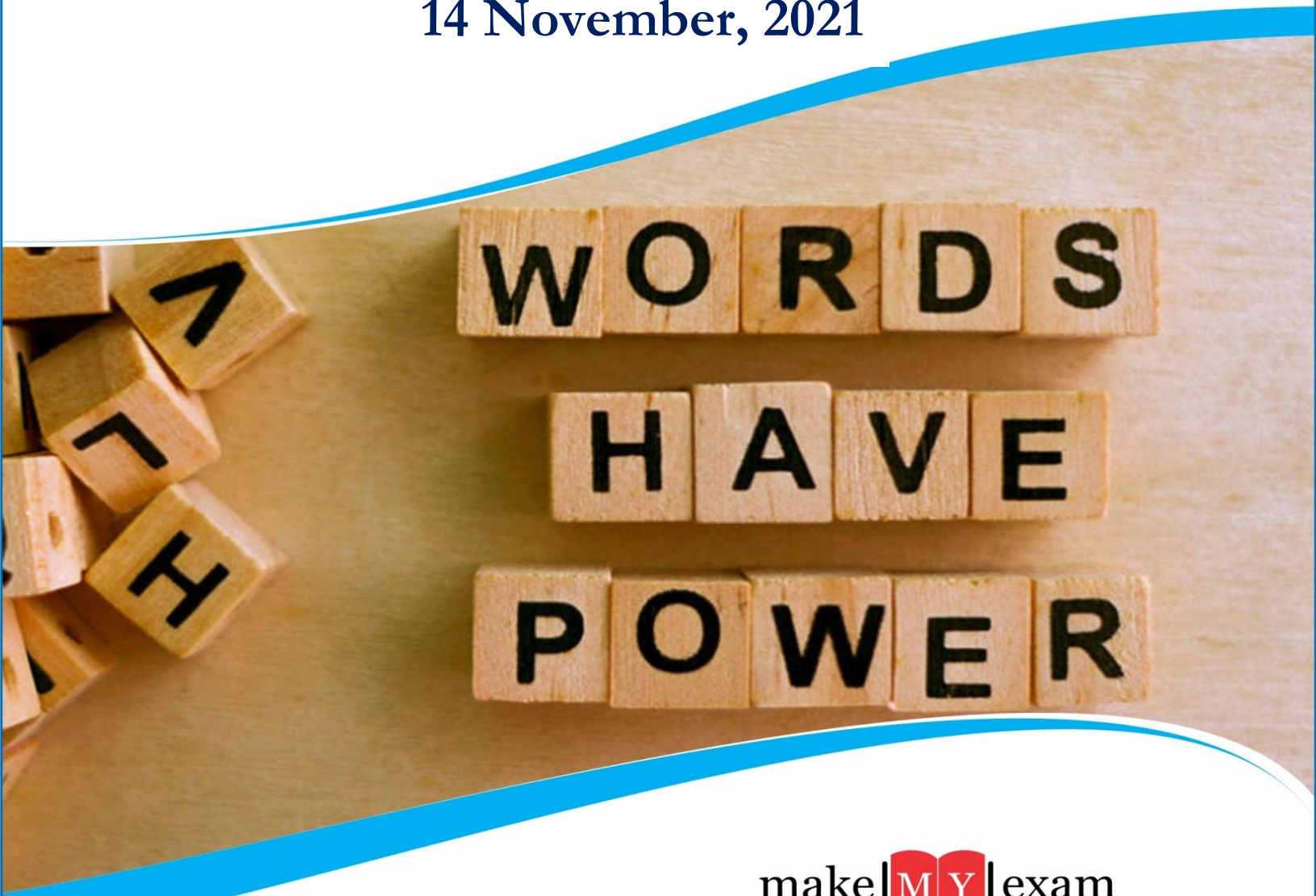

### 1.UNFAILING (adj) – अमोघ

**Pronunciation:** uhn•fayl•uhng

**Meaning:** without error or fault.

**Synonyms:** errorless, faultless, flawless

**Antonyms:** fallible, defective, faulty

**Sentence:** I'd like to thank you all for your unfailing support.

### 2.GLOBETROTTING (noun) – विश्वयात्रा

**Pronunciation:** globe•trawt•uhng

**Meaning:** the action of traveling widely around the world.

**Synonyms:** voyage, travel

**Antonyms:** exclude, go direct, remain.

**Sentence:** The Prime Minister's globetrotting has led to accusations that he is ignoring domestic problems.

### 3.DIABOLICAL (adj) – पैशाचिक

**Pronunciation:** dai•uh•baw•luhk•uhl

**Meaning:** characteristic of the Devil, or so evil as to be suggestive of the Devil.

**Synonyms:** devilish, diabolic, fiendish

**Antonyms:** ethical, good, moral

**Sentence:** Conditions in the prison were diabolical.

### 4.PUTREFY (verb) – सड़ना

**Pronunciation:** pyoo•truh•fai

**Meaning:** (of a body or other organic matter) decay or rot and produce a fetid smell.

**Synonyms:** decay, rot, decompose

**Antonyms:** develop, grow, mature

**Sentence:** The body was beginning to putrefy.

### 5.TRADUCE (verb) – बदनाम करना

**Pronunciation:** truh•dyoos

**Meaning:** speak badly of or tell lies about (someone) so as to damage their reputation.

**Synonyms:** defame, slander, malign

**Antonyms:** glorify, honor, acclaim

**Sentence:** He traduced his friend's character.

**6.EXHILARATE (verb) – खुश करना****Pronunciation:** uhg•zi•luh•rayt**Meaning:** make (someone) feel very happy, animated, or elated.**Synonyms:** thrill, excite, intoxicate**Antonyms:** distress, demoralize, sadden**Sentence:** The cold weather exhilarated the walkers.**7.DENOUEMENT (noun) – उपसंहार****Pronunciation:** day•noo•mawn**Meaning:** the final part of a play, movie, or narrative in which the strands of the plot are drawn together and matters are explained or resolved.**Synonyms:** final act, climax, epilogue**Antonyms:** beginning, start**Sentence:** The film's denouement was unsatisfying and ambiguous.**8.OBVIATE (verb) – मुक्त हो जाना****Pronunciation:** awb•vee•ayt**Meaning:** remove (a need or difficulty).**Synonyms:** preclude, prevent, remove**Antonyms:** Take, require, demand, ask, need**Sentence:** A peaceful solution would obviate the need to send a UN military force.**9.DISSONANT (adj) – कर्कश****Pronunciation:** di•suh•nuhnt**Meaning:** lacking harmony.**Synonyms:** inharmonious, disharmonious, discordant**Antonyms:** harmonious, melodious, harmonizing**Sentence:** A lot of harsh, dissonant music has been composed in the last 40 years.**10.PERSECUTE (verb) – सताना****Pronunciation:** puh•suh•kyoot**Meaning:** subject (someone) to hostility and ill-treatment, especially because of their race or political or religious beliefs.**Synonyms:** oppress, abuse, victimize**Antonyms:** comfort, console, assist**Sentence:** His followers were persecuted by the authorities.

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
