

VOCABULARY

1. PERTINENT (ADJECTIVE): उचित

Pronunciation: puh•ti•nent

Meaning: relevant, applicable, or appropriate to a particular matter or situation.

Synonyms: related, suitable, fitting, to the point

Antonyms: Irrelevant, inappropriate, unsuitable, unrelated

Sentence: To ensure a prompt reply, please include all *pertinent* details in your email.

2. PARSE (VERB): व्याकरण के नियमों के अनुसार

Pronunciation: paas

Meaning: to analyze or examine, typically by breaking it down into its parts.

Synonyms: Analyze, dissect, examine, scrutinize, study

Antonyms: Combine, integrate, synthesize

Sentence: In order to fully understand the meaning of the sentence, you need to *parse* it.

3. CONSOLIDATION (NOUN): संयुक्ति

Pronunciation: kuhn•saw•luh•day•shn

Meaning: the process of combining a number of things into a single effective or coherent whole.

Synonyms: merger, amalgamation, integration, fusion

Antonyms: division, separation, disintegration, fragmentation

Sentence: The *consolidation* of the various departments into one streamlined unit improved efficiency and communication.

4. ENUMERATION (NOUN): गणना

Pronunciation: uh•nyoo•muh•ray•shn

Meaning: the action of mentioning a number of things one by one.

Synonyms: counting, listing, tabulation

Antonyms: generalization, estimation, Guess

Sentence: The survey involved the *enumeration* of all the species of birds found in the area.

5. CONTENTION (ADJECTIVE): विवाद

Pronunciation: kuhn•ten•shn

Meaning: the disagreement that results from opposing arguments.

Synonyms: argument, dispute

Antonyms: agreement, harmony, peace, concord

Sentence: There's a lot of *contention* about that issue - for every person firmly in favor, there's someone fiercely against it.

6. MITIGATE (VERB): कम करना

Pronunciation: mi•tuh•gayt

Meaning: to make less severe, serious, or painful; to alleviate or reduce.

Synonyms: Reduce, Alleviate, Lessen, Diminish, Ease

Antonyms: Aggravate, Intensify, Exacerbate, Amplify

Sentence: The doctor prescribed painkillers to *mitigate* the patient's discomfort.

7. FICKLE (ADJECTIVE): अस्थिर

Pronunciation: fi•kl

Meaning: changing frequently, especially as regards one's loyalties, interests, or affection.

Synonyms: capricious, changeable, variable

Antonyms: constant, certain, unchanging

Sentence: The weather is so *fickle* at this time of year.

8. CIRCUMVENT (VERB): बचाव करना

Pronunciation: suh•kuhm•vent

Meaning: to avoid something, especially cleverly or by deceiving.

Synonyms: avoid, evade, escape, dodge

Antonyms: confront, face, meet

Sentence: The burglar tried to find a way to *circumvent* the alarm system.

9. CATAPULT (VERB): किसी वस्तु को बहुत तेजी से फेंकना या उछालना

Pronunciation: ka•tuh•puhlt

Meaning: to launch or propel something or someone.

Synonyms: Launch, Fling, Propel

Antonyms: Stop, Hold, Keep

Sentence: The company plans to *catapult* its sales with a new marketing campaign.

10. LAGGARD (ADJECTIVE): सुस्त

Pronunciation: lag•uhd

Meaning: something that is slow or sluggish in movement or progress (slower than desired or expected).

Synonyms: slow, lagging, pokey, sluggish

Antonyms: prompt, active, rapid

Sentence: The company's *laggard* progress in implementing new technology put them at a disadvantage compared to their competitors.
