### 1. EGREGIOUS (adj.) - भयंकर

**Pronunciation:** uh·gree·juhs

**Meaning:** Outstandingly Bad or shocking

**Synonyms:** Appalling, Horrific, Terrible

**Antonyms:** Marvelous, Excellent

**Sentence:** It was an egregious performance in the GRE exam.

### 2. PLAUSIBLE (Adj.) - मुमकिन

**Pronunciation:** plaw·zuh·bl

**Meaning:** That you can believe

**Synonyms:** Believable, Credible, Probable

**Antonyms:** Absurd, Doubtful, Fantastic

**Sentence:** She could find no plausible explanation for its disappearance.

### 3. EMBELLISH (verb) - संवारना

**Pronunciation:** uhm·beh·luhsh

**Meaning:** Make more attractive by the addition of decorative details

**Synonyms:** Elaborate, Amplify, Enhance

**Antonyms:** Simplify, Bare

**Sentence:** I asked him not to embellish the truth with ideas of his own.

### 4. WAIVER (Noun) - त्याग

**Pronunciation:** vay·vuh

**Meaning:** A situation in which somebody gives up a legal claim or right

**Synonyms:** Disclaimer, Release

**Antonyms:** Allowance, accept, approval

**Sentence:** We had to sign a waiver, giving up any rights to the land in the future.

### 5. SUBSTANTIVE (adj.) - मूल

**Pronunciation:** sub·stan·tive

**Meaning:** Having a firm basis in reality and so important, meaningful

**Synonyms:** Considerable, Biggish, Major, Significant

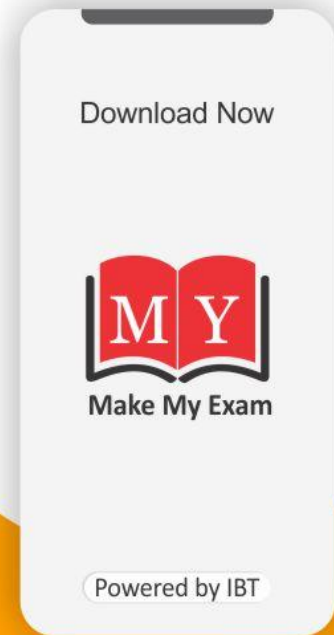
**Antonyms:** Minute, Trivial, Marginal

**Sentence:** Substantive research on the subject needs to be carried out.

**6.TANDEM (Adverb) - मिलकर****Pronunciation:** tan·dem**Meaning:** Alongside each other**Synonyms:** Together**Antonyms:** Individual, Single**Sentence:** The two teams are designed to work in tandem.**7.IMPERATIVE (Adj.) - अनिवार्य****Pronunciation:** im·per·a·tive**Meaning:** Not to be avoided**Synonyms:** Compulsory, Incumbent, Necessary**Antonyms:** Unnecessary, Optional**Sentence:** It is imperative that politician should be good communicators.**8.DETERRENCE (Noun) - अवरोध****Pronunciation:** de·ter·rence**Meaning:** Action of discouraging through fear of the consequence**Synonyms:** Discouragement, Dictation**Antonyms:** Allowance, Permission, Approval**Sentence:** This guideline stresses the deterrence of war.**9.NAIVE (adj.) - अनुभवहीन****Pronunciation:** na·ive**Meaning:** Without enough experience**Synonyms:** Innocent, Primitive, Unwary**Antonyms:** Incredulous, Wary, Critical**Sentence:** Riya is naïve in this field.**10.ASTOUND (Verb) - हक्का बक्का****Pronunciation:** as·tound**Meaning:** To surprise somebody very much**Synonyms:** Amaze, Astonish, Flabbergas**Antonyms:** Expect, Calm, Clarify, Enlighten**Sentence:** He wants to surpass & astound them by transforming the district.

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
