1. HALT (verb, noun) – विराम, स्कना

Pronunciation: hawlt

Meaning: bring or come to an abrupt stop; a suspension of movement or activity, typically a temporary

one

Synonyms: stop, come to rest, pull up, draw up, discontinue, terminate, be over, pause, end, suspend, put

an end to

Antonyms: start, go, continue, continuation

Usage:

• The bicycle brakes to a <u>halt</u>. (noun)

• He called for a <u>halt</u> to the recent wave of emigration. (verb)

2. INFLUX (noun) - प्रवाह, वेगपूर्ण प्रवेश, तांता

Pronunciation: in•fluhks

Meaning: an arrival or entry of large numbers of people or things

Synonyms: rush, stream, flood, incursion, ingress, invasion, intrusion, inflow, inrush, inundation

Antonyms: outflow, effluence, efflux

Usage: The hotel has received a large influx of guests.

3. CONFINE (verb, noun) – सीमित करना; सीमित रखना

Pronunciation: kuhn•fain

Meaning: keep or restrict someone or something within certain limits of space, scope, or time; the borders or boundaries of a place, especially with regard to their restricting freedom of movement

Synonyms: enclose, incarcerate, imprison, intern, impound, trap, keep, cage, hurdle, encircle, surround, ring

Antonyms: unloose, free, release, loose, unloosen, liberate

Usage:

• It is cruel to <u>confine</u> a bird in a cage. (verb)

• Doctors are trying to <u>confine</u> the disease within the city. (noun)

4. DISCREPANCY (noun) – अंतर, भिन्नता

Pronunciation: duh•skreh•puhn•see

Meaning: an illogical or surprising lack of compatibility or similarity between two or more facts

Synonyms: inconsistency, difference, disparity, variance, variation, deviation, divergence, disagreement,

dissimilarity

Antonyms: similarity, correspondence

Usage: There is some discrepancy between the two accounts.



5. DWINDLE (verb) - क्षीण होना, महत्त्व खोना

Pronunciation: dwin•dl

Meaning: diminish gradually in size, amount, or strength

Synonyms: diminish, decrease, reduce, lessen, wane, contract, shrink, tail off, drop, fall, go down, sink,

plummet

Antonyms: increase, flourish

Usage: The number of people going to the cinema seems to dwindle steadily.

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6. ALLEGED (adjective) – तथाकथित, थोपा हुआ

Pronunciation: uh•leid

Meaning: said, without proof, to have taken place or to have a specified illegal or undesirable quality **Synonyms**: supposed, so-called, claimed, professed, purported, ostensible, apparent, putative, unproven

Antonyms: unquestionable, undeclared

Usage: It has been <u>alleged</u> that Jack stole the money.

7. AUGUR (verb, noun) – भविष्य बतलाना, शक्न विचारना

Pronunciation: aw•guh

Meaning: portend a good or bad outcome; (in ancient Rome) a religious official who observed natural signs, interpreting these as an indication of divine approval or disapproval of a proposed action.

Synonyms: foreshadow, presage, indicate, signify, signal, bode, portend, herald, promise, threaten, spell, denote

Antonyms: assure, calculate, demonstrate, determine, establish, insure, make sure, prove, settle, warrant **Usage**:

• Mounting sales <u>augur</u> a profitable year. (verb)

• It is surprising that an <u>augur</u> can see an augury without smiling. (noun)



8. APPREHENSION (noun) – डर, शंका

Pronunciation: a pruh hen shn

Meaning: anxiety or fear that something bad or unpleasant will happen

Synonyms: anxiety, angst, alarm, worry, uneasiness, unease, nervousness, misgiving, disquiet, concern,

agitation

Antonyms: inapprehension, confidence **Usage**: She felt a shiver of apprehension.

9. SLUMP (noun, verb) – मंदी, गिर पड़ना, अकस्मात पतन

Pronunciation: sluhmp

Meaning: sit, lean, or fall heavily and limply; a sudden severe or prolonged fall in the price, value, or

amount of something

Synonyms: flop, flump, collapse, sink, fall, subside, sag, slouch, plunge, drop, tumble, plummet,

downturn

Antonyms: stand up, sit up, rise, soar

Usage:

• The toy industry is in a <u>slump</u>. (noun)

• Martha <u>slumped</u> against the cushions. (verb)

10. TOIL (verb, noun) - कड़ी मेहनत; कठिन परिश्रम करना

Pronunciation: toyl

Meaning: work extremely hard or incessantly; exhausting physical labour

Synonyms: hard work, toiling, labour, slaving, struggle, effort, exertion, application, industry, grind, slog,

blood

Antonyms: rest, relax, laze

Usage:

• A life of <u>toil</u> is generally the price of fame and success. (noun)

• If you want knowledge, you must toil for it. (verb)
