriate

Explanation:

Since there is a dire need to eliminate it, argument A, labels it as an environmental hazard which supports the stand taken by the passage. The other arguments either present a vague attribute of plastic or oppose the reasons given in the passage. Hence, option (A) is the right answer.

Q5. Statement: Indian movies are accused of having a patriarchal structure. Almost all the movies made in India are male centric and have strong male leads. Movies that are female centric are very rare and even if such movies are made, they do not get as much popularity as the male centric movies. People prefer to see famous male celebrities on the

big screen rather than female celebrities.

Which of the following argument could be made from the above passage?

- A. Movies with strong male characters are critically acclaimed.
- B. Indian movies do not do anything to promote equality of gender.
- C. A patriarchal society consists of a female dominated power structure.

From the given arguments, argument (B) best supports the passage as it points out the problem of unequal representation of genders in movies. The other arguments do not give any valid reason that would support the arguments. Hence, option (B) is the correct solution.

Q6. Statement: As our country is progressing, people are getting more and more concerned about their physical and mental health. Taking care of one's physical and mental

health is important but this concern is now turning into an obsession. The phobia with having a fit body leads to an environment that is not friendly towards people with unfit bodies. This often causes people with unfit bodies to take drastic measures to get a body that is deemed perfect. Which of the following argument could be made from the above passage?

From the given arguments, only argument (C) supports the passage as it states the harmful effects of this obsession. It



states the problem of lack of selfacceptance that people face. Hence, option (C) is the right answer.

Q7. Statement: Drinking water is considered as one of the basic essential requirement of everyone's life. Privatising water would improve its distribution but it will subsequently make its distribution profit centric and as a result, it would lead to a rise in its price. This increase in price would make it unaffordable for many people. Distribution of water should be done by the Government as only then it would be done to benefit the public and not for profits.

Which of the following argument could be made from the above passage?

- A. Privatization of water would take away the right of freedom from people.
- B. Privatization of water will lead to an increase in its consumption.

Ans7. C. Privatization of water would make it exorbitant for a number of people.

Explanation:

From the given passage, we can understand that privatizing water would improve its distribution, that is, make it more accessible but at the same time, it would make water unaffordable, that is, exorbitant. Option (D) is wrong as it is stating something in contradiction to what the passage tells us. Privatization would not lead to an increase in the consumption of water and would not affect the freedom of people in any way. Hence, option (A) and (B) are wrong, and option (C) is the rights answer.

Q8.Statement: All the popular Indian actresses pledged to control water pollution and to spread the message asking citizens to do the same. Since there is always a scarcity of water in India, these actresses shot advertisements where they were seen conserving water. They succeeded in their mission as these advertisements had a major impact on the people because of the fame of the actresses.

Which of the following argument could be made from the above passage?

Since people get influenced by their ideals, the actresses were able to influence their fans. Hence, option (D) is the correct solution.

So (D) is the correct answer. (A) is not correct as legal validity is not discussed at all. As affordability is not the question (B) is not the answer. If anything, the fine rates being easily affordable will only result in more violations. (C) cannot be assumed as it is not suggested that accidents occur only because of traffic, rules violations.

Direction (13-14):In each of the question below some statement are given. An assumption is something

supposed or taken for granted. You have to consider the following assumption and decide which of the assumption is implicit in the statement.

Q13.Statement: Every time Japan's president, Shinzō Abe, turned to his American allies for loans and assistance with an ambitious port project, the answer was yes. Yes, though feasibility studies said the port wouldn't work. Yes, though other frequent lenders like India had refused. Yes, though Japan's debt was ballooning rapidly under Shinzō Abe.

Assumptions:

An assumption is a thing that is accepted as true or as certain to happen, without proof. (III) can be assumed to be a perfect assumption for the said statement as it is contextually correct and is the most logical assumption based on the facts mentioned. From the statement, it is evident that whenever Japan's president, Shinzō Abe, turned to his American allies for loans and assistance with an ambitious port project, they approved of it. Though feasibility studies said the port wouldn't work, though, Japan's debt was ballooning rapidly under Shinzō Abe but still America granted the loan. We need to find out a suitable assumption for the American allies for their behavior with the Japanese nation or the future of the port project. (I) states a fact and we cannot assume a fact from the above statement, thus, it is rejected. (II) is also rejected as we cannot assume the fact that the agreement rules out America's military use of the site as

no such information regarding it is mentioned. An appropriate assumption can be assumed as (III) which states the fact that because of the high budget project failing Shinzō Abe may lose the election and will also lose its ties with frequent leaders and Japanese allies which might result in his downfall in the elections. Thus, all of the assumptions except (III) are irrelevant and can be rejected and the most appropriate answer choice is option (B). i.e. All except I, II is implicit.

Q14. Statement: The government of Dehradun has decided to pay compensation of Rs. 10 lakh to the family members of those who are killed in the flood.

Assumption:

Thus, option (A) is the correct answer.

(B) => the low success rate in selling bicycles to the people who were made aware of the benefits and were actually given demonstrations shows that this is not true. And therefore, the conclusion collapses if (B) is true.

Hence, Option (B) is the correct answer.
