1. EXHUME (verb) - पृथ्वी खोद कर निकालना

Pronunciation: eks-hyoom / igz-yoom **Meaning:** dig out (something buried) from the ground **Synonyms:** disinter, unearth, disentomb, unbury, ungrave **Antonym:** bury **Usage:** The body was <u>exhumed</u> on the order of the judge.

2. COLLUDE (verb) – कपट-संधि करना

Pronunciation: kul-yood **Meaning:** to act together secretly or illegally in order to deceive or cheat someone **Synonyms:** conspire, connive, intrigue, plot **Usage:** The president accused his opponents of <u>colluding</u> with foreigners.

3. EXHORTATION (noun) - आग्रह, प्रोत्साहन

Pronunciation: egzo-teish(u)n
Meaning: an address or communication emphatically urging someone to do something
Synonyms: urging, encouragement, persuasion
Antonyms: discouragement
Usage: Our teacher gives us <u>exhortation</u> to study hard.

4. INDICT (verb) – दोषी ठहरना

Pronunciation: in-dikt **Meaning:** formally accuse of or charge with a crime **Synonyms:** summons, cite **Antonym:** acquit **Usage:** The policeman <u>indicted</u> him for breaking the traffic rule.



5. PROCLIVITY (noun) – प्रवृत्ति; रुझान

Pronunciation: pro-kli-viti **Meaning:** a tendency to choose or do something regularly; a tendency to behave in a particular way **Synonyms:** liking, inclination, disposition, propensity **Usage:**

- It is the <u>proclivity</u> of the gas companies to raise prices when demand is high.
- The child showed no <u>proclivity</u> towards aggression.

6. INDIGNATION (noun) – आक्रोश, रोष

Pronunciation: indig-neish(u)n **Meaning:** anger or annoyance provoked by what is perceived as unfair treatment **Synonyms:** resentment, umbrage, affront, anger, distress **Antonym:** contentment **Usage:** Her <u>indignation</u> at such rough treatment was understandable.

7. COLLATE (verb) - इकट्ठा और संयोजित करना

Pronunciation: kul-eit
Meaning: collect and combine (texts, information, or data)
Synonyms: collect, gather, accumulate, assemble, combine, aggregate
Antonym: separate
Usage: They collate information about their opponents.

8. FERVENT (adjective) – तीक्ष्ण, उत्साही

Pronunciation: fuh-v(u)nt
Meaning: having or displaying a passionate intensity
Synonyms: impassioned, passionate, intense, vehement, ardent, fervid
Antonym: apethatic
Usage: Despite her troubled life she has always had a <u>fervent</u> belief in God.

9. SPELLBIND (verb) - मोहित करना, आकर्षित करना

Pronunciation: spel-baindMeaning: hold the complete attention of (someone) as though by magicSynonyms: fascinating, enthralling, entrancing, bewitching, captivating, intriguingAntonyms: boring, dull, bored, uninterestedUsage: The children were spellbound by the performances in the circus.

10. CIRCUMVENT (verb) – कठिनाई पर काबू पाना

Pronunciation: suh-kum-vent
Meaning: find a way around (an obstacle); overcome (a problem or difficulty), typically in a clever way
Synonyms: avoid, get round, evade, bypass, sidestep, dodge, overcome
Antonym: struggle
Usage: Don't panic, find ways to <u>circumvent</u> the problem.
