2. DEXTERITY (noun) : निपुणता

3. PERTINENT (adj.) : उचित

Antonyms: extraneous, immaterial, impertinent
Sentence: She asked me a lot of very pertinent questions.

4. BURGLARY (noun) : सेंध

Antonyms: return, release, reinstatement
Sentence: Crime is on the increase, especially mugging and <u>burglary</u>.

5. DISBURSE (verb) : चुकाना

Pronunciation: dis•burs **Meaning:** payout (money from a fund). **Synonyms:** payout, spend, expend



Antonyms: acquire, earn, gain

Sentence: The funds were to be <u>disbursed</u> in two installments.

6. AGGRIEVED (adj.) : पीड़ित

Pronunciation: uh•greevdMeaning: feeling resentment at having been unfairly treated.Synonyms: resentful, affronted, indignantAntonyms: gratified, pleased, satisfiedSentence: He felt <u>aggrieved</u> at not being chosen for the team.

7. AEGIS (noun) : तत्वावधान

Pronunciation: ee•juhs
Meaning: the protection, backing, or support of a particular person or organization.
Synonyms: patronage, sponsorship, backing
Antonyms: aggression, assault, attack
Sentence: Medical supplies are being flown in under the <u>aegis</u> of the Red Cross.

8. EVICTION (noun) : निष्कासन

Pronunciation: ee•vik•shn **Meaning:** the action of expelling someone, especially a tenant, from a property **Synonyms:** expulsion, ejection, ousting **Antonyms:** admit, include, welcome **Sentence:** The family now faces <u>eviction</u> from their home.

9. SUCCOR (verb) : परेशानी में सहायता देना

Pronunciation: suc•cor
Meaning: give assistance or aid to.
Synonyms: help, aid, support
Antonyms: damage, harm, hurt
Sentence: Prisoners of war were liberated and <u>succored</u>.

10. ROBUST (adj.) : मजबूत

Pronunciation: row•buhst Meaning: strong and healthy; vigorous. Synonyms: strong, vigorous, tough Antonyms: unfit, unhealthy, unwell Sentence: His robust strength made him survive the disaster.
