1. PLUNGE (verb) – डुबाना

Pronunciation: pluhnj
Meaning: jump or dive quickly and energetically.
Synonyms: sink, dive, jump
Antonyms: emerge, sore, rescue
Sentence: Our daughters whooped as they plunged into the sea.

2. BLASPHEMY (noun) - ईश - निंदा

Pronunciation: blas·fuhm·ee
Meaning: the act or offense of speaking sacrilegiously about God or sacred things; profane talk.
Synonyms: profanity, profaneness, sacrilege
Antonyms: adoration, glorification, worship
Sentence: He was detained on charges of <u>blasphemy</u>.

3. AUDACITY (noun) – धृष्टता

Pronunciation: aw·da·suh·tee
Meaning: a willingness to take bold risks.
Synonyms: boldness, daring, fearlessness
Antonyms: shyness, timidity, hesitancy
Sentence: Her <u>audacity</u> came in handy during our most recent emergency.

4. SANCTITY (noun) – पवित्रता

Pronunciation: sangk·tuh·tee
Meaning: the state or quality of being holy, sacred, or saintly.
Synonyms: holiness, godliness, sacredness
Antonyms: sanctimony, godlessness, impiety
Sentence: The site of the tomb was a place of <u>sanctity</u> for the ancient Egyptians.

5. ELUCIDATED (verb) – स्पष्ट

Pronunciation: uh·loo·suhd·ayt·uhd **Meaning:** make (something) clear; explain. **Synonyms:** explain, make clear, clarify



Antonyms: obscured, confused, obfuscated Sentence: Work such as theirs will help to <u>elucidate</u> this matter.

6. ADROIT (adj) – निपुण

Pronunciation: uh droyt **Meaning:** clever or skillful in using the hands or mind. **Synonyms:** skillful, adept, dexterous **Antonyms:** amateur, unprofessional, unskillful **Sentence:** He was <u>adroit</u> at tax avoidance.

7. OBLIVIOUS (adj) – बेख़बर

Pronunciation: uh·bli·vee·uhs **Meaning:** not aware of or not concerned about what is happening around one. **Synonyms:** unaware, unconscious, heedless **Antonyms:** aware, cognizant, conscious **Sentence:** She became absorbed, <u>oblivious</u> to the passage of time.

8. FRIVOLOUS (adj) – तुच्छ

Pronunciation: fri·vuh·luhs
Meaning: not having any serious purpose or value.
Synonyms: flippant, glib, waggish
Antonyms: sober, unfrivolous, serious
Sentence: My mother often spends her monthly pension on <u>frivolous</u> purchases she never uses.

9. OPULENT (adj) - धनी

Pronunciation: aw·pyoo·luhnt
Meaning: ostentatiously rich and luxurious or lavish.
Synonyms: luxurious, sumptuous, palatial
Antonyms: penurious, poor, needy
Sentence: The duke built an <u>opulent</u> palace for himself nearby.

10. PROSAIC (adj) - नीरस

Pronunciation: proh·zay·uhk **Meaning:** having the style or diction of prose; lacking poetic beauty. **Synonyms:** unimaginative, uninspired, dull **Antonyms:** abnormal, exceptional, extraordinary **Sentence:** <u>Prosaic</u> language can't convey the experience.
