

# VOCABULARY

## 1. CONVIVIAL(ADJECTIVE): खुश नुमा

**Pronunciation:** kuhn•vi•vee•uhl

**Meaning:** likely to seek or enjoy the company of others.

**Synonyms:** social, hospitable, companionable

**Antonyms:** antisocial, introverted, reclusive

**Sentence:** The hiking club attracts a wide range of convivial people who share a love of the outdoors.

## 2. NOISOME(ADJECTIVE): हानिकर

**Pronunciation:** noy•sm

**Meaning:** bad for the well-being of the body.

**Synonyms:** toxic, sickly, noxious

**Antonyms:** healthy, healthful

**Sentence:** it's no fun having asthma and living in an area with noisome smog.

## 3. LIMPID(ADJECTIVE): पारदर्शक

**Pronunciation:** lim•puhd

**Meaning:** easily seen through.

**Synonyms:** crystal, transparent, lucid

**Antonyms:** opaque, cloudy, dark

**Sentence:** Her eyes are the blue of a limpid stream of water.

## 4. INUNDATION(NOUN): सैलाब

**Pronunciation:** i•nuhn•day•shn

**Meaning:** a great flow of water or of something that overwhelms.

**Synonyms:** overflow, deluge, torrent

**Antonyms:** drought, dribble, drip

**Sentence:** The family's shed was washed away in the last inundation.

## 5. AVARICE(NOUN): लोभ

**Pronunciation:** a•vuh•ruhs

**Meaning:** extreme greed for wealth or material gain.

**Synonyms:** greed, acquisitiveness, cupidity

**Antonyms:** fulfilment, satisfaction, selflessness

**Sentence:** Avarice blinds our eyes.

## 6. BILK(VERB): ठगना

**Pronunciation:** bilk

**Meaning:** to rob by the use of trickery or threats.

**Synonyms:** cheat, pluck, defraud

**Antonyms:** support , assist , be honest

**Sentence:** An investigation revealed that the garage had been bilking motorists for repairs that had never been made.

## 7. FOUNTAINHEAD(NOUN): मूलस्रोत

**Pronunciation:** fawn•tuh•ned

**Meaning:** the source from which something grows or develops.

**Synonyms:** origin, root, beginning

**Antonyms:** conclusion , completion

**Sentence:** A man's ego is the fountainhead of human progress.

## 8. UNGAINLY(ADJECTIVE): अनाड़ी

**Pronunciation:**uhn•gayn•lee

**Meaning:** having or showing an inability to move in a graceful manner.

**Synonyms:** clumsy, gawky, unsteady

**Antonyms:** graceful, coordinated, nimble

**Sentence:** On land the turtle is ungainly, but in the water, it is very agile.

## 9. DICKER(VERB): मोल-भाव करना

**Pronunciation:** di•kuh

**Meaning:** to talk over or dispute the terms of a purchase

**Synonyms:** negotiate, deal, bargain

**Antonyms:** deal (in), merchandise, sell

**Sentence:** They dickered over the price of the car for a few minutes.
