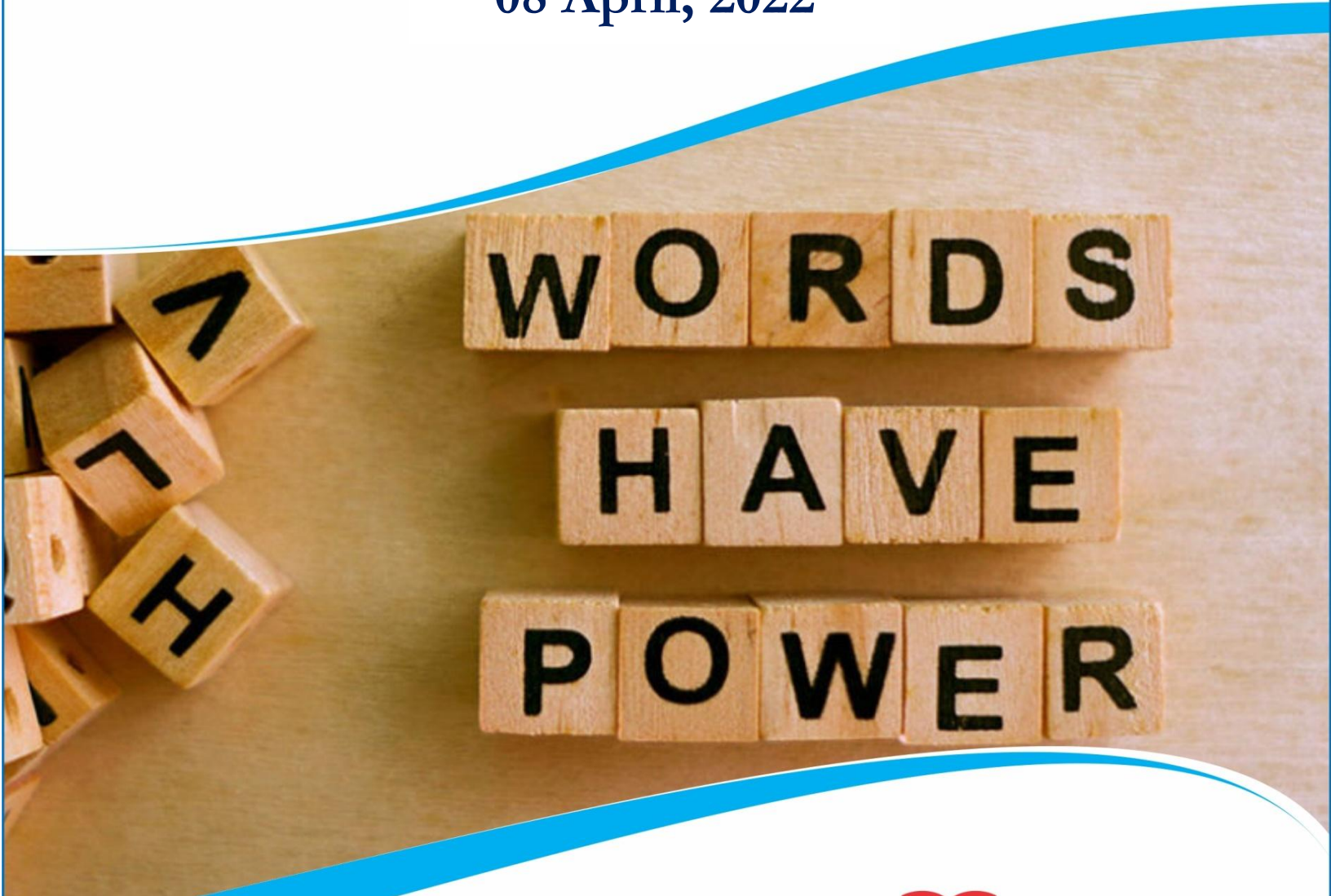


### 1. ADVENT (noun) : आगमन

**Pronunciation:** ad·vnt

**Meaning:** the arrival of a notable person, thing, or event.

**Synonyms:** arrival, appearance, emergence

**Antonyms:** departing, departure, disappearance

**Sentence:** Since the advent of jet aircraft, travel has been speeded up.

### 2. SPOOKED (adj.) : डरावना

**Pronunciation:** spookt

**Meaning:** filled with fear or dread

**Synonyms:** affrighted, afraid, aghast

**Antonyms:** fearless, unafraid, bold

**Sentence:** Something in the bushes spooked her horse.

### 3. TUMBLE (verb) : लुढ़क

**Pronunciation:** tuhm·bl

**Meaning:** (typically of a person) fall suddenly, clumsily, or headlong.

**Synonyms:** fall (over), fall down, topple over

**Antonyms:** get up, rise, stand (up)

**Sentence:** Children tumble over each other in play.

### 4. JEOPARDIZED (verb) : खतरे में डालना

**Pronunciation:** jeop·ar·dize

**Meaning:** put (someone or something) into a situation in which there is a danger of loss, harm, or failure.

**Synonyms:** threaten, endanger, imperil

**Antonyms:** guarded, protected, sheltered

**Sentence:** He jeopardized his life to save the drowning child.

### 5. CULPABILITY (noun) : दोषी

**Pronunciation:** kuhl·puh·bil·uh·tee

**Meaning:** responsibility for a fault or wrong; blame.

**Synonyms:** guilt, blame, fault

**Antonyms:** blamelessness, guiltlessness, innocence

**Sentence:** After the accident, the company refused to accept culpability.

### **6. INCORRIGIBLE (adj.) : असंशोधनीय**

**Pronunciation:** uhn·kaw·ruh·juh·bl

**Meaning:** (of a person or their tendencies) not able to be corrected, improved, or reformed.

**Synonyms:** inveterate, habitual, unreformable

**Antonyms:** curable, reclaimable, recoverable

**Sentence:** John was an incorrigible criminal who spent the rest of his life behind bars.

### **7. DOUSING (verb) : बुझाना**

**Pronunciation:** daws·uhng

**Meaning:** extinguish (fire or light).

**Synonyms:** extinguish, put out, quench

**Antonyms:** fire, ignite, inflame

**Sentence:** The pumps were started and the crew began to douse the fire with water.

### **8. INDIGENT (adj.) : दरिद्र**

**Pronunciation:** in·duh·jnt

**Meaning:** poor; needy.

**Synonyms:** poor, impecunious, destitute

**Antonyms:** prosperous, opulent, rich

**Sentence:** Because he was indigent, the court-appointed a lawyer to represent him.

### **9. ENTREATY (noun) : विनती**

**Pronunciation:** uhn·treet·ee

**Meaning:** an earnest or humble request.

**Synonyms:** appeal, request, petition

**Antonyms:** answer, command

**Sentence:** The king turned a deaf ear to his entreaties.

### **10. CONJECTURAL (adj.) : मान लिया**

**Pronunciation:** kuhn·jek·chuh·ruhl

**Meaning:** based on or involving conjecture.

**Synonyms:** speculative, suppositional, theoretical

**Antonyms:** actual, factual, real

**Sentence:** Much of the racial history of Madagascar remains conjectural.
